TOWN WARRANT FOR 1967

To the inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook, in the County of Rockingham, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the lower hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 86, on Tuesday March 14, 1967 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon and to cast ballots from that hour until at least 6 o'clock in the evening of the same day and to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1. To elect by Non-partisan ballot: a Town Clerk; one Selectman, Assessor, and Trustee of the Trust Funds for a term of three (3) years; a Town Treasurer; a Collector of Taxes; a Chief of Police; a Chief of the Fire Department; three (3) constables; one member of the Budget Committee for a term of three (3) years; one member of the Budget Committee for a term of one (1) year; one member of the Park Commission for a term of three (3) years; a Road Agent; and any other officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 2. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expense of the General Government, for the Protection of Persons and Property, for Health and Sanitation, for

Highways and Bridges, for support of Town Poor and all other necessary expenditures for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.

ARTICLE 4. To see what action the Town will take regarding the balances of the Special appropriations: New Land 3,000.00; Water main extension (Article 11 - 1962) 138.41; Cross Beach layout 4,285.00; Street Survey 565.00; Planning and Zoning (Tax map, etc.) 3,890.08; Fire Alarm Spec. 1,916.54; Mosquito Control 1,571.50; Police cruiser (Article 12) 1,200.00; Cemetery Road 612.39; River Street 1,000.00; New equipment (Article 16) 8,500.00; New equipment (Article 17) 20,000.00.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to revise the salaries and wages of the Town officials and employees.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept bids for the purchase of a new combination Cruiser-Ambulance for use by the Police Department and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 (One Thousand Dollars) for same.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500 (Three Thousand Five Hundred Dollars) for the purchase of wire, material and labor to extend the Closed Circuit Fire Alarm System.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 8. Upon a petition by Robert A. Beal and twelve others: To see if the Town will vote to install drains on, to grade, and to resurface Dwight Avenue and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to defray the cost of the same.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 9. Upon a petition by Wilbur Fowler, Jr. and nine others: To see if the Town will vote to set the wage of the employees of the Rubbish Department at \$2.00 per hour.

ARTICLE 10. Upon a petition by the Wage and Department Study Committee and Edward F. Goodwin and eleven others:

To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Town Manager Plan as provided in Chapter 37 of the RSA.

This question appears on the Official Ballot of the Town in accordance with the provisions of RSA Chapter 37.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen, effective on the second Tuesday of March 1968, to appoint all permanent and temporary Police Officers, including the Chief of Police; and to hereby rescind any prior vote or practice which provides that said offices will be elected by ballot.

This article inserted upon petition by the Wage and Department study committee and Edward F. Goodwin and eleven others.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen, effective on the Second Tuesday of March 1968, to appoint one or more Highway agents and to hereby rescind any prior vote or practice which provides that Highway agents shall be elected by ballot.

Inserted upon petition by the Wage and Department Study Committee and Edward F. Goodwin and eleven others.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to require the Highway Agents, in addition to his duties as Highway Agent, to have charge, under the direction of the Selectmen, of the collection of waste, rubbish, and garbage, and the care and maintenance of public dumps, parks, cemeteries, beaches, forests, playgrounds, and shade and ornamental trees; and to hereby rescind any and all votes or practices which provide that said duties shall be in the charge of any other

officials, elected or appointed; and to hereby abolish the offices of such officials.

Inserted upon petition by the Wage and Government Study Committee and Edward F. Goodwin and eleven others.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund to be known as the "Fire Department Equipment Fund", said fund to be used for the purchase of equipment for the Seabrook Fire Department; and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000 to be deposited in said Fund and expended in accordance with the purposes thereof.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$7,000, said amount being a portion of the amounts raised and appropriated pursuant to Article 16 and 17 of the Town Warrant, for 1966, to be deposited in the Fire Department Equipment Fund and expended in accordance with the purposes thereof, in lieu of purchasing a new Chassis to replace the Chassis on F.D. Combination 2, and purchasing and installing a new front end pump on said chassis and transferring the present body from Combination 2 to said chassis.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,200 for the purpose of paying the balance due on the 1966 Test Well investigation and for the purpose of continuing the Test Well

investigation and further improvement of the Town Water system as recommended by Whitman and Howard, Inc. engineers, and the State of New Hampshire Department of Public Health and Welfare.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to release any and all interest in and unto the land and buildings owned by the Baptist Church Society of Seabrook in consideration of a release from any duties and /or liabilities of the Town in relation to said land and buildings, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to execute any and all deeds, agreements or other documents necessary to accomplish the same.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to continue the program to commemorate the Bicentennial Anniversary of the 1768 Incorporation of the Town of Seabrook and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,500 for the purpose of defraying the cost of same.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 19. To hear the report of the Wage and Department Study Committee and to act thereon.

ARTICLE 20. To hear the report of the Planning Board and to act thereon.

ARTICLE 21. To transact all other business that legally may come before said meeting.

ADJOURNED TOWN MEETING

MARCH 11, 1966

Adjourned Town Meeting called to order by Moderator Richard L. Holloway at 7:08 P.M., March 11, 1966 in Passaconaway Hall, Seabrook Firemen's Association Building.

Salute to the Flag led by Moderator.
Invocation by Mr. Reel, Pastor, Church of Christ.
Moderator inquired whether there were any visitors and requested that if there were, that they would occupy one section of the hall.
Moderator inquired if Meeting wished to limit debate. Since there was no dissenting voice, the Moderator ruled unlimited time for debate providing it is confined to the question on the floor.

ARTICLE 5 read by the Moderator - Revision of salaries and wages. Motion by Peter Randall, second by Frederick Felch, that we temporarily pass over Article 5 and proceed to Article 27.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 27 read by the Moderator: - Report of Wage and Department Study Committee.

Report given by Committee Chairman Edward F. Goodwin.

Motion by Salvatore Rubera, second by Peter Randall, to accept the
report as having been read by Edward F. Goodwin.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 5 reread by the Moderator.

Motion by George A. Weare, Jr., second by James S. Eaton, that action on Article 5 be postponed indefinitely.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 6 read by the Moderator: - Budget.

Motion by George A. Weare, Jr., second by James S. Eaton, that Article 6 be postponed until all other Articles are acted on.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 7 read by the Moderator: - To borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.

Motion by Frederick B. Felch, second by Douglas H. Perkins, that Article 7 be adopted as read.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 8 read by the Moderator: - Action regarding Balances of Special Appropriations.

Motion by Emery N. Eaton, second by Merle D. Straw, Jr., that all balances specified be used for the purposes stated.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 9 read by the Moderator: - Raise and appropriate \$12,200. to pay balance due on 1965 Test Well Investigation and for purpose of continuing the Test Well Investigation and further improvement of the Town Water System as recommended by Whitman & Howard, Inc., Engineers, and the State of New Hampshire Department of Public Health and Welfare.

Motion by James S. Eaton, second by George A. Weare, Jr., that Article 9 be adopted as read and that the sum of \$12,200. be raised and appropriated for the purpose stated.

Motion carried. Yes - 59 No - 0

ARTICLE 10 read by the Moderator: - "Raise and appropriate \$941.80 for purpose of paying to Roger A. Payeur the balance due on the contract for painting the water tower."

Motion by James S. Eaton, second by George A. Weare, Jr., that Article 10 be adopted as read and that the sum of \$941.80 be raised and appropriated.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 11 read by the Moderator: - "Raise and appropriate \$5,000. for the purpose of continuing the Tax Mapping Program and the Master Plan of the Town of Seabrook."

Motion by Emery N. Eaton, second by Frederick B. Felch, that Article 11 be acted on just prior to Article 6.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 12 read by the Moderator: - "Cruiser-ambulance - bids "Raise and appropriate \$1,200."

Motion by John LeClair, second by Charles H. Felch, that Article 12 be accepted as read and that the sum of \$1,200. be raised and appropriated.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 13 read by the Moderator: - "Purchase truck and load packer at a cost not to exceed \$14,500."

Motion by George A. Weare, Jr., second by Peter Randall, that Article 13 be accepted as read.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 14 read by the Moderator: - "Purchase dump truck at a cost not to exceed \$7,000."

Motion by James S. Eaton, second by George A. Weare, Jr., that Article 14 be accepted as read.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 15 read by the Moderator: - "To see if the Town ... will vote to purchase a new Chassis to replace the Chassis on F.D. Combination 2, to purchase and install a new Front End Pump on the new Chassis and to transfer the present body from Combination 2 to the new Chassis at a cost not to exceed \$7,000. and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept bids for purchase of same."

Motion by John LeClair, second by Frederick B. Felch, that Article 15 be accepted as read.

Motion by Frederick B. Felch, second by James S. Eaton, to amend motion that words "Front End" be deleted and that the Article read "---- and install New Pump on the new Chassis ----."

Henry Kendrick stated that if this Article should go through, he wondered if the people would also give the Board of Engineers and the Selectmen the privilege of accepting a donation making it possible instead of an exchange, to get a complete outfit with tank and everything and to sell the old one as is.

Moderator stated there is an amendment on the floor but the Chair would entertain a resolution after we have completed the Article and the resolution may have a bearing on Article 15.

James S. Eaton asked Kendrick how much more money will be needed to buy the thing complete.

Kendrick stated a complete tank truck from the factory would cost about \$14,500, but we can get a built one around here complete, tank and everything for possibly \$9,500. Stated he had been asked if he would accept a \$2,500 donation to complete it and the sale of the old truck would be added to it.

James S. Eaton stated that it would actually cost \$11,000.

Kendrick stated that it would.

Emery N. Eaton asked Kendrick if the \$2,500. donation is a Bona Fide donation.

Kendrick stated that he didn't know - that it might not even exist.

Emery N. Eaton stated "We don't want to vote on something we don't know about."

Kendrick agreed.

Moderator stated that was why he asked for it as a Resolution. Stated a Resolution can be submitted and then if it doesn't work out then the Resolution can be disregarded.

Moderator read the Amendment. Amendment carried.

Moderator read Motion as amended.

Motion as amended carried.

Moderator stated he would now accept a Resolution.

Kendrick stated that he felt if the Article went through and \$2,500. was made available could we accept \$2,500. if donated. Moderator stated we could accept it if the Body votes it.

Kendrick offered a Resolution that if a donation of \$2,500. is made available to the Fire Department to help purchase a new complete truck with body that it be accepted.

Resolution accepted.

Moderator stated it was entirely up to the Selectmen and Board of Engineers whether this be accepted and placed as part of the payment of the equipment.

Emery N. Eaton stated that if he understood Mr. Kendrick, this equipment would not cost over \$7,000. regardless.

Kendrick stated that this is not so.

Emery N. Eaton stated that in other words, Kendrick wants to increase this figure to \$7,000. plus any gift that he might get. Kendrick stated that he wants the \$7,000. because, provided we get no donation whatsoever, it is going to cost \$7,000. to change over - that's using this tank down here which is quite old - and if we get a donation there will be a tank built on it and it will be a complete new unit

Emery N. Eaton stated Kendrick is setting a figure of \$7,000. and now he's paving the way where \$9,500 can be spent.

Moderator stated it is only a Resolution. It doesn't have to be accepted by the Board unless the Board can work it out. Stated it must be understood by the Body that the Resolution effects the Article only insofar as can be worked out by the Selectmen and the Fire Chief. If nothing can be worked out, the Article as voted will stand. Asked Emery N. Eaton if that was clear. Emery N. Eaton stated that it was clear.

During the year 111,838,520 gallons of water were pumped, showing a decrease of 2,198,800 gallons from the previous year, of this total, 22,587,800 gallons were used by industrial and commercial users.

40 new services were installed. 400 feet of six inch main was installed on Adams Avenue. Two eight inch sleeves were installed and tapped on New Zealand Road for Factory and Housing sites. Twelve services were repaired or replaced.

The Telemetering system has been put into operation and is functioning nicely. With this system the pumps may be operated from the Town Office if required. In case of malfunction of the pumps, or if a large pressure drop occurs a visual signal will be indicated at the Town Office and will also sound an audio alarm in the Fire Station.

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1966, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court, Trustees of Trust Funds, Special Water Account and Bi-Centennial Account.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1965 - December 31, 1966: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1965 and December 31, 1966, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt increased by \$73,057.53 in 1966.

AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made up from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$22,557.53, from \$41,876.48 to \$19,318.95 in 1966, as shown herewith:
