TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Orford, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Orford on Tuesday the 11th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act of the followings subjects.

First to adjourn for two hours to act on the School District Meeting.

Articles

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year: Also to choose one Selectman for three years and one Selectman for one year, one Trustee of Trust Funds and one Library Trustee.

2. To hear the budget of the Town and raise and appropriate any money recommended therein or pass any vote relative thereto.

3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.

4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Town Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year.

5. To see how much the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the removal of snow and care of Town Winter Roads for the ensuing year.

6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to insure Town Property.

7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of Electric Lights.

8. To see how much money the Town will vote

to raise and appropriate for the Orford Free Library and Orford Social Library.

9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

10. To see if the Town will vote to dispense with the distribution of inventory blanks until the Selectmen appraise the property.

11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell and convey any property acquired by Tax Deed.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed one one-hundredth of one per cent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation, based on the assessment of 1950, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth Lake Sunapee Region.

13. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the construction of class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$473.75 for that purpose.

14. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Fire Dept.

15. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to buy tables for the Town Hall.

16. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the revised laws relating to playing games of Beano, shall be adopted in this Town.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) to cover expenses of Memorial Day Celebration.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for cleaning and care of the Hall.

19. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for a Community Center Fund.

20. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Trustees of the Trust Fund to turn over to the West

Congregational Church, the money received from the sale of the Church Meadow.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for the purpose of building a new bridge over Jacob's Brook on the Miller Road.

22. Bring your Ballots for delegates to the party National Convention.

23. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Orford:

I hereby submit my fourth annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

In spite of dire predictions of world conflict, disastrous inflation, and corruption in high places, the Orford schools have continued in a calm and satisfactory manner to prepare the next generation for its proper role as parents and citizens. This, of course, is as it should be. It does not mean that the children do not consider these world wide events, at an age when they can understand them, but they are not over-emphasized at the expense of developing the idea and ideal of sound, happy, and successful living.

Teachers and Teaching

Again this year we were able to retain our very capable elementary staff which has already served Orford and Orfordville in a very satisfactory manner for a number of years. Considering the great shortage of elementary teachers, we are indeed fortunate that this condition prevails. Your elementary teachers take a real interest in their pupils and work hard to produce an interesting classroom situation. Many of them have taken, or are taking, special college courses to improve their ability in certain specialized fields.

Two key teachers have remained in the high school which has tended to provide a continuity of the total program from year to year. We were sorry to lose over three other high school teachers but in every case we have replaced them with better teachers who are working together as a team to give us a complete and well rounded high school program.

Repairs and Upkeep

The school board embarked several years ago on a program which would gradually bring both of the

buildings up to reasonable standards in regard to cleanliness, paint, light, etc. In the beginning the walls were dark and dirty, the floors were kept up with oil which made them black, and the outside paint was deteriorating. There is still a lot to do on this program but substantial progress has been made. The custodians are to be commended for the work they have done and the clean appearance of the buildings.

Because the buildings and equipment are old, it is always necessary to expend money for repairs, some of which are not evident at the time the budget is prepared. Both the board and myself try to spend this money wisely, taking care of the most urgent situations first.

Financial

As is evident to most everyone, we are all faced with a rising spiral of prices. Every item which we purchase is higher than it was a few months ago. This makes it extremely difficult to estimate our costs for the proposed budget. This is especially true when one stops to realize that the school board must estimate in December, 1951 what they will buy, say, in April, 1953. A school board's budget, prepared in December, does not start to function until the next July and is not completed until a year from the next June.

Some items have been increased, because of rising prices, in the budget prepared for 1952-53. We anticipate a slight drop in the enrollment of tuition pupils which will reduce our income. Every effort has been made to encourage pupils from nearby towns to attend Orford High School. A few more tuition pupils would make a substantial difference in the amount to be raised by taxation in Orford. I should like to point out that at all times your board has been very careful of expenditures and has attempted at all times to be as economical as possible, consistent with a sound educational program.

Much to our surprise the revised program for state aid to education actually increased the amount allotted to Orford over the figure which was originally anticipated for the budget. We had assumed that the

amount would be \$1,219.32 but it actually turned out to be \$2,228.91. The best estimate we can prepare for 1952-53 would indicate that the amount of state aid next year would be about 5% less than in 1951-52.

Miscellaneous

There are a number of items which I would like to make special note of; the splendid turnout of parents for the American Education Week programs, particularly those that were conducted during the school day; the kindness of Mrs. Ola Miller in presenting a large electric refrigerator to the Orfordville hot lunch program (a welcome and much needed addition to our equipment); the excellent cooperation of the parents in canning food for the hot lunch program; the improved attendance record, particularly in the high school; and the cooperation of our bus drivers in assisting the school when special trips have to be made.

I would like to make special mention of the art work of Shirley Joslyn. Her picture, a night scene at the county fair, prepared under the direction of our art supervisor, Mrs. Rena Horton, was entered in the Vermont Art Exhibit at Montpelier where it received second prize. I think that it is commendable that our school provides our pupils with an opportunity to develop these special talents. Both Miss Joslyn and Mrs. Horton are to be congratulated upon this recognition of achievement.

In conclusion I would like to take this opportunity to thank the parents, citizens, teachers, school board, P. T. A., custodians, and others who have assisted us in producing good schools for Orford.
