#### SALEM PUBLIC LIBRARY

#### Report of Library Trustees

Reports of a statistical nature as required by law will be found in the librarian's report found in another place in this journal

We wish to use this space outlining to the voters steps leading to the article in the present warrant requesting a bond issue for a new library, badly needed for Salem.

Upon the death of Mr. Arthur Kelly in 1961 it was found that he had left in his will a bequest of \$25,000.00 to build a new library in the town of Salem, it to be completed within five years of his death and to be a memorial to him acceptable to his heirs.

As early as 1962 serious discussions as to the site of the new library were underway. The advisability of trying to build on the present site was discussed but it was felt that the lot would be too small and that a real shortage of parking space would develop. Both the state library officials and our architect were against this plan.

At a meeting held in June 1962 with Mr. Allen, Assistant state librarian, the selectmen, and trustees present, a very thorough discussion of the library problem was held and we were promised the cooperation of everyone present.

On Monday evening January 21, 1963 we held a meeting with Mr. Carter of the architectural firm of Carter & Woodruff of Nashua, N.H. whom the board had selected as architects. This was an exploratory meeting on both sides. Mr. Carter advised us first to find a site.

Next in order of importance was a meeting with town attorney Lewis Soule for the purpose of finding the legal standing of the trustees in reference to contracts and methods of procedure. We were advised that an article in the town warrant was the only way we could obtain authorization to proceed.

On February 4, 1963 at a meeting with the selectmen, we were advised that a site on the old Silverthorne land, then owned by Edmunds would be available to us for a library providing the town would purchase the tract. We agreed to accept this site.

On February 8, 1963 we voted to put an article in the town warrant asking for authority to apply for a federal loan to procure plans for a new library. The cost of the library when completed to approximate \$210,000.00. This loan is to be repaid either in full or in part when the library is built. This article was passed at the town meeting. Word was received in September 1963 from federal authorities that a planning loan of over \$12,000.00 was granted. On October 9, 1963 we met with the town manager, town counsel, and our architects to draw up a contract for planning a library.

On January 23, 1964 at a meeting in the library with Mr. Staples, Mr. Ross, and Mr. Woodruff and Mr. Mitchell of Carter & Woodruff present we were presented with a tentative plan for a new library. This plan provides a total floor space of 10,110 square feet costing approximately \$210,000.00. At this meeting it was decided to insert in the town warrant a request for a bond issue of \$155,000.00 to be used in conjunction with the \$25,000.00 Kelly bequest to build a new library for the town.

We think a new library can be built for this price which will be adequate for many years to come.

We are holding in reserve \$25,000.00 from the Lancaster fund which we have been promised by the selectmen. There will be expense for stocking with books which cannot be raised under a bond issue.

We wish to express our thanks to Mr. Staples, town manager, Messers Gelt, Ross, and Peever, selectmen, attorney Lewis Soule, the members of the budget committee, the architects Carter & Woodruff, and to Mrs. Bertice Woodbury who was on the board during the early planning, for their help.

We also thank our new state librarian Mr. Emil Allen who has been very helpful.

We expect the State of New Hampshire will be awarded a little over \$132,000.00 of federal funds for library building and extension this year, and that we will be able to receive some of it for use on this project. Your board is already in contact with the state commission on this. However in the case of this fund the need is great, and the amount small.

We hope you will, by your vote, pass this bond issue. There will never be a better opportunity at this price to get a much needed new library for the town.

We wish to thank Miss Alice Hall and Mrs. Mary Forrest for the splendid cooperation we have received during the year. Also Mrs. Karl Wolf who worked for us briefly during the year. Through the kind assistance of Mrs. Emilio, student advisor, at Woodbury High school, we were able to secure the services of Miss Sharon Hill who has been with us since early fall. It pleases the trustees to see the use to which the library is put by the teenagers during the hours of four to eight P.M. These young folks are generally well behaved, and really study. An amusing incident occurred one evening when some youngster called up to reserve a table for study purposes, that is it would be amusing except that it points up dramatically the dire need for better library facilities for Salem.

# FIRE DEPARTMENT OF SALEM, NEW HAMPSHIRE

Mr. Frederick T. Staples, Town Manager Town of Salem, New Hampshire

Dear Mr. Staples:

During the year 1963, the Salem Fire Department responded to 505 alarms, 301 still and 204 box alarms, an increase of 117 alarms over 1962. This was a record number of alarms for the town of Salem. The fire loss for the year 1963 amounted to \$54,569.00 compared to a loss of \$56,979.00 for 1962. The ambulance responded to 344 calls, 322 medical and 12 fire calls.

An analysis of the fire department activity for 1963 is as follows:

Again this year, I report that our three 750-gallon pumpers are in excellent operating condition. New equipment added this past year included the Squad car and an E & J Lytport resuscitator, the latter for the North Salem company.

A shortage of hose is still a main concern. The increase in fires the past year meant that money allocated for equipment had to be diverted to meet the resulting expenses. In my budget this year, there Is a request for new hose and the replacement of the chassis of Tanker II, North Salem.

During the past year the department continued its training sessions. North Salem held drills on Monday evenings and Salem Depot on Thursday. The department sent Pvt. William Kingdon to the fire school conducted by the University of New Hampshire Extension Service and he is now our department training instructor. Several members attended the fire school sponsored by the Meadowood County Area Fire Department in Fitzwilliam, N.H.

The major deficiencies stated in the 1960 Town Report still exist; that is, an inadequate number of permanent firemen and the lack of a suitable central fire station. With the continued growth in population and the increased number of alarms, it is important that Salem meet the recommendation of the New Hampshire Board of Fire Underwriters to provide proper 24-hour fire protection.

The department extends a welcome to the citizens of Salem to visit our stations, and again, the department thanks the citizens of the town for their continued interest, support and cooperation.

#### EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Eight members of the department have completed the fall semester at St. Anselm's College evening course on Accident Investigation and Crime reporting. All of this training and education has provided the individual officer with the necessary knowledge to carry out the many and varied functions of the department efficiently.

#### TRAFFIC CONTROL AND HIGHWAY SAFETY.

The addition of (8) eight female school crossing guards to our department has provided invaluable assistance. All of the personnel are efficient and dedicated to duty.

It appears that a co-operative effort by the town and the State Highway department will sharply reduce the accident potential on Route 28, in 1964.

Automatic traffic control signals will be installed at Route 28 and Lawrence Road, Hampshire Road, Hampshire Street, and Kelly's Crossing. Route 28, north of the depot area is expected to be widened, with a sidewalk to be provided on the East side of the street. A comparable program of improved street lighting will be applied to this area.

There are many areas that are without sidewalks and adequate street lighting. However, some progress is being made to correct the most serious problems.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Salem qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Woodbury High School in said district on the fourteenth day of March, 1964 at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

2. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.

3. To see if the district will vote to acquire land, to construct and equip a new high school, to authorize the School Board to take all actions necessary in connection with the acquisition of land and the constructing and equipping of the new high school, to authorize the School Board to issue bonds or notes in an amount not to exceed Two Million, Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$2,450,000.00) for the purpose of financing such acquisition of land and the constructing and equipping of the new high school.

4. To see if the district will vote by secret ballot to instruct the School Board as to the location of the new high school on the Weiszack property, Saint David property or any other suitable property of their choice.

5. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the School Board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

6. To see if the district will raise and appropriate the sum of Eight Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$8,600.00) to be paid to the dis-treasurer before June 30, 1964, to offset a deficiency in the current school budget caused by the employment of an additional high school teacher and other expenses not anticipated at budget time, such deficiency approved in advance by the Municipal Budget Committee and the State Board of Education. 7. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name of the district, such advances, grantsin-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from Federal, State, local or private agencies.

8. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to negotiate leases for additional classrooms.

9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Two Thousand, Five Hundred Forty-Five Dollars and Forty Six Cents (\$22,545.46) for the purchase of school equipment.

10. To see if the district will vote to accept the following minimum salary schedule for teachers, and raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Three Thousand Five Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$23,590.00) to place all teachers on schedule as of September 1964, with the understanding that the schedule itself may not be changed except by vote of the school district.

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# <u>REPORT OF THE</u> <u>SUPERVISORY UNION NO. 55 BOARD</u>

New Hampshire School Districts are grouped by state statutes into some 47 Supervisory Unions, ten of which are single or "city" unions. As the name implies, these unions enable the individual Districts to enjoy as a group, supervisory advantages and functions, which they would find difficult or impossible to enjoy as individual Districts.

Our Union, No. 55 is comprised of the towns of Salem, Plaistow, Hampstead, Atkinson and Newton, with present estimated populations of 16,000, 3,200, 1,600, 1,500, and 1,600 respectively. Union No. 55 has an annual growth rate of approximately 15 per cent and is in the fastest growing area of the state. It is seventh from the top of the 47 unions in the number of teachers employed. (Five cities and one Union have more teachers.) It is fifth out of 47 in the number of pupils enrolled. (Four cities in the state enroll more students than we do.) It is eighth out of 47, in the size of the tax base. (Seven cities have greater real estate valuation than does Union No. 55.)

During the past three years, the growth has been phenomenal in all five towns. The enrollment during this time in Salem has increased over 800 students in grades 1-12, in Plaistow over 60 in grades 1-8, in Hampstead over 80 in grades 1-8, in Atkinson over 80 in grades 1-8 and in Newton over 40 in grades 1-8. The PHAN towns (Plaistow, Hampstead, Atkinson and Newton), all of whom tuition their high school students outside their districts, now have 64, 23, 19 and 38 new high school students respectively, for a total 3-year increase of 144 new students. "In-district" students in the Union have increased 36 per cent, and "out-of-district" tuition students have increased 42 per cent, during the three year period from September 1960 to September 1963.

Our Supervisory Union No. 55 Board is comprised of the three School Board Members from each of the member districts. The normal business which comes before this Board consists of establishing and approving the administrative and salary budgets for the Union office and staff. This business is done in the fall of each year, before the individual district budgets are established. The PHAN towns share several educational services, such as Nurse-teacher, Special Education Class, and Music Supervision. These services, and related teaching aids and equipment are also budgeted by the PHAN portion of the Union Board. Each line item in these budgets is debated, and either approved or disapproved by a vote of the Union Board. In budget matters, each Union Board member has one vote. The school board members from your town are your representatives in all Supervisory Union Board business.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Salem, in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Ackerman Hall, in said Town, on Tuesday the 10th day of March next, at ten (10:00) in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the Town vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance and the Zoning Map to extend the Commercial-Industrial B District presently existing on the east side of South Broadway between Hampshire Street and the Massachusetts State line to include the following described area:

> A tract of land in Salem, New Hampshire bounded and described as follows: Westerly by the East line of an area on the Easterly side of South Broadway, now zoned for commercial uses; Southerly by the Massachusetts-New Hampshire state line and land of Arthur Long; Easterly and Northly by Hampshire Street.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning Ordinance and the Zoning Map by designating the area shown as Lot #3 on map #106 of the 1963 Salem Tax Maps as residential rather than rural. The area affected by such amendment consists of approximately fifty (50) acres of land presently owned by Albert Townsend, Roger Townsend, Edna Townsend and Nettie Townsend and situated on the easterly side of Sand Hill Road and Hampshire Street.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to zone from Rural to Residential The area bounded on the north by a line running from a point on Lake Street two hundred fourteen (214) feet northerly of Easy Street; thence along the northerly boundry of Lots 21, 22, 23 and 24 on Map #30 of the 1962 Salem Tax Maps and an extension of that line to a point two hundred (200) feet westerly of Scotland Avenue; thence in a line parallel to and two hundred (200) feet westerly of Scotland Avenue to a point two hundred (200) feet northwesterly of Millville Street; thence in a line parallel to and two hundred (200) feet northwesterly of Millville Street to a point on Lake Street two hundred (200) feet northwesterly of the intersection of Millville Street and Lake Street; thence by Lake Street to the point of beginning. Said area contains approximately forty (40) acres of land.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to change from rural to residential the area shown as lot #9, Map #8 on the 1963 Salem Tax Maps, consisting of approximately fourteen (14) acres of land presently owned by James Spagnuola and Rose Spagnuola and being bounded on the west by Lawrence Road and on the southwest by Butler Street.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray the expenses of operation of the Town; Town Officers salaries and expenses, expenses of Election and Registration, planning Board, Municipal Court and Town Buildings, Ambulance, expenses of the operation of the Police, Fire and Civil Defense Departments, expenses of the Town Dump, and Damage by Dogs, expenses of the Health Department, Summer and Winter maintenance and general expense of Town Highways, Street Lighting, Town Poor and Old Age Assisstance, Parks and playgrounds, Damages and Legal Expenses, Social Security and Retirement (Town's Share), Interest and other necessary expenses pertaining to the operation of the Town of Salem, including the Water Department, all such amounts being shown in the posted Town Budget. Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer under the provisions of RSA 33:71, 1955, to borrow, in anticipation of taxes, such sums as are necessary for the operations of the Town, and to set the rate, effect the issuance of notes, and to otherwise negotiate for the sale of notes to be paid within the present fiscal year.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Manager to apply, negotiate and do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal Interest Free Loans, and to expend the same, as may be required for the preparation of plans and designs of Town Roads, Municipal Buildings, and the extension of the Water System.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to establish the Salary of the Justice of the Salem District Court on a basis of one hundred eighty dollars (\$180) per thousand population in the Salem District, and raise one thousand dollars (\$1000) for the Same.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to establish the Salary of the Special Justice of the Salem District Court at 30% of the Salary of the Justice and raise three hundred (\$300) for the same.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to establish the salary of the Clerk of the Salam District Court at 60% of the Salary of the Justice, and raise six hundred dollars( \$600 ) for the same.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to accept the devise of Twenty five thousand dollars (\$25, 000) from Arthur G. Kelley upon the terms and conditions of said devise.

Article 13. By request of the Library Trustees to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred fifty five thousand dollars (\$155,000.00) for the purpose of constructing and equipping a library, such sum to be raised by the issuance of not more than one Hundred fifty five thousand dollars (\$155,000.00) in bonds or notes and authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to apply for such Federal Aid as may be available, to issue and negotiate such bonds and notes and to determine the rate of interest theron, to take such other action as may be necessary to secure the issuance, negotiation, sale and delivery of such bonds and notes as shall be in the best interest of the Town of Salem and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) to be used in making improvements to the Cemetery, henceforth the proceeds from the sale of cemetery lots in such improved portion of the Cemetery, up to the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), to be kept as a revolving fund to be expended in making further improvements in the cemetery.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to construct and equip a municipal building, and authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to execute any and all contracts and agreements necessary and proper or advisable in connection with the construction and equipping of such municipal building and authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to issue bonds or notes in the amount not to exceed eighty five thousand dollars (\$85,000.00), for the purpose of financing said building and equipment.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to construct and equip a municipal garage, to authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to execute any and all contracts and agreements necessary and proper or advisable in connection with the construction and equipping of such municipal garage and authorize the Town Manager and Selectmen to issue bonds or notes in an amcunt not to exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) for the purpose of financing said building and equipment.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) to provide medical, surgical and hospitalization insurance for town employees.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote that henceforth taxpayers may make payment of their taxes and authorize the Collector of Taxes to accept payments in prepayments of taxes.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote that henceforth the Tax Collector be authorized to appoint Deputy Tax Collectors.

Article 20. By request of Salem Taxpayers Association: To see if the Town at said meeting will vote to direct the Selectmen to appoint a committee of five (5) to develop and propose an acceptable Code of Ethics for Salem; to hold hearings and information meetings upon the subject; and to return its report to the Board of Selectmen by January 1, 1965, in order that the Town may take action at the 1965 Town Meeting.

Article 21. By request of Evelyn Ebert and others: To see if the Town will Authorize the Town Manager to appoint a Committee of five (5) to study the feasability of establishing a visiting Nurse program for Salem. Said committee to consist of two (2) registered nurses and three (3) lay people, who shall present their recommendations to the Town Meeting of 1965.

Article 22. By request of Harbourne Ringer and others: To see if the Town will vote to extend the water main on Lake Street, from the existing water main, a distance of fourteen hundred (1400) feet and raise the sum of twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) to install the same.

Article 23. By request of Delbert F. Downing and others: To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of seven thousand five hundred dollars (7,500.00) to install storm drains in Orchard Terrace.

Article 24. By request of Michael J. Carney and others: To see if the Town will vote to accept Johnson Ave.

Article 25. By request of William D. Brown Sr. and others: To see if the Town will vote to accept Taylor Street in Arlington Park and raise money to tar and gravel the continuance of Taylor Street about two hundred and fifty feet (250) to Route 111.

Article 26. On Petition of Walter Sullivan and others: To see if the Town will accept the street named Sullivan Court.

Article 27. By request of Dorothy R. Cotter and others: To see if the Town of Salem, N. H. will accept and pave two hundred by fifty feet (250) of Sherwood Circle Southeasterly from Douglas Drive.

Article 28. By request of Douglas A. Seed and others: To see if the Town will vote to release and discharge the dedication of Baldwin Street from its intersection with Ann Avenue to the Easterly boundry of South Broadway.

Article 29. By request of Harold C. Johnson and others: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate enough money to continue the pavement of Webb Street for a distance of approximately twenty five feet (25).

Article 30. By request of Louis Morneau and others: To see if the Town will vote to accept Hillside Avenue. (Francis Street)

Article 31. By request of Mr. Joseph W. Lantagne and others: To see if the Town will vote to accept Gail Road for a distance of one hundred (100) feet and raise money to gravel and tar same.

Article 32. By request of Julia Lavoie and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light at Franz Acres on pole #2035, and raise money for the same.

Article 33. By request of Peter Ritchie Jr. and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on the post in front of 240 Lawrence Road, and to raise money for the same.

Article 34. By request of William F. McCarthy and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on the post at the corner of Baldwin Street and Messer Avenue, and to raise money for the same.

Article 35. By request of David Vartanian and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light on pole #199 and one (1) Street light on pole #200, both on Brady Avenue, and raise money for the same.

Article 36. By request of Harry Krikorian and others: To see if the Town will vote to install a street light on the corner of Playcamp Road.

Article 37. By request of Harold C. Johnson and others: To see if the Town of Salem will vote to install one (1) street light on existing pole in the vicinity of 10 Webb Street.

Article 38. By request of Sam Pappalardo and others: To see if the Town of Salem will vote to install three (3) street lights on Gloria Road, on posts #5385, 5421 and 4622. Also one (1) street light on Marianna Road on post #4826 and one (1) street light on Catherine Road on post #4497 and raise money for the same.

Article 39. By request of Guy Ackerman and others: To see if the Town will vote to install one (1) street light on William Street on post #5351, one street light on Ackerman Street on post #5382, and one (1) street light on Shepard Avenue on post #5435 and raise money for the same.

Barron and others: To see if the Town will vote to install three (3) street lights, one on the corner of Veronica Avenue and Lucille Avenue; one on the corner of Lucille Avenue and Peggy Lane; and one on Lucille Avenue between the property of Francis E. Each spring, usually in April, the Union Board holds another regular meeting. At this meeting Union Administrative personnel are elected for the following fiscal year, and their salaries are established.

At the regular board meeting in April 1963, it had become evident to most Board members that something must be done to relieve administrative congestion in the office. As a result, a meeting was held in October of the Board Chairmen from each of the individual districts, the Supervisory Union Board Chairman and the heads of the administrative staff. The key subjects discussed at the meeting by the Chairmen were:

- 1. Change in Administrative Staff functions
- Feasability of machine accounting, for at least vendor and payroll accounting.
- 3. Inadequacy of present office housing.

As a result of this meeting, a job analysis was initiated of all administrative functions, present and proposed.

On November 6th, and again on November 12th, the full Union Board met to budget for the 64-65 school year. Before the meeting temporarily adjourned on the 12th, the Union Board directed the Chairman to appoint a study committee of three Board members to investigate feasability of:

- 1. Realignment of administrative staff functions
- 2. Acquisition of some basic machine accounting equipment.

Mr. Perri, of Atkinson, Mr. Schmidlin of Salem and Mr. Swasey of Newton were appointed to serve on the study committee. The Board directed that they report back to the full Board in January 1964.

At the November 12th meeting, the Board authorized acquisition of larger administrative quarters. As a result some 2200 sq. ft. of new space will be available for occupancy on July 1st, 1964. This doubles the office space, with a rental increase from \$150 per month to \$265 per month.

On November 25th, the PHAN portion of the Union Board met for a third budget session, involving those items relating to the four PHAN districts.

In January, the study committee reported. Their report was excellent, and well presented by their chairman, Mr. Perri. Their unanimous recommendations were as follows: 1. Installation of a basic IBM system, to alleviate the severe load In the areas of statistics and financial accounting.

2. Establishment of a position of Assistant Superintendent of Operations, and to budget \$8500 for this position. A request to the State Board of Education for approval, should establish state support, to the extent of \$2500 of the \$8500, leaving a net cost to the Union of \$6000.

3. Request a change in title of Teacher Consultant to that of Assistant Superintendent of Instruction.

4. Appoint a committee of the five individual district chairmen, to meet on call of the Superintendent to interview and select not more than three candidates for the position of Assistant Superintendent of Operations. The candidates selected by the screening committee shall be interviewed and one of them elected, by the full Board, at a date to be set later.

5. Appoint a committee to report recommendations at the regular April meeting on a proposed salary schedule, sick-leave allowances, absence provisions, and any other fringe benefits for Supervisory Union Administrative and office personnel.

These recommendations were adopted by the Union Board except the title change of Teacher Consultant to Assistant Superintendent of Instruction was tabled. The Board stressed that the Teacher Consultant position shall hold the same level of responsibility as that of the new position of Assistant Superintendent of Operations, and further, that it is their intent that this recommendation should be taken from the table at a future meeting upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools. The Union Board Chairman was instructed to appoint a salary study committee. The appointments made by the chairman were: John Wood of Plaistow, Chairman, William Letoile of Hampstead and Mrs. Lucile deBesche of Atkinson.

It is hoped that through the reading of this report, each citizen of all Districts in Union No. 55 will obtain a better understanding of the New Hampshire Schools' supervisional structure, and in particular, the underlying reasons which have necessitated the budgeting action taken during the 20 to 30 hours of effort expended by your Union No. 55 Board. The gains we are striving for, by our actions, can only result in greater efficiency, more service, a better informed public, and the resulting better education for all of our children.

### REPORT OF THE

### SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Salem:

I am presenting herewith my Eighth Annual Report as Superintendent of Schools in Salem. A report from the Principal of the Woodbury High School, as well as statistical information are listed separately.

### PERSONNEL

Twenty-seven new teachers have been added to the teaching staff in Salem for this year. Of the twenty-seven, fourteen are elementary teachers, seven are high school teachers and six are junior high teachers. We also hired a guidance counselor, an additional nurse and for the first time we have a new position, that of curriculum co-ordinator. Mr. Paul Johnson, Principal of Somersworth High School, replaced Mr. Francis Geremonty as Principal of Woodbury High School. We were all saddened by the death of Mr. Geremonty, who died after a long illness. He had been a devoted principal. Of the thirty-one new personnel added to our staff, eighteen were replacements and thirteen were new.

All teachers have continued membership in local, state and national professional organizations. Forty-six teachers have taken courses this past year to improve themselves professionally.

We must continue to evaluate our salary schedule. In this regard, it is important that we are aware of the salaries paid the teachers in our neighboring Massachusetts communities. We receive many of our applicants from the border cities. There is still a shortage of qualified teachers and because of our continual growth pattern we are constantly in need of a large number of teachers. We must therefore be prepared to meet the competition or we will not be able to hold our present standards.

### CURRICULUM

During this past year Woodbury High School has been evaluated by a group of educators as part of an accreditation program by the New England Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges. Woodbury High School is a member of this organization. If we take advantage of the recommendations of this group we will be able to comtinue to hold membership. Our biggest problem is the lack of proper housing facilities.

We have hired a curriculum co-ordinator for Woodbury High School and it is his responsibility to evaluate the programs offered, the books and equipment available in the various courses and the methods and techniques used by the teachers. This year he has initiated an adult education program and it is expected that this program will be enlarged. Typewriting courses were offered at Woodbury High School last summer.' The morning course was open to prospective 7th and 8th grade students and the evening course was open to upper classmen and adults. These courses proved very popular and probably will be continued.

The elementary teachers evaluated their schools and programs and presented the results in a booklet form and it is hoped that feasible suggestions made by them may be carried out.

Modern Mathematics is now being offered in grade 3 and some of the grade 4 classes. It has previously been in grades 1 and 2 and has been very worthwhile. As funds allow it will be offered in all elementary grades.

A request for an additional remedial teacher is being made. Because of our tremendous growth, we are unable to spend adequate time with the upper levels, especially grades 7 and 8.

For the first time we have initiated a program in speech therapy. A specialist comes to Salem periodically. Last spring a portion of our pupils were examined and a very large number of them were found to have speech defects. The program this year has been supported by various organizations. This coming year we are asking that the School District support this worthwhile program.

A group in Salem that has been very dedicated and deserves support is the Council for Retarded Children. At the present time we have two classes in Special Education for the educable. They are interested in providing a class for the trainable. The School District should lend their support to this fine organization and if there are enough trainable pupils to qualify for a class then one should be established.

The School District continues to take advantage of funds provided by the Federal Government under the National Defense Education Act for special projects in mathematics, science and modern languages.

### HOUSING

Housing continued to be our major problem. This past year it was necessary to set up classrooms in three cafeterias, use a remedial room as a classroom, split the high school study hall into two classrooms and used the new gym in the high school as a study hall.

This coming year we need 17 additional classrooms or actually 23 classrooms so we could discontinue the temporary classrooms.

The School District failed to vote a new high school last March and a more serious problem now exists because it takes 18 months to build a high school. It will be necessary to go on double sessions unless 17 additional classrooms can be rented. Double sessions should be avoided if possible. Rented classrooms will curtail the curriculum of the seventh grade. It will mean no home economics, no industrial arts and no physical education for them. There will be other problems too, but rented classrooms will probably be best. The School Board does not have much choice.

It is most imperative that the building program be resumed. The total school enrollment has increased three hundred and forty pupils since last year. The 1963 school census showed a total of 5,250 persons, an increase of 601.

The school projections estimate a school enrollment next year of 3,161 pupils, an increase of three hundred and twenty.

The school enrollment projections show not only the need for a new high school, but probably three elementary schools by 1969-70. The longer the School District waits to build, the more costly it will become and the education of our children will really suffer. It will mean for 1965-66, double sessions at least for grades 5-12 if we do not vote a bond issue this March.

An article in the January issue of Redbook had an interesting article entitled "How To Win The Fight For A New School". It appears to me that we must organize and plan more efficiently if we are to have a new high school. The P.T.A. Council should be commended for the initiative that they have shown. I hope other groups and individuals may actively lend their support and unite as they have in other communities.

The Building Committee is working earnestly to provide the best site and to learn as much as possible about the latest in school construction. The high school staff headed by Mr. Johnson is attempting to provide information for a better curriculum and the net results should be a new high school that all the citizens will be proud to claim their own. We must build for the future.

Credit should be given to the custodial staff for the work that they do in keeping the schools well maintained.

### SUPPORT QUALITY EDUCATION

People have asked what is quality education. When we speak of quality education we mean <u>qualified teachers</u> in uncrowded classrooms, with the books, supplies, and equipment they need to do a good job.

We mean <u>supervisory</u> and <u>special help</u> for teachers in these days of changing and expanding knowledge, so that they may continue to grow in their teaching skills and keep up-to-date in their knowledge of subject matter. We mean a curriculum which is constantly being improved.

We mean <u>guidance</u> services that help parents and children to find what is suited to the child's needs ann abilities, so that he may progress toward a useful, satisfying life.

We mean <u>administrators</u> who are competent and up-to-date in their knowledge and who are leaders.

We mean <u>maintenance</u> which assures cleanliness and safety which protects your investment.

We mean <u>informed</u> citizens who understand the importance of good education to their children, their community and their country.

### WARNING TO PARENTS

Do you know that school dropouts have twice as high a rate of unemployment as high school graduates?

Do you know that early marriage seems to be related to the high dropout for women?

Do you know that frequent absences and truancies lead to early dropouts?

Encourage your children to stay in high school and keep regular attendance.

### **APPRECIATIONS**

Appreciation is expressed for the continued support of all local organizations and individuals. Helping at the individual schools, honoring special groups, presenting scholarships, presenting equipment to all schools and especially worthwhile books and records to the school libraries are commendable. Please accept my personal thanks and the thanks of all those who work with me.

### REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

### WOODBURY HIGH SCHOOL

It is a difficult task to write a school report that will clearly describe the present situation and adequately portray the immediate future when apprehension and anxiety constantly grip one's mind. There is apprehension in my mind because I believe education is essential to survival, it is the life blood for understanding the dignity and worth of all men, it influences the transmission of the culture and heritage of our democracy to all children, it is the source of learning about learning, and it provides a window to the past and a growing storehouse of knowledge so necessary to the citizen of our changing society.

It is a vast and complex enterprise embracing hundreds of students and thousands of dollars and as yet we are unable to predetermine the finished product. However, we are learning each day methods and techniques that promise to fulfill the ambition of all responsible Americans, Quality Education for All Children. The kinds of teachers needed, the proper programs of study, and the essential physical plant to derive the best from each student's abilities is emerging throughout the nation. Salem is in the unique position of preparing to build a new secondary facility and the people will choose either the inflexible barely satisfactory approach to education or the broad flexible and adequate approach to education. The choice made in 1964 will determine the flexibility and therefore the essential approach to education in the community for several decades. Hence the apprehension, the fear we may not serve future generations well.

The increasing school population has exerted a pressure on students, faculty, and plant that is detrimental to education. It is impossible to serve the accepted school program in circumstances that fail to provide enough laboratories, shops, and that find many instances of uncomfortable physical surroundings such as overcrowded classrooms, extremes of heat and cold.

The visiting committee of the New England Association of Secondary Schools cited the weaknesses of the present program and suggested possible changes. They recognized that more adequate facilities or major renovation of the present plant are necessary to accommodate an acceptable educational program. The visiting committee made continual reference to the need for department heads and an adjustment in teacher load to provide dynamic leadership and to help attain exciting teaching.

The program of studies should be expanded to include opportunities for experience in mechanical or architectural drawing; humanities, and advance courses in many areas; to include increased opportunities for students to obtain experiences in art, biology, chemistry, health and physical education, shop, physics, social studies. We must strive to encourage a love for learning among the faculty and student body. We must strive to provide all students an educational experience that will encourage them to seek education beyond the twelfth grade. It is already fact that fifty percent of the high school graduates go on to further education and all predictions are upward. We can relish the good ole days when less schooling was necessary, but must also face up to the fact that times have changed.

Woodbury High School graduates must compete for positions in industry and post-secondary education against students from secondary schools that frequently offer greater background and experience. Two examples: the electronics industry is nearby but we do not offer experience in electricity or electronics; the sciences of biology, chemistry, and physics are limited to a few students because available laboratory space is minimal.

In my judgment Salem has an enormously pressing issue in planning and organizing an efficient and effective educational program. The opportunity is here and the challenge must be faced. I am aware of the anguish that each person must suffer in arriving at a decision. It is never an easy choice.

Statistically the Woodbury-Central School has 1245 students in grades 7-12 served by 53 faculty members. It is an increase of 176 students and six faculty members since June 1963. In order to accommodate the increased enrollments it was necessary to use the small gymnasium as a study hall and to convert the previous study hall into two classrooms. Both of these acts have been detrimental to the educational program.

### Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Salem School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1963, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the District, Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the School Board and the School District Treasurer.

### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibit A)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of June 30, 1962 and June 30, 1963, are presented in Exhibit A. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$76,443.96 during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1963.

### Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit B)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the School District during the fiscal year is made in Exhibit B, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

### Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and

Actual Revenues: (Exhibits C & D)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1963, are presented in Exhibits C and D. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit D), a revenue surplus of \$2,637.62, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$2,605.55, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$32.07.

### Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit E)

A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1963, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit E. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1963, is indicated in Exhibit F.

### Building Fund Account: (Exhibit G)

A statement showing the activity in the Building Fund Account during the fiscal year is included in Exhibit G.

### Statement of Bonded Indebtedness: (Exhibit I)

A statement of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the School District as of June 30, 1963, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit I.

### Woodbury High School Activities Funds: (Exhibit J)

A summary statement of the Woodbury High School Activities Funds is presented in Exhibit J.

### Statement of School Tax Account: (Exhibit K)

A statement of the School District Tax Account with the Town of Salem is included in Exhibit K. As indicated therein, as of June 30, 1963, the School District had received from the Town the total amount of the 1962-63 School Tax of \$959.291.44.

### Current Surplus:

It is noted that the current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased from \$4,588.11 to \$32.07, during the fiscal year ended Tune 30, 1963, as shown herewith:

### Overdraft of Appropriations and Application of Municipal Budget Law:

It is noted that in the fiscal year ended June 30, 1963, there was a net overdraft of appropriations amounting to \$2,605.55. In other words, total expenditures exceeded total budgetary appropriations by this amount as shown herewith:

In accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Budget Law (R.S.A Chapter 32), application was made to the State Board of Education by the School Board, with the approval of the Budget Committee, for authority to exceed budgetary appropriations. Under date of June 17, 1963, a Certificate of Emergency was issued by the State Board of Education, approving the expenditure of \$2,860.57 in excess of 1962-63 appropriations.

### Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the School District.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Salem School District for their assistance during the course of the audit.



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
