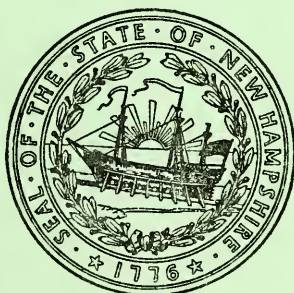

# TOWN WARRANT

-----  
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Eaton in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Eaton on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same, including Town Officers' Salaries, Town Officers' Expenses, Election and Registration Expenses, Town Poor, Fire Department, Town Maintenance (Summer, Winter and General Expenses), Street Lighting, Old Age Assistance, Insurance, Vital Statistics, Interest, Town Road Aid, Expenses of the Town Hall, Blister Rust, Social Security, Advertising and Regional Associations, Damages and Legal Expenses, Civil Defense, Libraries, and Recreation.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
4. To see if the Town will vote to have the Selectmen petition the State Tax Commission for a reassessment of the Town, and to raise and appropriate sufficient funds to carry out same.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of fifty dollars for the Planning Board, to partially defray its expenses while planning the development of the Town, and to pay for registration fees in State Planning organizations.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars for the bulldozing of the dump near the Frank French gravel pit. In return Frank French agrees to allow the residents of Eaton the use of said dump for the ensuing year.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars for the Memorial Hospital, North Conway, which is approximately one dollar per citizen – this sum to be a token that the Township of Eaton recognizes the vital part the hospital plays in the health and welfare of this community.
8. To see what action the Town will take in repairing the Cyrus Thurston bridge on the Potter Town road.

9. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following ordinance: All bathing at the "public beach," so called, on Crystal Lake from the Brackett Corner to the outlet is prohibited between the hours of 11 p.m. and 6 a.m. Anyone violating this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than five dollars. All fines levied under this ordinance shall be paid to and for the use of the Town of Eaton.

10. To see if the Town will vote to change the compensation for the office of Tax Collector from a fixed salary to an amount equal to one per cent of the Property, Poll and Yield taxes collected during the year.

11. To see if the Town will vote to provide for compensation to the Town Chief of Police for services rendered at the rate of one dollar and twenty cents per hour while engaged on official business and that he be reimbursed at the rate of ten cents per mile when required to travel beyond the town limits.

12. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following ordinance: A twenty-five mile an hour speed limit shall be in effect on route 153 in the Town of Eaton between the bridge on the north side of the entrance to Nelson's Mill to a point five hundred feet south of the southernmost entrance to Camp Wonalancet, also at a point on the highway to Brownfield beginning at the first bridge east of Snowville to the intersection of said highway with route 153 at Crystal Lake. Violation of this ordinance shall constitute a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than ten dollars. All fines levied under this ordinance shall be paid to and for the use of the Town of Eaton.

13. To see if the Town will vote to convey the title of the real estate described in the deed of Hattie E. Snow, recorded in Carroll County Registry of Deeds, book 304, page 276, dated April 22, 1955, to the Eaton School District.

14. To act upon any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

15. Polls will close at 6 p.m.

# FOREST FIRE WARDEN'S REPORT

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Dear Mr. and Mrs. and Family:

Once again our region is covered with snow and the forest fire hazard has disappeared, but to your local forest fire warden it is just a time to check over his equipment and check the causes of the fires he has had. We know that our biggest cause of forest fires are careless people burning rubbish, brush or debris without a permit or in an unsafe place. When this fire gets away from them and help is needed to put it out, they then plead that they did not know a permit was required for the incinerator or this type burning. Well, the old saying, "ignorance of the law is no excuse" fits in here very well. The forest fire laws have been in the newspapers, on the radio, on television and are on some posters, and there should be no excuse for not knowing a permit is required for all outdoor burning. In this year's report, we are going to quote the law of the State of New Hampshire in regard to permits. This is found in Chapter 233 - Section 35 revised laws, State of New Hampshire.

## Permits - 35b

No person, firm or corporation shall kindle or cause to be kindled any fire or shall burn or cause to be burned any material, and no city or town shall kindle or maintain a fire or a public dump in or near woodlands, pasture, brush, sprout, waste, or cutover land or where fire may be communicated to such lands, except when the ground is covered with snow, without first obtaining a written permit from the forest fire warden of the town where the burning is to be done, unless the same is in the presence of the warden or his agent.

## Liability for fires without permit - 36

Any person causing or kindling a fire without permit of the forest fire warden when such permit is required and any person by whose negligence or the negligence of his agents any fire shall be caused, shall be liable in a civil action for the payment to the town or the state or both, of the expenses incurred by the forest fire warden or his deputy warden in attending or extinguishing such fire.

## Penalties - 38

Any person violating any provisions of section 35 shall be fined not more than two hundred dollars or imprisoned not more than sixty days.
