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To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs. You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next, at two o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following subjects. 3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion, Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange, Rotary Club,

Chamber of Commerce and all church organizations for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise, until rescinded.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$7,500 for the purchase of a tractor loader for use on highways, this amount to be amortized over a period of three years.

7. To see if the Town will adopt a Non-Partisan Ballot System, as defined under Revised Statutes, Annotated 59:73, for the election of town officers, the same to take effect at the March Town Meeting, 1964.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey to the Morrison Hospital Association, for the sum of one dollar (\$1), all assets and properties, both real and personal, which the Town now owns by way of gift, acquisition, or conveyance from George H. Morrison, Mae Morrison or the Morrison Hospital and Training School Association, said Town to be relieved of all liabilities, past, present and future, in connection with the operation of the so-called Morrison Hospital. (By Petition)

9. In the event that Article 8 is acted upon in the affirmative, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for the maintenance and operation of the Morrison Hospital Association. (By Petition)

10. In the event that Article 8 is acted upon in the negative, to see if the Town will vote to raise and ap-



appropriate the sum of thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) for the maintenance and operation of the Morrison Hospital. (By Petition)

11. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the short branch road from Route 116 to the Hanks Road, so-called, in East Whitefield.

12. To see if the Town will vote to convey to the Whitefield School District that land usually referred to as the high school ball field, located on Highland Street. (By Petition)

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell and convey to Mrs. Leone C. Merrill a small triangular parcel of land, 75'x25'x75', at the south side of the entrance to Park Street Cemetery.

14. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Whitefield for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1962, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

**Scope of Audit**

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer, Municipal Court, Trustees of Trust Funds and Cemetery Association.

**Financial Statements**

**Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1961 -  
December 31, 1962: (Exhibit A-1)**

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1961 and December 31, 1962, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Surplus increased by \$2,476.-66 from \$14,982.97 to \$17,459.63, in 1962. Inasmuch as there were no outstanding long term notes or bonds



and consequently all of the liabilities were current accounts, the Balance Sheet Surplus of \$17,459.63 also represented the Current Surplus of the Town.

**Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)**

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

**Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)**

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1962, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$6,393.62, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$2,680.84, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$3,712.78.

**Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)**

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1962, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as December 31, 1962, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

**Audit Procedure**

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

**Conclusion:**

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Whitefield for their assistance during the course of the audit.

## *ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT*

*1962*

A period of crucial economic and medical transition best tells the story of operation of Morrison Hospital during 1962, a direct result of which will formulate planning in the years ahead. First, as a comparatively new employee of the hospital, I want to thank all involved for their assistance and cooperation without which no existing improvements could have been accomplished nor projected changes contemplated.

Herein are listed major changes in 1962 and proposed improvements and alterations for 1963 and later:

1. Improved business procedures and techniques effected under the Uniform Accounting System as offered all district hospitals by the N.H.-Vt. Hospitalization Service (Blue Cross), including a change in operation from calendar to fiscal year basis, i.e. October 1 to September 30.

2. Institution of rate increases for all accommodations and for use of operating and delivery rooms which were justifiably based on a cost analysis provided by Blue Cross under the Uniform Accounting System. It is anticipated rates will have to be increased again in 1963 to help meet the rising costs of hospital patient care. As a direct result of the cost study, the hospital received an increase to 100% in ancillary payments for all Blue Cross and Medicare patients, and an increase from \$8.00 to \$13.00 per day and from \$24.15 to \$47.62 lump sum ancillary payment for all State Welfare admissions.

3. Stimulated and accelerated billing and collection systems resulting directly in a reduction of accounts payable to \$8,694.31 and of accounts receivable

to \$33,378.30 as of December 31. Cash on hand at that date was \$1, 761.73.

4. Increased volume and quality of radiology service effected by the inclusion to the regular medical staff of Dr. William Robinson of St. Johnsbury, Vt. Under his direct supervision x-ray technicians are developing new mechanical and technical skills.

5. Improved affiliation between medical, surgical services and the clinical laboratory through the efforts of Dr. Robert Christie of Lancaster, pathologist. This includes additional training of our laboratory technician and the purchase of several important items of equipment such as a frozen-section microtome.

6. Stepped-up medical staff administration through the resumption of regular monthly meetings.

7. Several key personnel changes, including the hiring of a fully-trained, post-graduate operating room supervisor.

8. Through the diligent efforts of the women's auxiliary of the hospital, the installation of a Hobart dishwashing machine more than capable of handling hospital needs during periods of peak load.

9. Election of a new chairman of the Board of Trustees, Mr. Wendell Hutchins, who has proved a valuable liaison officer between the governing body and medical and administrative staffs.

Regarding improvement of operations in the future, we hope to:

1. Open a 20-bed geriatric department on the third floor of the building which will provide a service which otherwise does not exist in the area and will create a substantial source of income for the hospital. Advantages to be realized on the community, area and state level from this consolidation of service are many.

2. Construct in an area not presently used on the first floor of the building a new, modern, four-bed maternity unit meeting the minimum standards set forth by the State Department of Health. Plans for this construction have been approved.

3. Provide office space on the first floor of the hospital building for physicians in community residence.

4. Plan for the construction of an outside enclosed stairway on the West end of the building which will eliminate the existing facility which fails to meet the minimum state fire protection and insurance requirements.

5. Plan for the construction of a dumbwaiter or elevator system whereby food and supplies can be moved to and from the kitchen without infringing on the surgical corridor.

Based on qualified information gained by thorough study and research at the community, state and national level, it is and will continue to be my firm opinion that upgrading hospitalization service in Whitefield cannot be accomplished if the facility is to continue to be municipally controlled and directed. The community cannot afford to finance it by means of direct tax appropriation, and likewise the margins of procedure in procuring outside financial assistance are severely restricted. To keep pace with the times, the facility must improve itself as outlined. Consequently, I ask the voters to consider carefully then elect to return Morrison Hospital to the status of a private, non-profit establishment.

In June, 142 children from 6 weeks to 6 years of age received immunization to Type I Sabin Vaccine, in July 121 received Type III, and in August, 118 received Type II. I would like at this time to thank those individuals who contributed in any way to make this program a success.

In May, 19 children were examined at the Preschool Clinic, and during the year 2 children have been seen at the Orthopedic Clinics in Berlin.

Since September, three Sabin Vaccine Clinics have been held in the community for individuals of all ages. Despite much volunteer time given to this program by various individuals, the response was very poor. It is hoped that those people who did not avail themselves of this service, will do so before the next polio season.

It is always a pleasure to work with the citizens of Whitefield, and I would like to thank them for their cooperation.

### *An Appeal from Your Forest Fire Warden*

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook—yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness—our carelessness. This, we—you—and I can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-of-doors burning or forbid you to burn on days of high fire danger or set up regulations—hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you—

1. Follow the warden's directions.
2. Secure the required burning permit.
3. Keep your fires under control.
4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

Everyone will benefit by it.
