#### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Roxbury in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Roxbury Meeting House in said Roxbury on Tuesday, the Fifth day of March, next at 7:30 PM in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. \$4,055.00.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for salary of Police Department.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,225.00 for Town Welfare.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for purchase and maintenance of forest fire equipment, and labor.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$308.13 for T.R.A.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$74.00 as its fair share of the operating cost of Cheshire Hospital.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$52.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for upkeep of cemeteries.
- 10. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$120.00 for a contingency fund.

- 12. To raise \$3,000.00 for Summer and \$3,500.00 for Winter road maintenance.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$81.00 to support the mental health service program of Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$116.96 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning studies, technical assistance and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal Funds available for planning purposes.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for emergency assistance to Town Poor.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and, further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or take any other action thereon:

- 17. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Building Permit Fee Schedule of \$10.00 per new constructed unit and \$5.00 for an addition to an existing structure.
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to build a salt house. Construction, location to be determined by Selectmen.
- 19. To see what action the Town wishes to take pertaining to Dump Facilities required by 1975: Explanation In July of 1975, Marlborough will revert to a land fill system. Our cost per year is estimated to be \$1,800.00 for joint operation with Marlborough. It has been suggested that we join Keene along with seven other towns at an estimated cost of \$800.00 per year plus transportation. The State Law requires that each town shall provide and maintain a public disposal facility.
- 20. To transact anyother business which may come before said meeting.

# ANNUAL TOWN MEETING March 6, 1973

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, David Brown at 7:30 PM. Selectmen Robert Pyne, William Yardley and Richard Whipple were present.

Of the 101 voters, 44 were present and voted.

Article 1: To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.

SELECTMAN for three years; 37 votes cast. Of these William Yardley received 36 and Thomas Benson received 1: William Yardley elected for three years.

TOWN TREASURER: 40 votes cast. Of these Mary Brown received 40. Mary Brown elected Treasurer.

TAX COLLECTOR: 40 votes cast. Of these Priscilla Yardley received 40. Priscilla Yardley elected Tax Collector.

TOWN CLERK: 41 votes cast. Of these Elizabeth White received 41. Elizabeth White elected Town Clerk.

ROAD AGENT: 15 votes cast. Of these Robert Fifield received 15. Robert Fifield elected Road Agent.

AUDITOR: 18 votes cast. Of these Oliver Derby received 18. Oliver Derby elected Auditory.

CONSTABLE: 26 votes cast. Of these Robert Fifield received 18. Charles Bailey 1. Alpheus White 7. Robert Fifield elected Constable.

TRUSTEE OF TRUST FUNDS: 43 votes cast. Of these Alpheus White received 42. Charles Bailey; Alpheus White elected Trustee of Trust Funds.

SEXTON. 44 votes cast. Of these Alpheus White received 42. Charles Bailey 2. Alpheus White elected Sexton.

Article 2. To riase such sums as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and appropriations of the same. \$3,500.00. Motion made and seconded that we raise \$3,500.00 to defray Town charges. This motion carried.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropr-

iate the sum of \$1,000.00 for salary of Police Department. Motion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$1,000.00 for salary of Police Department. This motion carried.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,150.00 for Town Welfare. Motion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$1,150.00 for Town Welfare. This motion carried.

Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for purchase and maintenance of Forest Fire equipment and labor. Was asked where the money appropriated last year was spent, we were told it was put back in the General Fund. Motion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$200 for purchase and maintenance of Fore Fire equipment and labor. This motion carried.

Article 6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$308.70 for T.R.A. Motion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$308.70 for T.R.A. This motion carried.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$62 as its fair share of the operating cost of Cheshire Hospital. Montion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$62 as its fair share of the cost of the operating cost of Cheshire Hospital. Motion carried.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$49.00 for the Monadnock Region Association. Motion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$49.00 for the Monadnock Region Association. Motion carried.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for upkeep of cemeteries. Motion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$100.00 for upkeep of cemeteries. Motion carried.

Article 10. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Motion made and seconded that we authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Motion carried.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$120.00 for a contingency fund. Motion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$120.00 for contingency fund. Motion carried.

Article 12. To raise the sum of \$2,000.00 for Summer and \$2,500.00 for Winter road maintenance. Motion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$2,000.00 for Summer and \$2,500.00 for Winter road maintenance. Motion carried.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$64.00 to support the mental health service program of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service. Question asked what benefits would we receive from these services? Answer was: If we needed these services they would be there. These are shared services. Motion made and seconded that we raise the sum of \$64 to support the Monadnock Family and Health Service. Motion carried.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$109.48 as the Town's share for the studies and operations of the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operating expenses, planning studies, technical assistance and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal Funds available for Planning purposes. Motion made and seconded to raise the sum of \$109.48 for the Southwestern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. Motion carried.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for emergency assistance to Town Poor. It was explained that this has nothing to do with Town Welfare. It is set up to take care of destitute families in case of an emergency. Motion made and seconded to raise the sum of \$200.00 for assistance to Town Poor. Motion carried.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the with-drawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budgeted appropriations for the following purpose and in amounts indicated, or take any action thereon.

Appropriation Amount
Reevaluation of Property Taxes \$1,200.00
Motion made and seconded. This motion carried.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to the opening of a portion of the Old Grimes Road which is presently closed subject to gates and bars. Portion to be opened will be from the intersection of the Middletown Road to the private driveway of the Reese Every residence, a distance of approximately 3/10 (three-tenths) of one mile. Reason: To provide adequate accessibility to the Every

residence from Middletown Road in the event of emergency situations. Motion made to pass over this article. Motion made first by voice vote, and then by ballot. There were 30 votes to pass over and 13 against. Motion was made and seconded to pass over article. This motion carried.

Article 19. We, being Voters of the Town of Roxbury, wishing to express our appreciation of the beauty of ourtown, do respectfully request, in the harmony with the rights given us under the statutes of the State of New Hampshire in Chapter 253, section 17, and all other rights inherent in us relating thereto, that the Selectmen of the town include in the warrant for the regular 1973 Town Meeting the subject of whether or not the voters will designate the roads set forth herein as scenic roads, protected by this designation as set forth by statutory law.

The roads we request being considered at Town Meetings are all of the constituting the old pattern of travel of the old Town of Roxbury, specifically including the following:

- 1. Old Roxbury Road, one end of which is also known as the Marlborough Road.
- 2. Horse Hill Road, one end of which is also known as the Parker Road.
  - 3. Woodward Pond Road.
  - 4. Houghton Road.
  - 5. Hardy Hill Road
- 6. Dakin Road, part of which is also known as and which becomes Babbidge Road.
  - 7. Davis Road.
  - 8. Middletown Road.
  - 9. Branch Road.
  - 10. Kingsbury Road
  - 11. Newcomb Road.
  - 12. Nelson Road
  - 13. Woodward Pond Nelson Road
  - 14. White Road.
  - 15. Willard Pond Road.

We do request that said roads be classified as scenic roads.

We do respectfully request that this topic be presented in such manner that the voters may decide the issues of each road and its designation separately in case it may be that they should decide that some roads would be so designated and som roads not be so designated, in order that a decision against classifying any one road as scenic would not render it impossible or cumbersom to designate others of such roads as being scenic.

#### REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

The planning board met twelve times during the fiscal year. Three public hearings were held. Two - 2 lot subdivisions were approved. One 539 acre subdivision to be divided into 63 lots was withdrawn by the developer following extensive hearings by the Board, and a public hearing. A "Planned Unit Development" is still under consideration by the Board at the end of the fiscal year.

#### REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD MEMBER

The Monadnock Regional School Board annual meeting was held in Swanzey at the High School on March 17, 1973. The proposed budget of \$1,919,643.76 was raised and appropriated for 1973-1974. The total assessment for Roxbury was \$30,308.52.

Two new board members were elected into office: Mr. Greene from Fitzwilliam (Mr. Cleveland moved to England), Mrs. Quintard from Richmond (Mrs. Thompson-term expired), and Mr. Bouffard was re-elected from Swanzey.

The public also authorized the School Board to enter into an agreement with Fitzwilliam to use land at the Emerson School for recreational purposes.

The proposal to Plan #1: to build a middle school or Plan #2: to build an addition to the High School, Mt. Caesar, and Fitzeilliam Schools plus build a small middle school were defeated by a large majority.

Since the annual meeting we have reviewed dual enrollment, extended school year and concentrated on expansion of elementary schools to return grades 7 & 8 back to the towns which many residents seem to want. And also a small addition to the High School. These items will be on this years warrant.

It isn't feasible to have elementary schools in Roxbury or Richmond because census is too low.

A reprensentative was appointed to attend the Vocational Center Meeting in Keene which, hopefully may be among the three Vocational Centers in State selected this year.

A formula study committee was also appointed to reconsider the methods of taxation which resulted in a tie vote. The School Board also ended in a tie vote previously. The method of equalized valuation and resident membership remains but several towns are pressing for a resident membership cost only. Most have agreed that a common tax rate would be the best.

Towns visited for Board meeting this year were Richmond, Surry, Fitzeilliam, Sullivan and Cutler School. Next year the remainder will be visited.

The Board voted to keep on as normal a schedule aspossible due to the energy crisis.
