

### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- ARTICLE I. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- ART. II. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- ART. III. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of Highways and Bridges, and make appropriation for same.
- ART. IV. To see what discount if any the Town will allow on taxes paid on or before a specified date.
- ART. V. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for construction of class II roads known as Drewsville Road and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$324.00; or will accept State Aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$322.66.
- ART. VI. To see if the Town will vote to buy snow fence and make appropriation for same.
- ART. VII. To see if the Town will accept a Fund of \$300.00 from the estate of Charles Egerton.
- ART. VIII. To see what sum of money the Town will raise if any for the improvement of the cemeteries and make appropriation for same.
- ART. IX. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ART. X. To transact any other business that may come before said meeting.

ART. XI. To allow Accounts.



### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Langdon School Board:-

I hereby submit my sixth annual report as your superintendent of schools.

The pupils of Langdon are fortunate in retaining such able experienced teachers as Miss Lora Horton who is teaching the four lower grades and Miss Minnie Bonnette in charge of the work of the four upper grades. The teachers and pupils have maintained a high quality of work in rather congested rooms.

Mrs. Z. L. Hasham, nurse, is continuing her excellent work among the children. I believe that the watchful care of the nurse aided by the dental clinic work by Dr. Crandall has held the pupils in good health. Cod liver oil and hot dishes help. Milk has not been furnished this year.

We are still confronted with problems arising from inadequate school-rooms. There is no room for any work outside recitations except as the pupils have the use of the Town Hall and the playgrounds. As there was no room for books, book shelves were made downstairs. We felt that these would care for the books, but the lower floor is so damp that some of the books have molded, and the teachers and pupils have had to take unusual care to prevent more damage. There is too much space to heat compared to that used. The lower floor is in such condition that it is of very little use. I have had a few suggestions offered by citizens that seem good. One is that a small fund be started and added to each year until an amount had been gathered to build a new school. Such a fund might be increased from time to time by gifts and incomes from entertainments.

It seems at present that it may be several years before a new school can be financed and built. We must take care of the pupils of to-day. It might be possible with no extra cost to Langdon to run a bus through Langdon to Alstead carrying the pupils of the seventh and eighth grades. Arrangements could be made to carry the high school pupils also, but this added expense would have to be paid either by the parents or by the district.

The two rooms now in use could be made into one large room that would care for the six lower grades with one teacher. I believe one teacher could do better work with six grades in a room of some size than than with four grades crowded into a small room.

I wish to thank the school officials and teachers for their help and kindness.
