# TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Salisbury in the county of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

(L.S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Salisbury on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
  - 3. To elect one Selectman for three years.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Budget Committee.
- 5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the Town Budget.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money on notes of the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 7. To hear reports of agents, auditors and officers heretofore chosen.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the control of White Pine Blister Rust (Estimate \$400.00).
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit (Estimate \$200.00).

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$150.00 for the Franklin Hospital.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to use \$1500.00 of the Capital Reserve Fund interest for road maintenance in the flood control basin.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town \$7,000.00 (In serial notes of \$1000.00 or less, first note to mature in 1957) for the purchase of power grader.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to accept for the Trustees of the Trust Funds the sum of \$44.23 from "Salisbury Heights, N.H., Clock Committee".
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and the Citizens of the Salisbury School District:

Once more it becomes my duty to report to you regarding your local schools.

This year your enrollment is slightly larger than that of previous years. First day enrollment was as follows:

### **Heights School**

Total enrollment for both schools was 54 children, an increase of four childen. This does not seem like very much to some people. However, when you realize that each teacher has to handle four grades with each pupil almost having to be given individual instruction, the addition of even four children makes the task all the more difficult.

We have been faced with other difficulties due to circumstances beyond our control. Last year Salisbury had two teachers of unusually good ability. Neither of them returned for per-

sonal reasons. The school district lost two good teachers and their places had to be filled from other teachers, one without any experience, and the other a teacher of some experience. Perhaps the district does not realize that it is most difficut to find any teachers today who are willing to take a four-grade combination position. This places a heavy responsibility upon both superintendent and school committee. Another factor is that of salary. Very few people are willing to work these days for the salaries which the Salisbury School District is willing to pay. The very minimum salary should be three thousand dollars for a qualified teacher—even if you can find one to take four grades. I feel that such a salary is the least that should be paid for the responsibility such a position entails.

Another point is the degree of criticism to which teachers are being subjected. Sometimes teachers come in for severe criticism because they do not teach children in the manner that parents like. I would like to say that I believe teachers should have the authority to run their classes in ways that are acceptable to the school board and superintendent. If there are misunderstandings regarding such matters they should and could be solved by conference with those concerned. Teachers do not, in any way, attempt to dominate children or work in ways that are detrimental to children. However, it is absolutely necessary that teachers be given the authority to maintain good discipline in the schools. This is the first requisite of any good teacher. She should be sustained and aided by both superintendent and school board in this all-important matter. This should not be difficult for any qualified teacher. She should never be placed in the position of fearing to demand good behavior of any and all pupils. The work should be well motivated, the instruction interesting and profitable, and good behavior insisted upon. Here again, the teacher must show a fine sense of understanding of children, and parents must support her in her decisions as she carries out her work of training the children in general behavior. Children should obey their teachers; teachers must take the lead in demanding this. They cannot do it effectively

if they sense that they are restrained by unreasonable opposition from any source.

The schools of Salisbury are adequately supplied with all the necessary material resources, such as books, supplies, reasonably good quarters and things of that kind. The children are well taken care of so far as these things are concerned. There is a good hot lunch program, supported by local effort and directed by a member of the School Board. Those people who are behind this effort merit the commendation of the community.

In closing, I want to say that because Salisbury has always had pretty good schools, I want them to continue to be that way. I am asking the people of the community to take a personal interest in the educational facilities of their community, to support the school board and the superintendent in their efforts to secure such a continuation of good schools and through every means in their power to work cooperatively for the best interests of their children.
