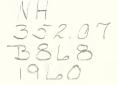

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookfield, in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall, in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to hire a sum of money to pay Town Charges in anticipation of Taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid on Class V Highways and appropriate \$275.56 as the Town's share.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$100.00 for the Sanbornville Fire Precinct.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for the use of the Sanbornville Town Dump.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for the Gafney Library in Sanbornville.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$165.00 for Huggins Hospital in Wolfeboro.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$50.00 for the Planning Board.

10. By petition, To see if the Town will vote to have a Street Light installed at Griffin Corner and raise the sum of \$50.44 to pay for the electric current usage at this point and at the Whittaker Corner.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$8,570.00 and take the sum of \$3,000.00 from the Capital Reserve Fund to buy a new truck and snow plow.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$55.81 for the Lakes Region Association.

13. To see if the Town will vote to extend voting hours until 6:30 so that all voters will have a chance to vote.

14. To see if the Town will vote to hold all future Town Meetings at night so that all voters may have a chance to vote.

15. To see if the Town will vote to abolish the Planning Board.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$25.00 to cut the grass at the Town Hall and School House.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said Town Meeting.

The annual school census returns indicate that there should be the same number of elementary pupils and high school pupils in 1961-62 as are presently enrolled.

The average cost per elementary pupil in 1959-60 was \$518.53 and \$494.84 per high school pupil. Average costs in the state, as reported by the State Department of Education were: Elementary \$272.23, and high school \$461.06. The cost per elementary pupil in Brookfield is high compared to the state average, yet it is only \$2.00 per pupil more than the cost the last year the Churchill School was in operation.

Tuition rates announced for 1961-62 are: Wolfeboro elementary \$265.00, and Brewster Academy \$360.00. The other schools have not announced their tuition rates as of this date. The State Department of Education has announced maximum tuition liability for 1961-62 as \$265.00 for elementary pupils, and \$436.00 for high school pupils.

It has been my privilege to serve as your superintendent of schools during the past fifteen years. My association with members of the school board, citizens and pupils has been very pleasant, and the cooperation of all concerned is most earnestly appreciated.
