CONTRACT.

Every person taking water thereby consents to the following regulations, and agrees to be bound by them and such other regulations as the Selectmen and Superintendent may hereafter establish.

APPLICATION.

All persons desiring to take water shall make application to the Superintendent, stating fully and truly all the purposes for which it is to be used; and should additional use at any time be required the person requiring the same must notify the Superintendent before such additional use will be allowed.

SERVICE PIPES.

The town will furnish a coporation with a stop, from the main pipe. All service pipe must be provided and maintained by the person supplied with water.

Persons taking water must keep their own water pipes and fixtures connected therewith in good repair and protected from the frost at their own expense. They must provide a stop and waste cock, to be properly located inside the building and have the pipes so arranged that the water can be drawn from them whenever and wherever there is danger of freezing.

USE OF WATER.

The water at sinks and all other places must not be left running to prevent the water in the pipes freezing, or for any other purpose; and all unnecessary waste of water must be prevented. No owner or tenant will be allowed to supply water to other persons or families, and if found so doing the supply will be stopped and the water rent already paid forfeited.

Inspections.

The Superintendent must have free access at all proper times to all parts of the premises where water is delivered and consumed.

STOPPAGE.

No person shall open or close any public fountain, hydrant, stop cock, water gate, blow off or air vent, attached to any water pipe belonging to the town except by permission of the Superintendent. Provided, however that this shall not apply to firemen while in the proper discharge of their duties as such.

The town reserves the right to shut off the water for making repairs, extensions or other purposes, without notice, and no person shall be entitled to damages by reason of such action of the town.

BILLS PAYABLE, WHEN

All water bills may be payable sequi-annually in advance, to the Superintendent on the first day of June and Dec.

If water rents be not paid within fifteen days after they become due, the flow of water may be cut off, and one dollar will be charged for turning it on again.

Water rents will commence when service is laid.

At the March election '95, the town anthorized the Selectmen to increase the water supply of the Belmont Aqueduct Co. at any time, in their judgment, the supply was not equal to the demand, also to build a hose house and author-

ized them to borrow \$2000.00 at a rate not exceeding 5 per cent for that purpose.

The water works job has been completed at an expense of \$1470.31. The well has been tested for eight hours with a steam pump which drew thirty gallons per minute and failed to exhaust the supply.

The cost of the water works is-

Bonded debt \$9900.00 Expended in 1895, 1470.31

\$11370.31

The hose house is not completed, but when completed it will be occupied by the fire apparatus at a saving of twenty-five dollars per year, also by the Library at a saving of fifty dollars per year rent.

SCHOOL REPORT.

TO THE INHABITANTS OF BELMONT SCHOOL DISTRICT.

The School Board submit a report.

The Schools in the district have been in session twentytwo weeks and with another winter term of twelve weeks would have been very profitable to the children, but we doubt if such is the case under the circumstances.

The Teachers have labored concientiously to advance the interests of their several schools, and had all the parents the same interest and concern for the education of their children, we would as a town be in the front ranks of progress instead of so woefully behind as at present.

By a recent act of the Legislature, the school year now begins in September and reports should be made in August. As you will see, more money must be raised this spring than usual in order to have a summer term of school.

As an act of justice and right, the pay of some teachers has been raised and and we have no cause to regret the action. And shall persue the policy of employing good teachers at reasonable salarys.

We have heard some complaint in conversation with various people, and it is not wholly new, that the schools in the village receive more than their share of the appropriated money. This is a mistaken idea, and in order to show just what each school receives and how much per capita, we give the financial report by schools.

BELMONT TOWN REPORT.

We would recommend an appropriation of two-thousand dollars which will give you a school of thirty-six weeks in the year. The school buildings are all insured for one year except the Village for three years. They are in good condition except the Union and Clay, which should be reseated and painted inside etc. and we would recommend an appropriation of two hundred dollars for the purpose of repairs.
