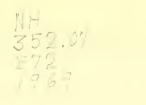

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Errol in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Errol on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Fire Department.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Police Department.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Town Poor.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Health Department.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Civil Defense.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Town Dump.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the sidewalk.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for summer maintenance of Akers Pond Road.

- 13. To see if the Town of Errol will vote to accept a trust fund of \$200.00 for the care of the Ire Hawkins cemetery lot.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the cemetery.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$176.13 for the White Mountains Regional Association and appropriate money for same.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for street lighting.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to have an evening meeting instead of the present daytime meeting.
- To see if the Town, with other towns in Coos County, will vote to support the North Country Community Services, Inc., and raise and appropriate \$189.00 as its share of expenses.
- 19. To see if the Town will hear the report of the Selectmen on the sewerage system and take action upon same.
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally be brought before the meeting.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District, on the 10th day of March, 1970, at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following articles:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing two years.
- 4. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 5. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 6. To choose an Auditor for the ensuing year.
- 7. To determine the salaries of the School Board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers and agents of the District.
- 8. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, of Officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relative thereto.
- 9. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Dear Mrs. Hawkins:

This letter will confirm our telephone conversation of February 2, 1970, regarding the non-partisan ballot system.

During the 1969 session of the General Court, the following legislation was passed and became effective as of September 1, 1969.

Non-Partisan Ballot System. Amend RSA 59 by inserting after section 77 the following new section: 59:77-a School District. Each school district in the state, except a district having a special statute relative to election of its district officers, shall elect its officers by means of the non-partisan ballot system, as provided in RSA 59:79 to 86, inclusive.

We have asked the Secretary of State for his opinion concerning whether or not other sections of Chapter 59 would apply to this change made by the State Legislature. He has informed us that by virtue of RSA 59:86, the entire chapter applies to the manner of voting for the election of school district officers.

RSA 59:86 Application of Laws. The provisions of this chapter relative to the manner of voting, counting of ballots, penalties for violating election laws and recounts for town elections, in so far as consistent herewith, shall apply to elections held under the provisions of this subdivision. In case of a tie vote at any elections held hereunder, the tie shall be determined by lot by the town clerk in the presence of the candidates who are tied if, upon notice from him, they elect to be present.

Therefore, we are of the opinion that all school districts must comply with the provisions of Chapter 59 unless a district has a special legislative statute relative to the election of its district officers.

The Supervisory Union Board decided the local share of the Superintendent's Salary and other Union Expenses. The share paid by the several Districts toward the Superintendent's Salary for 1969-70 is as follows: Dummer, 183.41; Errol, \$753.25; Gorham, \$10,887.18; Milan, \$1,085.08; Randolph, \$611.84; Shelburne, \$480.24; State Share, \$2,500.00. The Teacher's Retirement and the State Employees' Retirement Association assesses the amount for the Superintendent's retirement and other District employees that belong to the system. In those towns that are under Social Security, the amount to be paid by the District is established by law.
