- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for public relief.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$137.00 to defray insurance premiums on the Library, Chapel and Workmans Compensation policies.

- 10. To see what action the Town will take in regard (1) to constructing a building to house a truck and Town fire equipment and to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for the same; (2) to compensation for the Fire Chief to organize and maintain a Fire Department and raise and make an appropriation for same including a sum for fire protection.
- 11. To see what action the Town will take in regard to improving the approach to the Hebron Post Office and to raise and appropriate money for same.
- 12. To see what action the Town will take in rescinding the Town vote of March, 1947, to raise \$1,000.00 each year for three years for the Cemetery and see if the Town will raise \$200.00 for the ensuing year.
- 13. To see what action the Town will take in regard to snow removal and raise and appropriate money for same.
- 14. To see what action the Town will take to purchase 100 chairs for the Community Hall and raise and make appropriation for same.
- 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$50.00 for maintenance of the Town Dump.
- 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Forest Fires-Our Most Shameful Waste

Everyone apparently fears fires but too many are careless with it. This is particularly true of fires in and near woodlands. Official figures show that more than 98 per cent of all forest fires result from human carelessness and can be prevented. Consequently, we may say "Forest Fires are our most shameful waste."

Annual forest fire losses are tremendous and their effects far reaching. Such fires destroy the raw products of the forests, the protection forests provide for game and the supply of ground water. They upset local economies by drawing men from gainful employment and requiring the expenditure of public funds to

extinguish them.

Our forest fire organization is doing a good job in keeping the size of fires small but the number of fires is increasing. In 1949 there were 100 more fires in New Hampshire than in 1948, but they burned 500 acres less. For the warden and his deputies to do the job they are capable of, they must have the cooperation of the public—YOU!

The primary objective of all fire fighters is PRE-VENTION—fire stoppage. This is the goal toward which your local forest fire warden and his deputies are constantly working. It can be achieved ONLY if YOU and YOU and YOU cooperate with them. It is worth YOUR effort and can be accomplished by:

1. Being careful with fires in or near woodland, being particularly careful with matches and cigarettes.

2. Securing the required written permit from the warden when the ground is not covered with snow.

3. Insisting that others be careful and comply

with burning requirements.

4. Calling the warden promptly when fire is de-

tected and aiding him to extinguish it.

Let's reduce the number of forest fires and eliminate our most shameful waste.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Continued Teacher Shortage. One hesitates to repeat himself in these reports but it seems necessary as long as others refuse to accept the facts. The shortage of elementary teachers is as great as at any time in the past few years and will probably remain that way due to several causes: 1) Young people are not training for the elementary field of work although more have entered the colleges than for several years; 2) There will be a steady increase in the number of elementary pupils throughout the nation for several years with those under one year of age being generally the greatest single age group in Union No. 4; 3) There is a steady drain of the best qualified teachers from New Hampshire to the three New England states to the south of us and to states beyond this area due to higher salaries, better professional opportunities, greater security through tenure laws and retirement provisions, and living conditions more attractive to our younger teachers.

Tuition Costs. A new law passed by the last legislature now permits any school district to charge a tuition rate based upon total costs: "This current expense of operation shall include all costs except those made for capital outlay and debt obligations as determined annually by the state board of education." In other words to the costs of instruction may now be added operating expenses such as fuel, lights, janitor services, etc. Local tuition rates for high schools may jump \$50.00 and maybe more in some instances. Outside of tuition and transportation costs budgets probably won't show any great increases provided inflationary trends do not start a new spiral.

School Costs. Due to the small number of pupils and transportation costs the per pupil costs in Bridgewater, Hebron and Groton are relatively high and will probably remain that way. Teachers' salaries are at the lowest permitted by the state and other costs are as low as can be expected. However, due to high per

pupil evaluation of property it is fairly safe to say that the amount of state aid to be received will never be great, if any at all. For the year 1948 Bridgewater had a school tax per \$1000 equalized evaluation of \$6.07, Groton one of \$8.13 and Hebron \$5.09 while the state average was \$12.10. Alexandria had a rate of \$19.29, Bristol \$11.35, Canaan \$14.50 and Grafton \$16.07. This was a year of greatest state aid and these figures for Canaan and Bristol will be considerably higher when figured at the end of the year. A tax rate this year of \$30 or below is indeed very rare in the state. Current rates may be found in the 1949 New Hampshire Register.

We are listing below the assessed valuations of the taxable properties of the town. This is done for the purpose of evoking comments and constructive criticism from the taxpayers, with the hope that where inequality and disproportionality exist information will be presented to the Selectmen to enable such corrections to be made.

The law states that every member of the community has a right to be protected by it in the enjoyment of his life, liberty and property; he is bound to contribute his share in the expense of such protection. The determination of this share is dependent upon the ownership of taxable property; therefore, in order that he may bear no more nor less than his proportionate part of the expense of his government the assessments on his property must be equitable as compared to assessments on all other property.

For one person to be assessed more than his just share results in another being assessed for less than his proportional share and brings about an inequality in the burden of taxation which it is our desire to prevent or correct.
