TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lempster, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall, in said Lempster, on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, at ten of the clock, in the forenoon, to open the polls for voting for candidates and at one o'clock in the afternoon to open discussion of articles of Warrant:

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing and to vote on the following question: "Shall the Provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be adopted in this Town?"
- Article 2. To bring in your votes for Delegates-at-large, Alternate Delegates-at-large, Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the National Convention of the various Political Parties to be held to nominate Party Candidates for the President and Vice President of the United States; and Delegates to the N. H. Constitutional Convention to be holden in May.
 - Article 3. To hear all reports and act thereon.
- Article 4. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the following purposes for the ensuing year:

Town Maintenance
Bridge Maintenance
Old Age Assistance
Town Poor
Old Home Day and Memorial Day
Library
Civil Defense
Other Town Charges

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to allow the

Selectmen to deliver blank inventories at the time they appraise the property for taxation.

- Article 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to receive sealed bids for mowing roadsides: a separate bid to be sent for each District.
- Article 8. To see what sum per hour the Town will vote to pay for labor on the highway and for hired equipment.
- Article 9. To see what action the Town will vote to take to continue the Town Forest Committee and take any necessary action thereto.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to require the Long Pond Development Committee to hold public meetings at 8 P. M. at Union Hall, Lempster, during the third week of March, third week of July, and the third week of October, and to give at such meetings a financial accounting, and the committee be subject to question at that time. Notices of such meetings to be posted ten days prior to date of meeting in three public places; out of town owners of property at Long Pond must be notified by mail ten days prior to date of such meetings.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$581.72 for Town Road Aid. The State will contribute \$3,878.11.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote where the T. R. A. money should be spent.
- Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,000.00 for State Aid Construction. The State will contribute \$10,000.00.
- Article 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to keep the Information Booth open from June 24 to Sept. 9 and pass any vote in relation thereto.
 - Article 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Select-

men to administer or dispose of any real estate, acquired by Tax Collector's deed; said authority to continue in effect until next Town Meeting.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to insure the dwellings acquired by Tax Collector's deeds and make any necessary repairs thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$300.00 in trust, from Carl A. Parker, interest to be used for the care of the Hiram Parker Lot, Reuben H. Morgan Lot and the Carl A. Parker Lot, in Lempster Cemetery.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to purchase for use of the Town Clerk, Selectmen, and Tax Collector an adding machine and a typewriter, total purchase price not to exceed \$250.00.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to have a history of the Town of Lempster written; and so voted, would said Town accept from Silver Mt. Grange, the sum of \$100.00 to start the fund to write the history; and to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to add to this fund.

Article 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Fire Company.

Article 21. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to investigate, approve and purchase all equipment for the Town of Lempster, including the Lempster Fire Department and the Long Pond Development Committee, in conjunction with the department head involved.

Article 22. To see if Town will vote to submit all town purchases and work in excess of \$50.00 to competitive bids. A minimum of two bids shall be secured and must include the total cost of labor material. Completion date for all work must be specified by Selectmen, and work performed by fully qualified personnel. Under no circumstances will work be performed

and paid for unless authorized by Selectmen; nor will work be paid for before completion.

- Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase Liability Insurance for the Town and raise \$170.00 to cover expense thereof.
- Article 24. To see what sum of money the Town will vote towards a central heating system for Union Hall.
- Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to contribute towards the N. H. Marine Memorial and raise money therefor.
- Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one-hundredth of one percent of the assessed valuation of the Town of Lempster for the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association for the purpose of promoting and publicizing the natural advantages of the town together with other towns in the region, the sum of \$29.24.
- Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$400.00 for White Pine Blister Rust.
- Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to abolish the Australian Ballot System and to adopt the Non-partisan Ballot System to take effect in 1957.
- Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$110.00 for the Town's share of Social Security for its employees.
- Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- Article 31. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the Town in order to secure greater equality as taxpayers and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value and to raise

and appropriate money to pay for same.

Article 32. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and citizens of Goshen-Lempster cooperative school District No. 5, I herewith submit my fourth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

Mrs. Myrtie Starkey transferred from the Lempster Street School to the Goshen village school. She replaced Miss Dorothy Laughlin who resigned to accept a position in Litchfield.

Mrs. Frances Wirkkala was employed as a full time teacher at the Lempster Street school. She had been music instructor for the two towns.

Mr. Elmore Kathan continues as teacher at Goshen four corners and as teacher at East Lempster is Mrs Doris Newman. Each of the four teachers are teaching four grades.

Mrs. Helen Tenney was employed on a part time basis to help with the teaching of music, especially when the Christmas and other programs are to be presented.

These staff members have carried on most effectively in spite of serious handicaps as to building conditions and facilities. During this period of extreme shortage of teachers we are most fortunate in retaining experiened, well qualified teachers.

It is most unfortunate from both the teaching conditions and

financially that such a long delay has been experienced in negotiating the sale of bonds. This means considerable added cost in terms of building and rate of interest, and may mean the necessity of some alternatives in building plans and specifications. The School Board and advisory committee have spent many hours and made trips to Concord and elsewhere in an attempt to speed up the process. The State Department of Education has been most cooperative in assisting us with our problems.

We are extremely anxious to complete construction by September and start the school year 1956-57 in the new building.

Miss Florence MacIver has done her usual inspections and conducted clinics as well as making many home visits. Through her efforts the absentees have decreased and she emphasizes the importance of health in daily living.

May I express deep appreciation for your patience and confidence during our delay. I would also like to thank the School Board and the advisory committee for their guidance and many hours of conferences. Most of all I wish to extend my sincere thanks to the teachers, and boys and girls for their patience and cooperation.

SCHOOL NURSE REPORT

This past year has been a most eventful one in the field of preventive medicine. Through the efforts of Dr. Jonas Salk and his co-workers a vaccine to be used in the prevention of Poliomyelitis was licensed and made available to all children in the first and second grades in schools throughout the country. This was a tremendous step toward stamping out poliomyelitis.

Co-operating under a nationwide program the State Department of Health conducted large clinics for the administration of the vaccine. In order for a child to receive the innoculations of the vaccine it was necessary for the parents of the child to

sign a permission slip. Despite some of the unfavorable reports about the vaccine the response of the parents toward the program was very good. The enthusiasm of the childrem toward these innoculations was amazing. No unfavorable reactions were reported in our area.

Further clinics for the administration of Salk Vaccine are being planned. Children through the age of fourteen years are to be included in the next clinics.

It seems wonderful to think that at last there is available an immunizing agent capable of preventing paralytic polio and it's many tragedies. This is certainly a very important step in guarding the health of our children, now and in the future.

Interest on the part of the parents is so very essential to the success of these programs. As always the parents have cooperated. It is a very great pleasure to work with you and with your children Combined interest of everyone is what brings about improved health programs for the children.

SCHOOL WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District No. 5 qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, Goshen on the twenty-fourth day of March, 1956, at eight o'clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing five years.
- 3. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 4. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 5. To see if the the district will vote to authorize the school board as agents to dispose of existing school buildings and lots to which the district has clear titles, and use the funds received toward equipping a new school or for development of the site for recreational purposes.
- 6. To determine and appoint the salaries of School Board, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 7. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization and building funds, to-

gether with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 8. To see if the district will authorize the school board to appropriate receipts from federa! lunch reimbursements, tuition, gifts and other receipts from miscellaneous scources, in addition to the original appropriation for 1955-56, for the lunch programgeneral expenses, equipment and improvements.
- 9 To see if the district will athorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the District, such advances, grant-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the U.S. Government and/or State Agencies.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
