WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Tilton, in the County of Belknap, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Tilton Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, March 5, 1974 at 10:00 in the forenoon to act on the following subjects:

- 1. To choose one Selectman for a term of three years, one Treasurer for the ensuing year, one Road Agent for the ensuing year, one Trustee of Trust Funds for a term of three years, one member of Park Commission for a term of two years, two Budget Committee members for a term of three years.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as setoffs against budgeted appropriations for the following priority purposes, and in amounts indicated or take any action hereon:

Sidewalk from Peabody to Mt. View Drive \$12,500.00 External Repairs to Hall Memorial Library \$2,000.00 Principal on School Bond Issue \$16,000.00

- 3. To see if the town will vote to employ a Full Time Selectman and appropriate \$7202.00 for Salary. (By Petition)
- 4. To see if the Town will vote a Dog Leash Ordinance that all dogs must be hitched within the "Old Precinct" Part of Town. This area would be Joseph Roberts home on School St., Nicks Garage on Franklin Road, Charles Tilton on Colby Road, and Charles

Crawford residence on East Main St. Also including all the area within these bounds. (By Petition)

5. To see if the Town of Tilton will vote to adopt a dog leash law.

DOG LEASH LAW

Section 1. The purpose of this ordinance is to require that all dogs in Tilton be kept under the control of their owners at all times so that they will not injure persons, damage property, or create a nuisance.

Section 2. The provisions of this ordinance which apply to the owner of a dog shall apply equally to any person, firm, association, or corporation having custody or possession of a dog.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful to permit any dog to run at large in Tilton to this end, the owner or keeper of a dog shall keep the dog on a leash or within an enclosure whenever the dog is not on the property of the owner or keeper.

Section 4. This ordinance shall not apply to hunting dogs while such dogs are under the supervision and control of the owner while hunting.

Section 5. Any dog found running at large shall be restrained or impounded by the dog officer, under the direction of the health officer, or by any law enforcement officer. Any animal so impounded shall be confined in a suitable animal shelter. Impounded dogs not claimed by the owner or custodian within seventy-two (72) hours after notice to the owner or custodian, or stray dogs where the owner or custodian is unknown may be humanely disposed of by the dog officer or by the responsible authorities of the animal shelter. Impounded dogs not wearing a valid rabies vaccination tag shall be impounded for a period of not less than

ten (10) days in accordance with RSA 442-A:8 (Rabies Control Act) before being returned to the owner or custodian or before disposal.

Section 6. Any owner or individual claiming an impounded dog shall pay to the Town of Tilton a fee of two dollars (\$2.00) and shall, in addition, pay to the animal shelter the sum of one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) for each day the dog has been impounded. No dog shall be released until the above fees have been paid by the owner or individual claiming the dog.

Section 7. It shall be the duty of the dog officer, under the direction of the health officer, or any law enforcement officer to issue a complaint against the owner or keeper of a dog which has previously been impounded on two occasions for running at large.

Section 8. Any person violating any of the provisions of this charter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in an amount not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each offense. (By Petition)

6. To see if the Town will vote a proposal for a dog control ordinance for the Town of Tilton:

Section 1. No person shall allow any dog owned or kept by such person to run at large if, while running at large, the dog is a nuisance, causes damage to public or private property, overturns garbage or trash receptacles and scatters the contents, or menaces any person or other animal.

Section 2. All dogs owned or kept within the Town of Tilton must be licensed and immunized against rabies in accordance with New Hampshire State Statutes.

Penalties:

A. Any dog running at large as described in Section 1 of this ordinance may be transported to an ap-

- propriate facility by any Police Officer upon the receipt of a signed complaint against such dog.
- B. If unregistered, the person claiming any dog from the holding facility, must, within 5 days, comply with State Statutes requiring the licensing and immunization of dogs. If claiming a registered dog, the owner or keeper of such dog shall, within 5 days, pay a fine of \$5.00 to the Town of Tilton.
- C. Failure to comply with paragraph (B) of this ordinance will result in the dog being transported to an appropriate facility and to be held until such time that paragraph (B) of this ordinance has been complied with. Dogs not claimed within 10 days may be disposed of by the holding facility. (By Petition)
- 7. To see if the Town of Tilton will appropriate two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) from Federal Revenue Sharing for external repairs to the Hall Memorial Library.
- 8. To see if the Town of Tilton will vote to pave the streets known as Mt. View Drive, (remainder) Meadow Lane, and Stockade Lane, and appropriate money for the same. (By Petition)
- 9. To see if the Citizens of the Town of Tilton will vote to continue the employment of one Full Time Selectman in an administrative position for the ensuing year. (By Petition)
- 10. To see if the Town of Tilton will vote to have the legal residents wishing to have their names on the checklist and who are unable to appear before the supervisors at the stated hours up to 10 days prior to election day, may apply to the town clerk during regular office hours. (By Petition)

- 11. To see if the Town of Tilton will vote for the adoption of absentee voting at annual town meetings. (By Petition)
- 12. To see if the Town of Tilton will vote to adopt the Homeowners Exemption law to replace the Elderly Exemption now in effect.
- 13. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of at public auction any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors Deeds. (By Petition)
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to have the State Tax Commission conduct a yearly audit of the Town Books.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on early paid taxes as follows: Two per cent if the Tax Bill is paid within thirty days from date of bill.
- 16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 17. To see if the Town of Tilton will vote to accept the budget submitted by the Budget Committee, and pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 18. To see what action the Town will take in regards to the reports of its officers and agents.
- 19. To choose any other officers and agents for the ensuing year.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The polls shall be closed not earlier than six o'clock in the evening.

REPORT OF FULL TIME SELECTMAN

In 1973 the new and improved valuation in Tilton was \$905,820.00 added to the tax structure for a total of \$15,601,000.00.

There were eight (8) Systems replaced, thirty-three (33) new ones installed, and at present eighteen (18) state approved systems are ready for construction.

The additional building which was picked up in 1973 for the 1974 valuation included nineteen (19) alterations, one (1) store building, six (6) industrial buildings, one (1) commercial building, four (4) private garages, three (3) summer cottages, twenty-one (21) new all year homes for a total of \$591,575.00 in new valuation for 1974. This amount will put the total over sixteen million dollars (\$16,000,000.00) in 1974 valuation.

Also in 1973 a more complete Census was accomplished after three months of leg work including several trips back to Mobile Homes to update the Mobile Home information which has to be done each year.

In 1973 the Aerial Photo were taken of Tilton to get the Tax Map on the way.

The work load for 1974 is going to be increased considerably due to two years Auditing of Town Books and assistance in preparing Tax Map.

A total of \$3,101.22 was returned to the Town due to the services of a Full Time Selectman not to mention many services not measured in dollars and cents.

REPORT OF THE CHIEF OF POLICE

During 1973, eleven employees of the police department resigned. Each of these employees were uniformed and equipped at a cost of approximately \$400.00 each. No dollar value may be placed on the loss of experienced personnel. Historically, the reasons given for leaving the department have been, "low pay" and "morale problems."

In reviewing past Town Reports, and discussing the state of the police department with various members of the community, it appears that the Town wants a police department that is professional, efficient, and is attuned to the needs of the community. It is my desire to provide that service.

Although I am new to this community, and admittedly ignorant of many of the special needs and desires of the people, I am attempting to correct the conditions that result in the loss of personnel, waste of money, and low quality service from the members of this department. The following actions have been taken to professionalize our personnel, standardize officer's responses, and expand services:

- 1. An appeal for residents to fully utilize the department, demand top quality service, and cooperate with a department that earns their trust.
- 2. A written policy so that the officers understand the goals of the department.
- 3. A revised and expanded set of personnel rules.
- 4. A procedure manual. To insure proper response by officers, and to insure the standardization of department operations.
- 5. A revised and expanded reporting system that insures greater accuracy in reporting, accounts for

- an employee's time, and insures proper disposition of each service performed.
- 6. A revised selection process that eliminates all but the most highly qualified applicants.
- 7. A proposal for an adequate pay scale with builtin controls that forces each employee to earn his wages rather than receive them automatically.

Most of the above actions have been completed. Those that have not been completed are well under way. Every resident is invited to inspect our operations and offer comments and/or criticisms.

The following tables are offered to help explain the activities and the operational costs of the department. Since space prohibits a more detailed explanation, please contact me with your questions.

REPORT OF LIAISON OFFICER TO THE TOWN OF TILTON, N. H.

Pursuant to the recommendations and findings of the 1971 Law Enforcement Committee and in accordance with the favorable vote accorded it at the Town Meeting of March 13, 1971, the following is respectfully submitted:

It is necessary to preface this report, however, with the observation that the role of the Police Commissioners is restricted to those administrative problems arising within the department and to which the Commissioners' attention is directed. It is fundamental that the executive and operational responsibilities be left directly in the hands of the executive officer, in this case, the Chief of Police. With this in mind let us proceed to the report itself.

The year 1973 could well go down in the annals of the town history as the year of the "Beginning". For several years now we have observed a dawn of professionalism in law enforcement. It first became evident in larger departments caused, in part, by the increasing burden of technicality imposed by a sharper awareness of the law and citizens' rights by the judiciary. By progression this condition sifted down into the smaller departments. At the present time all municipalities are caught up in this trend due to the passage of certain stringent requirements imposed on the towns and cities when employing new police personnel. These requirements have added considerably to the expense of operation of a police force and in some cases have created a serious funding problem which we must face squarely in the near future.

It is the undersigned's firm belief that the position of Liaison Officer is to acquaint himself as totally as possible with the necessities as well as the problems of the department he serves. Following the measure of conduct set down for the Commission the internal problems were left to the executive officer except in cases where a direct request for aid was made. Only then did the Commission or Liaison Officer intervene.

As a result of numerous difficulties of both a morale and financial nature it became necessary for the Commission to seek a new Police Chief due to the resignation of Chief Robert Blake. In October, having followed all requirements set out in the Committee report, Roger Willard was chosen from among several highly qualified candidates and was appointed to the position. To this point in time he has performed brilliantly. His quick grasp of the town law enforcement problems is a clear indicator of his knowledgeable use of his experience. His future success however, depends in great part on the cooperation he receives from our citizens. It is an obvious fact that the law enforcement segment must undertake a serious and expanded program of citizen education into the needs and responsibilities of the Police Department. There must exist between the two a cordial and cooperative attitude. This education must consist, in part, in personal contact with citizens' groups, social and service organizations to better acquaint them with the workings of the Department. Close association will breed confidence and pride in our officers by the law abiding segment of the community and a healthy respect for them by those who might have a thought for breaking the law.

In summation it would be remiss of me if it were not mentioned that the cooperation between the Police Commission and Police Department is at the highest level that it has ever been. As it was said in the "Beginning", it is a beginning — one that bodes well for the welfare and safety of the town and its people through

the adequate and professional protection afforded it by its Police Department.

In June, with high water, inspections were made periodically to keep check on trouble areas. No serious washouts or flooding were noted during this time.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

The New Hampshire Forest Fire Service is represented in every town, city or unorganized place in our state by the Forest Fire Warden. Anyone wishing to kindle an outside fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the Fire Warden. Except for cooking fires, no fire can be kindled between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is a commercial or industrial burn or it is raining. The Fire Warden is assisted in his work by the District Forest Fire Chief who works for the Department of Resources and Economic Development Forest Fire Service.

Fire prevention was, again this year, the most important part of the Forest Fire Warden's Job. Fire statistics show the need with 72% of the fires caused by smoking, debris burning and children. Smokey the Bear is an important prevention tool but he still needs much help from the public. Parents should warn their children of the hazards of playing with matches. Children tend to forget that a lighted match held in their hand is a potential forest fire.

1973 Annual Report

The end of '73 completes 18 years of organized activities provided by the citizens of Tilton and Northfield. The accomplishments this year include:

A. Center Activities: During Christmas week 1971 a fire at the Tilton Town Hall curtailed our Center activities. In 1973 we were unable to locate facilities to provide an indoor recreational program. During the summer and fall with the help of local citizens who volunteered their services, members of the Teen Council, and the youngsters who worked on the summer program we were able to renovate the facilities at the Tilton Town Hall. Open House was held on Saturday, December 22, 1973. The Center was reopened officially on Wednesday, December 26, 1973. The Center is now open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday evenings from 6:00-9:00 P.M. and Saturday afternoon from 1:00-4:00 P.M. Ping-pong, pool, tumbling, weight lifting, bumper pool, chess, checkers, and assorted games are available.

The Teen Council is also sponsoring movies, dances, and special Holiday programs on some Saturdays.

- B. Swimming Program: Two 4 week periods were provided during the summer months. Three 2 hour sessions were held daily Monday-Friday and included courses from beginners to junior lifesaving. Five local youngsters were employed in this program. The program was concluded with a picnic, contests were held and prizes were awarded.
- C. Playground: For 8 weeks under the direction of the Recreation Council and Playground Co-ordinator Steve Newton and the Arts and Crafts Director Mrs. Pat La-

Liberte with the help of ten local teenagers various arts and crafts, indoor and outdoor games were provided for 3 hours in the morning daily Monday-Friday. Weekly bus trips or special events were usually held on Fridays.

- D. Ski Program: The Council is sponsoring two 5 week ski programs at the Highlands Ski Area on Saturday mornings with a bus leaving at 8:30 A.M. and returning by 11:00 A.M. from the elementary school area. Approximately forty youngsters are participating in this program. Plans are being made to co-ordinate a Teenage program to be held on Wednesday evening. The Council co-ordinates the Ski Program thereby obtaining a low cost group rate which the participants pay for themselves.
- E. Babe Ruth Baseball: The Council sponsored a ball team playing in the Twin Rivers League. The boys had an opportunity to play against good competition; some also had the opportunity to play on the All Star Team. Tilton's record for 1973 14 wins 0 losses. Our congratulations to this fine Team and their Coaches.

F. Special Events:

1. Halloween party, initiated by the Tilton and North-field Police Departments, the Selectmen, Teen Council, Recreation Council, and the Tilton-Northfield Fire Department and co-ordinated by Paul Paquette was an overwhelming success. All took part on this night of spooks and goblins. A costume contest, a parade with sirens and lights, and a walk through the fun house brought an estimated 450 children to the Winnisquam Regional High School. Prizes were awarded. Beverages, apples, cookies, and candies were distributed to all.

Later in the evening a live band at the High School played to a group of 350 teenagers, who also had free beverages and foodstuffs. Many thanks to the many

merchants, companies, individuals, and organizations who donated funds or products to this happy occasion.

- 2. Teen Council Bike-A-Thon. In May the Teen Council held a 20 mile Bike-A-Thon. The returned pledges amounted to \$1,000.00 which the Teen Council donated to the Tilton-Northfield Recreation Council Building Fund.
- 3. Christmas Party. The Teen Council played host to a group of youngsters at the Tilton Town Hall. A movie was shown and refreshments were served.

"Thank you" to those individuals and groups who have helped the Council provide activities throughout the year. Special thanks to the taxpayers of our communities whose support continues to make recreational programs available.

All interested citizens are welcome to attend our regular monthly meeting, the first Thursday of every month. We meet at 7:30 P.M. at the Recreation Center at the Tilton Town Hall. We do need volunteers.

This year's total circulation was 18,265 — a fifty per cent increase over last year and a three hundred per cent increase over five years.

Additions to the list of magazines and newspapers carried in the library and the establishment of a vertical file resulted in a circulation of 373 periodicals and pamphlets, and an expanded record library circulated 1,802 recordings for 1973. Circulations of 2,710 adult fiction, 2,544 adult nonfiction, 5,570 juvenile fiction, 3,393 juvenile nonfiction as well as the 888 Bookmobile books and books requested from the State library which circulated 1,327 completed our statistics for the year.

336 new books were accessioned, with particular emphasis being given to the reference collection, and increased interest in the library resulted in 113 gifts, either directly or as memorials. We are very thankful for the generosity of our patrons.

A program designed to reach each child in the Union School and acquaint him with basic library skills was begun, both in the classrooms and at the library.

The Hall Memorial Friends of the Library held several successful fund raising events in support of various library improvement projects. The library was also pleased to serve as a meeting place for various community groups and committees.


