

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Kingston in the (L.S.) County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Kingston on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow sums of money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year and to issue in the name of the Town negotiable notes, the aforesaid notes to be paid during the current year from taxes collected during the year.
- 4. To see whether the Town will vote to ratify and confirm the action of the Selectmen in conveying to Maurice I. and Minnie Hoyt, the premises previously taken from them by the Town for non-payment of taxes, the consideration for the conveyance being payment in full of all taxes in arrears, plus statutory interest and penalties.
- 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000.00 to be used toward the purchase of a Class A 750 GPM Combination Fire Truck. Total estimated cost to be \$22,000.00. The balance to be paid by Fire Wards' Capital Reserve Fund of \$3,671.92 and the Kingston Fire Department Association Fire Truck Fund of \$12,000.00.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50,000.00 to finance the construction of a fire station at South Kingston, to cost \$15,000.00 and a two story addition to the existing Central Fire Station, to cost \$35,000.00, such sum to be raised by the issuance of serial notes under and in com-

pliance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (N.H. RSA 33) and any amendments thereto, and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such notes, the discretion of fixing the date, maturities, denominations, the interest or discount rate, place of payment, form and other details of said notes and of providing for the sale thereof to be delegated to the Board of Selectmen, as shall be in the best interest of the Town, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$100.00 to carry on White Pine Blister Rust Control in Kingston. Work to be performed by the State Resources Development Division.
- 8. By petition of the Kingston Garden Club, to see if the Town will establish a Town Conservation Commission as set forth in RSA 36-A.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell tax deeded property at public auction.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the Auditors' Report and the Town Report as printed.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Article 1. The Moderator declared the meeting open at 10 o'clock for balloting on officers for the ensuing year. It was voted that after the result of balloting is announced that the meeting be adjourned until 8 o'clock at the Town Hall on March 9 to vote on the remaining articles in the warrant. The polls were declared closed at seven o'clock and the following is the result of the balloting. Total numbers of votes -832. Number on the check list 1284.

Shall the Zoning Ordinance and Amendments as proposed by the Planning Board be adopted for this Town? Yes -82; No -705.

- Article 2. March 9, 1966. Meeting was called to order at eight o'clock by Moderator Leonard Sanborn. Rev. Robert Howard gave the invocation. New residents were asked to stand for recognition. Town Officers were introduced. Mr. Sanborn read the reslut of the ballots for Town and School Officers. The following were appointed by the Moderator to serve on the Finance Committee: J. Edward Stevens, Eunice Clark, Alfred J. Alberts and James P. Sloan. Forrest Young was appointed to serve on the Planning Board. The Selectmen announced that a mistake had been made in the budget for planning and zoning, the amount should have read \$1000 instead of \$1500. Mr. Jillson made a motion that the sum of \$59,965.52 be raised and appropriated. An amendment by Mr. Southwick to review the budget item by item was passed. Motion to reduce Police Dept. to \$3500. was lost. Motion to reduce Town Dump from \$4000, to \$2600, was lost. The original motion was then passed that the sum of \$59,965.52 be raised and appropriated to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- Article 3. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow sums of money in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current year and to issue in the name of the Town negotiable notes, the aforesaid notes to be paid during the current year from taxes collected during the year.
- Article 4. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to raise and appropriate the sum of \$375.00 for a two-way police radio (Factory modernized rebuilt) for the second elected police officer.
- Article 5. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of not more than \$1,450.00 to install a sound proof ceiling in the basement of the Town Hall, including lights, switches, etc.
- Article 6. This Article to adopt the Mobile-Home Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board was lost.
- **Article 7.** This Article to establish a five member Industrial Dev. Study Committee was lost.
- Article 8. Motion to establish a five member Public Works Study Committee was lost.

Article 9. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell tax deeded property at Public Auction.

Article 10. Voted to accept the Auditor's Report and the Town Report with one correction.

In the Mill Stream Cemetery we completed the well and equipped it with a gasoline motor so that we can water the flowers and grass in all parts of the property. All of the monuments have been straightened and repaired if necessary.

In the Kingston Plains Cemetery we laid out 12 plots in the old center section which were never used.

We feel that the work that we have done in the Mill Stream Cemetery has made this cemetery one of the most beautiful cemeteries in New Hampshire. We wish that someone or some group would donate funds to other Kingston Cemeteries so that equal results could be obtained. What better memorial could you have?

REPORT OF THE LIBRARIAN FOR 1966

This past year has been an active one with the library now open a total of seventeen hours (as recently as two years ago we were open only eight); in the acquisition of new books and in the number of adults and young people using the library facilities.

· Book buying emphasis has been on reference books for Junior and Senior High levels. Also, the library received a grant of \$100. for the purchase of reference books. This grant was given to all libraries in the state which had become affiliated with the Statewide Library Development Program.

A total of 1,760 books were borrowed from the Bookmobile this year to supplement our collection. One hundred fifty-six books were borrowed by special request from the State Library.

Income from the Pine Tree Grange Trust Fund was used to purchase: Crawford, "History of the White Mountains" and Jennings, "Tattered Ensign".

During the year the trustees added three new bookcases to the Junior High section.

An illustrated lecture on "Strawberry Banke" was given in recognition of National Library Week. A collection of books pertaining to Portsmouth and the history of New Hampshire were on display. This program was sponsored by the Friends of the Library. During this week Mrs. Gladys Larson brought her pupils of Holiday Kindergarten to the library for instruction in the use of the library.

During National Book Week two groups of children — Lane's End Kindergarten and a first grade class from Bakie School visited the library and were told a little of its history and made acquainted with books for their age level. A fifth grade class visited the library to receive information in reference work.

Last spring, Mrs. Gertrude Semple, assistant librarian, attended the course in Book Selection for Adults and Young Adults offered by N.H. State Library and the University of New Hampshire Public Library Techniques which was held at Notre Dame College, Manchester.

The Southeast District Book Meetings were attended by the librarian and assistant librarian.

The Kingston Garden Club filled the urns again this year and in connection with their Christmas doorway contest, decorated the door of the library. Also, members of the club have furnished plants and flowers during the year.

Several books have been presented and we are grateful to the following donors: Mrs. Benjamin Belonga, Mrs. John Brown, Mrs. Harry Clark, Mrs. Bernard Goldsmith, Mrs. Charles Morse, Mrs. Charles Phillips, Mrs. Francis Reinfuss and Dr. Duncan Stephens.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Fire Department responded to a total of 142 calls from January 1, 1966 through December 31, 1966. Thirty-two (32) calls were for fires and one hundred ten (110) were for the rescue wagon. Of these fire calls, seven were to give assistance to other Fire Departments.

Each year there has been an increase in the number of calls for the rescue wagon. Luckily this year there has been a decrease in the number of calls for the fire apparatus.

During the year, seven of the firemen attended the fire school in Fitzwilliam, N.H. We are hoping that more men this coming year will try to take advantage of this school. From the report given by those who have attended, it is well worth while.

Our truck fund has continued to grow, thanks to the Carnival and Fund Raising Committees who have given much of their time to make it a profitable venture. We wish to thank the ones who have made donations for the same cause. We hope to reach our goal by 1969, if not sooner.

As the town grows, so should your Fire Department. More money is being spent on schools and housing, therefore, we must keep abreast of our growth by expanding to take care of these changes. This is one of the reasons that we are working towards the purchase of a new truck to replace the Diamond T which is almost 30 years old. According to the Underwriters, it is recommended that a truck be replaced after twenty years of service.

The latter part of this year we held meetings in reference to building a two stall station in South Kingston to house the truck that is already in that part of the town, also to transfer one of the other trucks there when we get our new truck. This we need as it will give us the necessary coverage of the town.

We had the good fortune of having Dr. Rocco of the Exeter Hospital give a talk and demonstration on mouth to mouth resuscitation which was very beneficial to those who attended.

Permits for oil burner installation must be obtained from the Fire Chief. Permits for outside fires must be obtained from one of the Fire Wardens. This is a State Law.

The number to reach the Fire Department is still the same — 642-5512. When reporting a fire or emergency give name and address as clearly as possible. The sooner we receive the information the quicker we can respond.

We of the Fire Department are all volunteers and welcome anyone who wants to be a part of our organization. Our meetings take place the third Monday of each month.

REPORT OF SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING March 5, 1966

At a meeting of the Inhabitants of the School District of the Town of Kingston, qualified to vote in district affairs held in said Kingston in the Daniel J. Bakie School Auditorium on March 5, 1966, starting at 8 p.m., the following business was transacted:

The meeting was called to order at 8 p.m. by the Moderator, Leonard F. Sanborn. Prayer was offered by the Rev. Lex Kirk, Vicar of St. Christopher's Episcopal Church, South Kingston. The Moderator read the Warrant and then introduced the School Board, Principal and Superintendent. He gave personal thanks to the Superintendent for his fine report. He also announced that there would be a meeting of the Sanborn Regional School District on March 26 with voting from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and the general meeting at 7 p.m.

- 1. It was voted to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and Officers, as printed in the Town Report.
- 2. No business was transacted under this article.
- 3. The original motion was amended; so the actual vote was the District authorized the School Board to convey to the Sanborn Regional School District, by Quitclaim Deed, the present Daniel J. Bakie School, together with the contents thereof, and the lot of land upon which it is situated.
- 4. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500.00 as a Deficiency Appropriation for the year 1965-1966; said appropriation to be made available prior to June 30, 1966.
- 5. It was voted that the district accept the provision of Title I of Public Law 89-10 and appropriate the sum of \$2,495.28, such monies having been made available to the district under said Federal Act for such particular projects as may be determined by the School Board. Further moved that the district authorize the School Board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.

6. A motion was made and not passed (11 yes, 15 no) stating that the District Treasurer be directed to pay over the Treasurer of the Sanborn Regional School District any cash balance in her hands or money due the District as of July 1, 1966, less any outstanding bills or debts; any sum so transferred to be used as a credit against the Regional School District assessment to be raised by the pre-existing Kingston District to defray its share of the cost of operation of the Regional District during the first year of operation.

Whereupon a new motion was made and passed substituting "Town of Kingston" for "Treasurer of the Sanborn Regional School District."

The man who made this motion (George Harmon) then realized that this did not make sense; so asked the voters for reconsideration on his motion. Then the following was passed:

It was voted to direct the Treasurer of the Kingston School District to pay over to the Town of Kingston, any cash balance in her hands or money due the District as of July 1, 1966, less any outstanding bills or debts.

7. Voted to adjourn at 8:45 p.m.
