

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chesterfield in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chesterfield on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To vote by Australian Ballot for all necessary Town Officers.

Article 2. To determine the method of collecting taxes for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act Thereon.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums of money for:

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,300.00 for street lighting.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$232.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire, for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspapers and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

Article 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$495.00 as its fair share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital. (\$200.00 approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,144.58 for Town Road Aid, thereby receiving an additional \$7,630.53 from the State.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$9,000.00 for Winter Maintenance of Roads.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for the repair and upkeep of Highway Equipment. (\$2,500.00 approved by Budget Committee.)

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,000.00 for Summer Road Maintenance.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for permanent road improvements.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,500.00 to make up for the deficiency caused by the over-draft of 1959 appropriations.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 to replace the present wooden bridge over the Gulf Brook, at the lower end of the Gulf Road, with a sectional plate pipe arch.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$6,000.00 to buy a new dump truck, \$1,000.00 of the cost to be raised by 1960 taxes, and the balance to be paid in 5 yearly payments, on long term notes.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$600.00 to purchase a new truck snow plow.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for drainage and black top surface on Welcome Hill Road, beginning at it's intersection with Route 9 and continuing up the hill as far as the appropriation will permit. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum, not to exceed \$2,500.00 to improve and surface with tar, the West Swanzey Road and the bend of the Tuttle Road, beginning at State Highway No. 9 and ending 500 feet from the West Swanzey Road on the Tuttle Road. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to tar the Street from Route 9, opposite the store of John N. Ball, to High Street, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the same. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to open the Road leading from West Chesterfield to Cobleigh corner and construct a bridge and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00 (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$15,268.31 from the Etta L. Hubbard Trust, said Trust to be

deposited with the Trustees of Trust Funds, the income to be paid yearly on May 1st to the Town for the care and upkeep of Town cemeteries.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.00 from Edna S. Redding and Pauline T. Ladd, the income from the same for perpetual care and upkeep of the John Redding and George Thomas burial lot in Spofford cemetery. The said Fund to be known as the Redding and Thomas Trust Fund.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from Edith L. St. Lawrence and Ernest Butler, to be known as the Oliver Butler Trust Fund, the income from same to be paid to the C. W. C. A., for the care and upkeep of Lot in Chesterfield West Cemetery.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from Charlotte S. Higgins, this sum to be applied as an additional fund, to the Trust Fund for the Spaulding Higgins Lot at the Spofford cemetery.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from Murray and Gaius Hall, to be known as the Murray and Gaius Hall Trust Fund, the income from same to be used in the care of the Curtis Beal Lot in Spofford cemetery.

Article 27. To hear reports of Standing Committees and act thereon.

Article 28. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

TOWN MEETING, 1959

Proceedings of the Annual Meeting of the voters of the Town of Chesterfield, New Hampshire, called at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, March 10, 1959.

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, James E. O'Neil at nine o'clock in the forenoon and the Warrant through Article 1 was read by him. He then declared the polls open for balloting for all necessary Town Officers.

Norman L. Amidon and Mildred Gauthier were appointed by the Selectmen as Assistant Moderator and Assistant Clerk respectively and both took their oaths of office before the Clerk.

At ten o'clock the Moderator called the meeting to order and the rest of the Warrant was read by the Clerk. The Articles of the Warrant were then disposed of as follows:—

Article 2. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Robert E. Woodman and supported by Joseph James that the method of collecting taxes for the ensuing year be the same as for last year. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 3. Voted by voice vote on motion made by F. Stratton Morse and supported by H. Claude Mowry to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 4. Arvid W. Pearson reporting for the Budget Committee stated that they held three meetings. The public meeting was held Feb. 4 but few showed up for it. It was recommended that the Budget Committee should send out cards to the voters notifying them of the public meeting. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by John McKeon that this report and also the Budget be adopt-

ed. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 5. Motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Fred Korradi that the Town raise and appropriate the following sums of money for the following purposes as approved by the Budget Committee:

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Lester Chickering and supported by Arvid Pearson to amend the motion and earmark \$200.00 under Civil Defense for the Two-way Radio. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Voted by voice vote on the first motion as amended. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 6. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Wil-

liam Mitchell and supported by Dexter Thomas to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 for street lighting. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 7. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Freda Ernst and supported by Harry E. Wimm to raise and appropriate the sum of \$228.00 (1/100 of 1% of the valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire, for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspapers and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 8. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Agnes Chickering and supported by Joseph James to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 as approved by the Budget Committee toward the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 9. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Fred Korradi and supported by H. Claude Mowry to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,152.42 for Town Road Aid, thereby receiving an additional \$7,682.82 from the State. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 10. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Welcome and supported by Charles Alden to raise the sum of \$9,000.00 as approved by the Budget Committee for Winter Maintenance of Roads. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 11. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by William Mitchell to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 as approved by the Budget Committee for the repair and upkeep of Highway Equipment. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 12. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Robert Woodman and supported by Paul Welcome to raise and

appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 as approved by the Budget Committee for Summer Road Maintenance. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 13. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Charles Alden to appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for permanent road improvements. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 14. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Donald Emery and supported by William Mitchell to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 to equip the Town Garage with some necessary tools. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 15. To see if the Town will raise a sum of money not to exceed \$6,000.00 to buy a 4-wheel drive tractor equipped with a cutter bar, a terrace blade, and a snow scraper and loader. Motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Dexter Thomas to pass over the Article. George Joslin called for a paper ballot on the motion. This resulted as follows; Whole number of votes cast 112. Necessary for choice 57. Yes had 68. No had 44. The Moderator declared the vote carried in the affirmative and the Article Passed over.

Article 16. To see if the Town will raise a sum of money not to exceed \$6,000.00 to purchase a truck. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry E. Winn and supported by Waldemar Sherwin to pass over the Article. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to open the road leading from West Chesterfield to Cobleigh corner, and construct a bridge and appropriate the sum of \$10,000.00. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Russell Johnson to pass over the Article. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 18. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Agnes Chickering and supported by Marjorie Stoddard to pass over the article. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative.

Motion made by Robert Woodman and supported by Russell Johnson to allocate the Town Road Aid money for the improvement of and/or reconstruction of the so-called Old Spofford road, beginning at the Jackson Hill road and continuing toward the Swiss Motor Court. Dexter Thomas asked for a vote on this motion by paper ballot. This resulted as follows; Number of Ballots cast 84. Necessary for choice 43. Yes had 45. No had 39. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 19. A motion was made by Donald Emery and supported by Joseph James to authorize the Selectmen to hold the Town Meeting on Town affairs at 7:30 in the evening instead of at 9:00 o'clock in the morning. The vote at the Town Meeting to be by Australian Ballot, so that the 2/3 of the people (or majority) who are now unable to vote will be able to do so. Motion made by Malcolm Sullivan and supported by Robert Woodman to amend the motion and strike out the last sentence, and vote by paper ballot today and the meeting to start at 6:30 instead of 7:30. Donald Emery withdrew his motion and Joseph James withdrew his support of same. The paper ballot was withdrawn by Malcolm Sullivan and Robert Woodman. Voted by voice vote on the amendment. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. A vote on the Article as amended resulted as follows: Yes had 35. No had 45. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative.

Article 20. Motion made by Robert Woodman and supported by William Mitchell to increase the Budget Committee to nine members. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Robert Woodman and supported by George Barrett for the Moderator and Selectmen to appoint three extra members so they can serve on the Committee in 1959 and 1960 and to have three members from each part of town on the Committee. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Voted by voice vote on Article as Amended. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 21. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Charles Alden and supported by William E. Walston to ap-

ply Town Road Aid to completing or continuing improvements to the Westmoreland-Spofford road. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative.

Article 22. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Welcome and supported by Marjorie Stoddard to accept a parcel of land known as Sheila Avenue in the Welcome Vista Development for the purpose of maintaining said road for public use, said road layout being 40' (forty feet) wide and 750' (seven hundred fifty feet) long. Reference may be made to a survey made by Harry Bennett and put on plan numbered 0510 and recorded at the Cheshire Registry of Deed, Vol. 654, Page 331. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 23. Voted by voice vote on motion made by William Mitchell and supported by Alfred Gattey to place the sum of \$628.18, which is the net receipts for grader rental this year, in a Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of Highway Equipment. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 24. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Joslin and supported by Agnes Chickering to accept the sum of \$200.00 from James A. Ashe; this amount to be added to the Ransom C. Farr Trust Fund, the income from same to be paid to the C. W. C. A. for the perpetual care and upkeep of the Ransom C. Farr burial lot in the Chesterfield West Cemetery. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 25. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Joslin and supported by Jessie M. B. Joslin to accept the sum of \$200.00 from Paul Schlichting, Otto S. Schlichting, Daniel Schlichting, Otto W. Schlichting, John Orr, Jessie Rudolph and Eleanor Pearson, to be known as the Schlichting Trust Fund for the care of the Schlichting Family lot in Spofford Cemetery. Voted declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 26. In reporting on the possibility of the purchasing by the Town of Ware's Grove and making it into a Town

Beach, the Selectmen read a letter from Francis Cheever in which he gave the purchase price as \$65,000.00. The Selectmen also reported that they had not as yet found a suitable gravel bank to purchase.

Article 27. Voted by voice vote on motion made by William Mitchell and supported by Harry Winn that the Selectmen be instructed to draw up definite regulations to be followed before any new roads are accepted to be voted on for acceptance by the town. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Malcolm Sullivan and supported by Agnes Chickering that the Selectmen be authorized to include Article 19 as amended on the ballot next year and change time to 6:30. This would be "To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hold the Town Meeting on town affairs at 6:30 in the evening instead of at 9:00 o'clock in the morning." Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Malcolm Sullivan that an inventory of all tools be made and maintained by the Road Agent and a copy be kept on file with the Selectmen, the list to be printed in the Town Report. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Motion made by Anna Hubner which was not supported that the Town equipment should not be rented out. George Joslin asked how the voters feel about renting out equipment. H. Claude Mowry suggested that it should be left in the hands of the Selectmen. Paul Welcome said that the voters should back the Selectmen up on renting the equipment. On a show of hands the Moderator declared the voters in favor of leaving the renting of equipment up to the Selectmen.

Dorothy Thomas asked why the Town Reports were not out sooner.

George Joslin asked for a rising vote of thanks to the Moderator for the fine way he conducted the meeting. This was done.

The Moderator declared the meeting recessed at 3:45 p.m.

At six o'clock the Moderator declared the polls closed and a count of ballots cast resulted as follows:

For Town Clerk. Imogene L. Chickering had 207 votes, Inez Laskowski had 2 votes, Betty Plifka had 1 vote. Imogene L. Chickering was declared elected.

For Selectman. Winston H. Cray had 197 votes, Robert Woodman had 2 votes, Joseph James had 2 votes and George Milford, James E. O'Neil and George Barrett each had 1 vote. Winston H. Cray was declared elected.

For Town Treasurer. Dorothy C. Spaulding had 207 votes, and Jane Allen and Beatrice Chickering each had 1 vote. Dorothy C. Spaulding was declared elected.

For Tax Collector. Monique L. Fisher had 193 votes, Warren Allen had 2 votes, and Chester Budzik, Merle Chickering, Harry Winn, H. Claude Mowry and Leonard Laskowski each had 1 vote. Monique L. Fisher was declared elected.

For Road Agent. George L. Fuller had 194 votes, Edward Willette had 7 votes, and Clifford Chickering, Winford Chickering, Bernard Chickering and Carl Houghton each had 1 vote. George L. Fuller was declared elected.

For Fireward for 3 years. Winston H. Cray had 201 votes, and Arvid Pearson had 1 vote. Winston H. Cray was declared elected.

For Auditors. George M. Marrow had 168 votes, Malcolm W. Sullivan had 114 votes, Warren G. Allen had 28 votes, Marilyn Shield had 15 votes, Carl A. Johnson had 7 votes, Jane Nicholas had 3 votes, Richard Wood had 2 votes, Kenneth Wiggin had 2 votes, Dorothy Spaulding had 2 votes, and Paul Penning, Harry Erierson, Audrey Erierson, William Mitchell, Grace Welcome, Phyllis Henchey, George Barrett, Alfred Gettey, Lester Chickering, James O'Neil, and Charles Rudolph each had 1 vote. George M. Marrow and Malcolm W. Sullivan were declared elected.

For Budget Committee. Harry E. Winn had 141 votes, William M. Mitchell had 131 votes, Joseph James had 83 votes, and Warren Lemnah, Carl Johnson, Kenneth Wiggin, Paul Penning, Forrest Hall, Robert Holmes, and Arvid Pearson each had 1 vote. Harry E. Winn and William M. Mitchell were declared elected.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for 3 years. Viola V. Tuttle had 199 votes, Agnes Chickering had 2 votes, Katherine Post had 1 vote. Viola V. Tuttle was declared elected.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for 2 years. Agnes B. Chickering had 62 votes, Evelyn Winn had 6 votes, Mary Webb had 4 votes, Warren Allen had 2 votes, Harry Winn had 2 votes, Audrey Erickson had 2 votes, Imogene Chickering had 2 votes, and Jane Allen, Anna Hubner, Dorothy Mowry, Alice Spaulding, Clifford Tuttle, Malcolm Sullivan, Claude Mowry, Clara Wellington, George Milford, Paul Welcome, John Ball, Viola V. Tuttle, Carl Johnson, Arvid Pearson, Joseph James, Mary Sullivan, and George Barrett each had 1 vote. Agnes B. Chickering was declared elected.

For Sexton. Glenn B. Chickering had 23 votes, Otto S. Schlichting had 9 votes, Leonard Michaud had 6 votes, Harry Snow had 5 votes, William Fuller had 3 votes. John McKeon had 2 votes, Henry Chickering had 2 votes, Norman Amidon had 2 votes, Warren Furlone had 2 votes, and Carl Johnson, Lawrence Chickering, Walter Deselle, John Nurse, Harry Winn, Lawrence Thomas, Clifford Chickering, Ralph Dick, Clinton A. Davis, Harry Ericson, and George White each had 1 vote. Glenn B. Chickering was declared elected.

For Constable. Leonard R. Michaud had 87 votes, John L. McKeon had 81 votes, Lawrence W. Clayton had 31 votes, Robert Garland had 1 vote. Leonard R. Michaud was declared elected.

For Center Constable. Henry C. Chickering had 98 votes, Henry C. Chickering, Jr. had 4 votes, William Mitchell had 3 votes, Frank Dean had 3 votes, John L. McKeon had 2 votes, Winston H. Cray had 2 votes, and Leonard R. Michaud, Law-

rence W. Clayton, Paul Penning, Wilfred H. Richardson, Jr., and John L. Castle each had 1 vote. Henry C. Chickering was declared elected.

For West Chesterfield Constable. Bernard A. Chickering had 188 votes, Dexter Thomas had 2 votes, Paul Welcome had 1 vote, George Barrett had 1 vote. Bernard A. Chickering was declared elected.

REPORT OF SPOFFORD BRANCH LIBRARY

The Spofford Brank Library has continued to serve the year-round as well as the summer residents in the same capacity as in previous years.

The continued practice of no regular hours during which the library is available for browsing and borrowing has worked out well for those wishing to use the facilities. Any hour during the day or evening anyone is welcome to visit the library, thus catering to those who work or those who are vacationing.

Approximately 275 books from the State Bookmobile have been circulated in Spofford. These include adult fiction, non-fiction; youth; and juvenile publications.

SCHOOL WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the school district in the town of Chesterfield qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the school in said district on the 5th day of March, 1960 at 3 o'clock in the afternoon to bring in your votes for the election of the following officials: (Polls will open at 3 P.M. and close not earlier than 9 P.M.)

1. A moderator for the coming year.
A clerk for the ensuing year.
A member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
A treasurer for the ensuing year.
Two auditors for the ensuing year.

You are hereby further notified to meet at the school at 8 P.M. on March 5, 1960 to take up the following:

2. To determine and appoint the salaries of school board members and the truant officer, and to fix the compensation of any other officer or agents of the district.

3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To choose agents, auditors and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

5. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers, auditors and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of any sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, to-

gether with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

6. To see if the town will vote to pay tuition to both Brattleboro and Keene as they have in the past, so that the high school students may continue to go to the school of their choice.

7. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to investigate the tuition rates at Brattleboro and Keene High Schools for 9th grade students from Chesterfield, or any new high school students moving into town, and to enter into contract with the school having the lowest rate. Parents will have the privilege of sending their children to either school, provided they pay the difference in the tuition rate. Tuition of students already enrolled in Keene or Brattleboro High Schools will be paid for in full by the district.

8. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to enter into tuition contracts with Brattleboro and Keene school districts, or any other approved secondary school district for the education of high school pupils.

9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) as its share of Union contribution to the N.H. Educational Television channel WENH.

10. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600) as matching funds for funds available under provision of the National Defense Education Act and to authorize the school board to accept and use, in the name of the district, any Federal funds for public school education or construction.

11. CHESTERFIELD LUNCH PROGRAM REPORT

July 1, 1958—June 30, 1959

The lunch program opened September 3rd 1958. During the program period we served from 160-180 hot meals daily.

The rate of reimbursement from Federal Funds remained at 5c for each Type A meal. Under the Special Milk program we received 4c reimbursement for each $\frac{1}{2}$ pint of milk served. During the Program we purchased from 4,000 to 6,000 $\frac{1}{2}$ pint bottles of milk per month.

During our Program Period Mr. Horace Cutler assisted with chores in the lunch room. Due to illness Mr. Cutler took a leave of absence and Mr. Allan MacKerron filled his place and also helped out in the lunch room. We thank them both at this time.

During the School Period we received the following Surplus Commodities from the Government which were a great help to us:

Flour, Processed Cheese, Blackberries, Turkeys, Dried Milk Powder, Peaches, Peas, String Beans, Butter, Corn, Tomatoes, Tomato Paste, Peanut Butter, Sliced Apples, Apple Sauce, Pea Beans, Frozen Ground Pork, Grapefruit Sections, Dried Eggs and Rice.

We also received a generous supply of eating apples and apples for salads from one of our good neighbors.

To explain fully the fine qualities that our teaching staff possesses would be too lengthy to include in a report of this nature. Therefore, I will summarize and state that the staff is an excellent one and deserving of a great deal of praise.

Our Lunch Program continues to be very successful under the capable guidance of Mrs. Louis Leu and Mrs. Inez Houghton.

We were all sorry to lose the capable services of our custodian, Mr. Horace Cutler, but feel fortunate that we were able to acquire the services of A. Alan MacKerron who is doing an excellent job.

A very definite advance has been made at the Chesterfield School. This advance is seen in the newly developed de-

partmentalized Reading Program. This program proves to be very successful with both teachers and students.

The science program is continually being upgraded, and the latest improvement was seen in the purchase of equipment through the National Defense Education Act.

Worthy of note is the fine backing that the P.T.A. has and is continuing to give the school.

A school is only as good as the people of the town want it to be, and with this thought in mind, I would ask that the town give its whole hearted support to the Chesterfield Central School.

At this time I would like to thank all who have contributed to another successful year for the Chesterfield School.

SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

School District Meeting
Chesterfield Central School
Chesterfield, New Hampshire
March 7, 1959

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Harry Winn, at 3:00 p.m. and the warrant, through Article 1, was read by him. He then declared that the polls were open for balloting by the Australian Ballot for the necessary school district officers.

Agnes B. Chickering and Anna Hubner, ballot clerks, took the oath of office from the Moderator. Moderator Harry Winn appointed Fred Korradi assistant Moderator and William Carey assistant clerk. They took the oath of office from the Moderator.

At 8:05 p.m. the Moderator called the meeting to order and the Clerk read the remainder of the Warrant.

Article 2. To determine and appoint the salaries of school board members and truant officer, and to fix the compensation of any other officer or agents of the district. Arvid Pearson moved that the Budget Committees' report on the Article be accepted. Seconded by Richard Wood. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto. Agnes B. Chickering moved that the article be passed over. Seconded by Anna Hubner. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 4. To choose agents, auditors, committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant. George Merrow moved that the article be passed over. Seconded by James E. O'Neil. Motion carried to the affirmative.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of the school district officers, auditors and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of any sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town. James O'Neil moved that the school district raise and appropriate \$109,923.50 and to authorize and direct the school board to apply against said appropriation such income as estimated by the school board, exclusive of state aid, and upon the determination of the amount of state aid to be received by the school district during the next fiscal year, to authorize and direct the school board to apply against such appropriation the sum to be received from state aid and with the school district clerk certify to the selectmen the balance as an assessment to be raised by the town for school purposes. Seconded by Fred Korradi. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 6. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the cost of light and heat and thus make the school auditorium available for organized local groups who wish to use the facilities for non-profit meetings. Application to be made to the school board chairman for approval. (Passed over the budget committee.) Arvid Pearson moved that the article be passed over. Seconded by Joseph James. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 7. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,700 (three thousand seven hundred dollars) to be made available prior to June 30, 1959 as a deficit appropriations to meet the costs of high school tuition for the current year. Agnes Chickering moved that the \$3,700 be raised and appropriated as asked in the article. Seconded by Alfred Gatty. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 8. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nine hundred dollars (\$900) to be made

available prior to June 30, 1959 as a deficit appropriation for teachers' salaries caused by the employment of a part-time teacher to assist with heavy grade one enrollment during the present year. (Budget Committee recommended \$600.) Arvid Pearson moved that \$600 be raised and appropriated for this article. Seconded by Anna Hubner. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800) to be added to teachers' salaries in order to bring these salaries up to the state average. (Passed over by the Budget Committee). James O'Neil moved that the article be adopted. Seconded by George Merrow. On a voice vote the Moderator declared the motion as lost. James O'Neil challenged the vote and asked for a paper ballot. A paper ballot was taken with the following results: Number of ballots cast 90. Necessary for choice 46. Yes had 32. No had 58. The Moderator declared the motion lost.

Article 10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) as its share of union contribution to the N. H. educational television channel WENH. (Passed over by Budget Committee.) George Merrow moved that the article be passed over. Seconded by Joseph James. Paul Penning moved that Damon Russell, the helping teacher for the union school district, be permitted to speak on the article. Seconded by George Merrow. Motion carried in the affirmative. Mr. Russell spoke at length explaining the use of the channel. On a voice vote on the article, the Moderator declared the motion to pass over the article to be carried. James E. O'Neil asked for a paper ballot. A paper ballot was taken with the following results: Number of ballots cast 79. Necessary for choice 40. Yes (to pass over the article) 44. No had 35. The article was passed over.

Article 11. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400) as matching funds for funds available under provisions of the National Defense Education Act and to authorize the school board to accept and use in the name of the district any Federal funds for public

school education or construction. Agnes Chickering moved that the article be passed as read. Seconded by Fred Korradi. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 12. To bring up any other business that may legally come before this meeting. Alice Kaiser moved that the district be authorized to make tuition contracts with Keene and Brattleboro school districts for the education of high school pupils. Seconded by Fred Korradi. Motion carried in the affirmative. Stratton Morse moved that a committee be set up to study the possibility of sending all high school pupils to Keene High School, with the possibility of transportation being furnished by the district. This committee to be made up of the following: One member appointed by the school board, three members appointed by the P.T.A. and one selectman appointed by that group. This committee to be instructed to bring in an article to be voted on at the next school district meeting, reflecting its findings and recommendations. Seconded by James O'Neil. William Mitchell moved that the school board, when attending the next district meeting, vote against a raise for the salaries of district officers and superintendent's salary. Seconded by Joseph James. Motion carried in the affirmative. Kenneth Wiggin moved that the school board be instructed to bring in an article that the school district would pay the lower rate of tuition for beginning students from the 1960 graduating class to Brattleboro or Keene High School. Parents to have the privilege of sending their children to either school, provided they pay the difference in tuition. Seconded by Arvid Pearson. Motion carried in the affirmative.

At 9:50 p.m. the Moderator declared the polls closed. A count of the ballots cast resulted as follows:

For Moderator: Harry Winn had 95 votes, George Joslin had 1 vote, H. Claude Mowry had 1 vote, James E. O'Neil had 1 vote, and Ronald Guyette had 1 vote. Harry Winn was declared elected.

For Clerk: H. Claude Mowry had 97 votes, Grace Welcome had 1 vote, and Warren Allen had 1 vote. H. Claude Mowry was declared elected.

For School Board members for the ensuing three years: Clara B. Wellington had 82 votes, James Allen had 6 votes, Kenneth Wiggin had 3 votes, H. Claude Mowry had 1 vote, Grace Welcome had 1 vote, and Grace Kearney had 1 vote. Clara B. Wellington was declared elected.

For treasurer for the ensuing year: Evelyn Winn had 98 votes, and Joseph James had 1 vote. Evelyn Winn was declared elected.

For Auditors: Warren Allen had 22 votes, Marilyn Shield had 9 votes, Carl Johnson had 7 votes, James Nicholas had 6 votes, William Mitchell had 4 votes, Agnes B. Chickering had 2 votes, Harry Erickson had 2 votes, Anna Hubner had 2 votes, Kenneth Wiggin had 2 votes, Robert Goodell had 2 votes, Dorothy Spaulding had 2 votes, Clifford Chickering had 1 vote, Mary Gold had 1 vote, Osear Erickson had 1 vote, Eleanor Pearson had 1 vote, Priscilla Post had 1 vote, George Merrow had 2 votes, James E. O'Neil had 1 vote, Lester Chickering had 1 vote, Russell Johnson had 1 vote, Paul Penning had 1 vote, Arvid Pearson had 1 vote, Grace Welcome had 1 vote, George Barrett had 1 vote, Phyllis Henchey had 1 vote, Joseph James had 1 vote and Pauline Record had 1 vote. Warren Allen and Marilyn Shield were declared elected.

H. Claude Mowry and Evelyn Winn took the oath of office from Moderator, Harry Winn.

Harry Winn and Clara B. Wellington took the oath of office from H. Claude Mowry, Clerk.

Winston Gray moved that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by Agnes Chickering. Motion carried in the affirmative.
