You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Springfield on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Budget Committee.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money on the notes of the Town in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to allow a one and one-half percent discount on taxes paid within thirty days after tax mailingdate.
- 6. To see what the Town will vote to do about new equipment and make motions thereto.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of \$25.00 (twenty-five dollars) for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of a fire truck and equipment.
- 9. To see what the Town wishes to do about the public beach and make any vote pertaining thereto.
- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

The 1964 forest fire season surpassed the record year of 1963 in both length and severity. For the second successive year, we experienced a rainfall deficiency of more than ten inches and the compounding of such drought conditions, together with the many days of strong, dry winds, characterized 1964 as one of the most hazardous years in the past half century. Although our fire season was three weeks longer than that of 1963, the number of fires showed only a slight increase and more remarkable was the fact that the area burned dropped from 2280 acres in 1963 to 900 acres in 1964. Early detection and rapid response kept many potential fire disasters from becoming reality. We all owe a debt of gratitude to the men in this community who responded and fought our fires so efficiently. Our state is now 86% wooded and its economy - both industrial and recreational - is greatly dependent on this forest resource. The responsibility for adequate fire protection of this great area - 4,350,000 acres - is everyone's responsibility and prevention is one of our most effective tools.

Prevention is good common sense.

- 1. Take your rubbish to the town dump. If you must burn, obtain a permit and watch your fire until it is dead out.
- 2. Instruct your children in fire safety. Keep matches from young children. Explain to them the dangers of lighting matches and making outdoor fires.
- 3. Be sure discarded smoking material and matches are out.

A major portion of our preventable fires this year are chargeable to three causes: (1) permit fires allowed to escape; (2) children playing with matches; and (3) smokers. Let's be mindful of the fact that all such fires endanger property and lives.

We wish to thank you for your fine cooperation during the past fire season and with your continued cooperation we are confident that we can improve our fire record in 1965.

Report of the Superintendent of Schools

To the Citizens of Springfield:

ENROLLMENT

The enrollment as of January 1, 1965 was 25, divided as follows:

Primary Room (Grades 1-3) - 12 Upper Room (Grades 4-6) - 13 This is a decrease of four students over last year and is an alltime low for Memorial School.

Thirteen are attending high school and twelve are enrolled in grades 7 and 8 at New London. There is one student in grade 8 attending Mascoma Regional School.

SCHOOL COSTS

The high school tuition charge at New London of \$490.00 remains the same as this year. The elementary rate will increase from \$275.00 to \$300.00 per pupil. In contrast to the \$300.00 per pupil charge at New London fon students in grades 7 and 8, the cost of operating Memorial School for last year - 1963-64 - was \$495.24 per pupil due to the very low pupil-teacher ratio.

TRANSPORTATION

New three-year contracts for the bus routes within Springfield are in effect this year.

Elmer Butcher is again operating the Morgan and Sanborn Hill routes. Hollis Heath replaced Mrs. Nellie Stowell as the carrier for the Turnpike route.

SWEEPSTAKE REVENUE

On December 15, 1964, Springfield received its share of the proceeds from the New Hampshire Sweepstakes Act. This amounted to \$1,449.43. \$1,800.00 has been estimated as the amount that will be received in 1965. This added revenue from state sources has been used to reduce the amount of money to be raised locally for school purposes.

AREA SCHOOL STUDY COMMITTEE

Springfield will be one of five school Districts (Newbury, Sutton, Wilmot, and New London) carrying an Article in the 1965 School Warrant to consider setting up an AREA School Study Committee. Each District adopting such an Article would have three representatives - one of whom must be a School Board memberon a committee that would study both the AREA and the Co-operative School Plan. This would be a Study Committee only. At a later date a report would be submitted to the people in each School District for their consideration.

These towns are now sending high school students to New London and several of them - Springfield and Newbury - are also sending students in grades 7 and 8.

STAFF

Mrs. Marilyn Heath is again teaching grades 4-6 and Mrs. Yvonne Kezar is teaching grades 1-3.
