THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall (Intervale School) in said Bartlett on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the voters will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$50,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name of the town and on the credit of same, negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current year from taxes collected within current municipal year.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the same time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds or by any other means.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5.00.00 as the Town's share toward the operating cost of the Eastern Slope Regional Airport for 1964.
 - 7. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
- 8. To vote on the question "Shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this town?"
- $9.\ \,$ To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

1963 has seen many improvements in the Bartlett Free Public Library. At the last town meeting a special appropriation of \$2,500 was voted to improve the library by enlarging it and buying much-needed new equipment. The size of the library has been doubled, fluorescent lighting installed, floor tiled, a work area and storage cupboard built and the following pieces of new equipment bought: two reading tables, 16 plastic bottomed chairs, one clerical chair, a vertical file, dictionary stand and a cork bulletin board, leaving a balance of \$89.00. This is not enough to purchase a 12-drawer card catalog that we need but we hope to raise additional funds through food sales and purchase it this year.

Although the library was in a state of upheaval for several weeks during the period of renovation, we were able to stay open and were busier than any summer previously. Vacationers in the area are beginning to patronize our library. Our book circulation for 1963 was 6,707, an increase of 11% over last year and an all-time high.

Because of the increased demands, we have found it necessary to increase the hours the library is open. Therefore at the last trustees meeting it was decided to have the library open Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoon, 1:30 to 4:30, and Monday evenings, 7:30 to 9:00. The increase in the hours means that the library will be open to the public 10½ hours a week, almost reaching the 12 hours recommended by the New Hampshire Library survey as the minimum hours a library in a town of our size should be open weekly. The library also functions as a school library and is used under teacher supervision for reference work.

The librarian has attended a work shop on reference books in Concord, the New England Library Association meeting at Wentworth, a conference on public and school library cooperation at Littleton, and five cooperative book-buying meetings held at Tuftonboro, Ossipee (two), Bartlett and Chocorua.

We have made two increases in our budget this year. First, the book budget has been increased to keep up with the increased demands. We still are below standard in the fields of social science, literature and reference materials. We need to replace our 1927 edititon of the unabridged dictionary with an up-to-date edition, and we need to subscribe to more magazines. The librarian's salary has been increased to allow for the additional hours open. These additional hours will improve the library's services to the public as well as provide more time to catalog and process books. However, a library that serves the public for ten and one-half hours a week and is available to the school at all times that it is open, is quite a bargain for \$1790.

If you haven't visited your library recently — drop in and see the many improvements.

Library book circulation for the past six years has risen from a little over two thousand to almost seven thousand.

In 1959, the library moved from the church basement to the school.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinquishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience — a habit. Just plain carelessness with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

- Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.
- Carry your rubbish to the public dump it's safer. A neglected backyard incinerator causes many fires.
- 3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year-round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.
- Children-caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Let's all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

Superintendent's Report

REORGANIZATION OF SUPERVISORY UNION 9.

The Interim Commission on Education recommended several important changes to the New Hampshire Legislature that could improve New Hampshire's educational system. Among these were: (1) reorganization of school districts into larger administrative units; (2) the establishment of AREA high school districts; (3) reorganization of our state institutions of higher learning, Keene, Plymouth and the University of N. H. under the administration of one enlarged board of trustees; (4) a broad base tax program that would relieve, somewhat, the disproportionate tax load borne by the local districts.

The Interim Commission devoted most of its time and study to the reorganization of school districts, since no major change in the structure of supervisory unions had occurred since 1919. They recommended that the state's 48 school supervisory unions be reduced in number to 34. That each union should be a natural social and economic region with an adequate taxable valuation and an enrollment large enough to permit the efficient use of school facilities and to provide essential educational services that are either limited or non-existent in the smaller school unions.

The New Hampshire State Board of Education created a Master Plan for the state as a whole and on December 4, 1963, it ruled that School Supervisory Union 9 would be reorganized to include the school districts of Freedom, Madison, and Tamworth. The new Supervisory Union 9 now includes the following school districts: Albany, Bartlett, Chatham, Conway, Eaton, Freedom, Jackson, Madison and Tamworth. The Board assigned an assistant superintendent of schools to our school union, allocating the sum of \$2500. from state funds for this particular position.

The assistant superintendent of schools will have specific training and experience in the supervision of the elementary school programs. He or she will give advice, counsel and assistance to teachers, pupils, and parents as a means of improving the educational growth and development of children, solving pupil problems of retardation and maladjustment, adopting the program of studies to meet the needs of the children, bringing resources outside the school to classroom teachers, pupils and parents. In general, to evaluate the instructional programs in terms of established objectives and approved standards. To improve communications between teachers and between schools relative to what is to be taught and how learning is

best brought about.

Mrs. Mildred Fulton, after serving eighteen years as secretary to the Superintendent of Schools, will retire on June 30th. No school employee has been more faithful, more dedicated, or worked longer and harder for the best interest of the school system than has Mildred Fulton. She has been more than a secretary-bookkeeper. She has really been an administrative assistant with a profound knowledge of school affairs and school policy, never too busy to help parents, teachers, pupils and board members in finding answers to questions, or solutions to problems concerning our schools. Perhaps her value to our school system can best be under-

stood when we know that two people will be employed to replace her. In her retirement years we wish her an abundance of good health and well being. It has been said that no one is indispensable or irreplaceable, but if any one person came close to it, Mildred Fulton would have to be that person.

MODERN MATH

Most teachers in Bartlett have taken an in-service course in "Fundamental Concepts of Modern Math", and we have introduced courses in Modern Math in grades one, two, and three. We anticipate expanding this program to include grades four, five, and six next year.

SCHOOL BUDGET

Once again Bartlett is faced with a substantial increase in the School Budget. Of the \$10,000. increase, there are only three items that cause this; teachers' salaries - slight increase of \$1,700., transportation - increased by \$1,660., and high school tuition charges increased by \$6,255.00. All other Budget items remained fairly constant.

Although the tuition has increased markedly it is only partially caused by increased tuition charges but by increased high school enrollment from seventy students to eighty-one students.

I want to express my appreciation to the Bartlett School Board for their dedication to the task of improving the quality of education in Bartlett, and for their helpfulness in the administration of school affairs; and to the entire staff for their continued good work during this year.

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

The annual health service offered the children of the Bartlett School consists of vision and hearing tests, physical and dental examinations for grades I, 4, and 7 at Memorial Hospital. For those participating in sports examinations are done at the school.

Physical inspections done at school by the nurse include checking of teeth, height and weight, posture, nutrition, health habits, hair, skin, and First Aid. Eyes corrected by State Program for those who need help. Orthopedic defects corrected or helped by the State Orthopedic Clinic held at Memorial Hospital every May and November. Patch testing in grades I, 4, and 7, followed up by the chest x-ray for those who need it. This is done by the Tuberculosis Association.

I am hoping that the State Clinics for all children will be resumed in the near future. Whether they are or not, the immunization shots for the children should be kept up.

I wish to thank the members of the School Board, the Superintendent of Schools, the Principal, Teachers and Custodian for their cooperation and assistance in the maintenance of a healthy school environment.

It is our purpose to promote the best possible health in the minds and bodies of all our children. To that end, parents should check on all apparent conditions of the children before they leave for school. Cooperation from parents along this line will be of great assistance in providing full benefits from the education facilities available to the children.
