TOWN WARRANT

(L. S.) THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grantham, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one Town Clerk, one Town Treasurer, one Police Officer, and one Overseer of the Poor for the ensuing year; one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds and one Trustee of the Public Library for the ensuing three years.
- Art. 2. To choose one or more Highway Agents and all other necessary town officers, agents and committees, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges.
- Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of the poor, and Old Age Assistance.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to apply for Town Road Aid.
- Art. 6. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges.
- Art. 7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for snow bill.
- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of one per cent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1949 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise for control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$400.00 for the fire department, \$250. to apply on note and \$150. for expenses of fire department.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to build a new chimney on the Town Hall, and raise and appropriate money for same.
- Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to have an Old Home Day, and take any action thereon.
- Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money if necessary.
- Art. 16. To hear the reports of the officers, agents and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Grantham School Board:

I am pleased to submit this short report on the three schools in Grantham. In the Grantham center school, the rooms have been redecorated and new sash installed in the windows. Both of these items make the rooms much more pleasant and comfortable since the windows fit better and are easier to adjust for ventilating purposes.

The three class rooms seem to be going along reasonably good. The teachers are the same as were with us last year in all of the schools. Grantham should look to consolidating the schools just as soon as it is possible to do so. A one teacher school is a decided handicap to the learning of children and, of course, Grantham can be no exception.

The health report as it pertains to examination and such as was reported to the State Board will be found on another page. The school nurse spends sufficient time in the schools to see that all that can be done in the way of promoting health habits and interests is being done as well as giving the physical examinations and reporting their findings to the parents. It is unfortunate that a few cases of scarlet fever broke out in North Grantham but none of this seems to have been attributable to the school conditions.

It is not certain what the State Aid for Grantham will be for next year but we hope it will not be reduced since the needs in Grantham are in no ways diminishing. In fact, the State Aid should be increased to assist in transporting high school pupils to neighboring schools.

The School Board has worked in every way to obtain the best possible conditions for the children in your town and the best conditions are being realized as far as our money will allow.

I am grateful to the School Board, teachers and pupils for kindnesses shown me during the year.
