TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Benton qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Building in said Benton on the second Tuesday of March next (the 10th) at seven thirty o'clock in the afternoon to vote and act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk; one Selectman for a term of three years; one Treasurer; one Tax Collector; one Highway Agent; one Trustee of Trust Funds for a Term of three years; one Sexton; one Auditor; and all other necessary Town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$154.17 as the Town's share for construction of highways (Town Road Aid) as provided in Chapter 241 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended.
- Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$43.18 for the White Mountains Region Association.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to help subsidize ambulance service in our area with such funds to be administered by the Trustees of the Cottage Hospital.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for support of the White Mountain Community Services, Inc. program of non-profit community mental health.
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow as much as \$6,000 in long-term notes, repayable over a period of three years, to rebuild the paved portion of Howe Hill Road.

- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to make any alterations in the amount of money to be raised and appropriated for the ensuing year as recommended in the budget, and vote to raise and appropriate all sums so determined.
- Article 8. To hear the reports of officers and agents and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Representative to the General Court to sponsor legislation leading to reclassification of the state-maintained section of Tunnel Stream Road from state to town control, providing the state will improve the section to Town Road Aid standards at no cost to the Town.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to establish a a Planning Board of five members with duties as set forth in Sections 1-15, Chapter 36, Revised Statutes Annotated, 1955, to make a study of the Town's development and report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board shall consist of one Selectman and four other citizens appointed by the Selectmen.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for current indebtedness of the Town during the ensuing year in anticipation of taxes to be collected for the year 1970 and to be paid therefrom.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize a discount on property taxes paid before a date set by the Selectmen and to set the amount of said discount.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Building in said district on the 10th day of March, 1970, at 8:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of other officers or agents of the district.
- 6. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the bal-

- ance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for, and to receive, in the name of the District such advances, grants-in-aid, or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government and/or State of New Hampshire.

I herewith submit my fifth annual report for the Benton School District.

Last year the pupil enrollment of Benton students attending school in the Haverhill Cooperative School District was thirty-one. For 1970-71 we estimate our student population to grow to an enrollment of thirty-nine students. In the future high school graduates should offset new elementary school children thus keeping our tuition increases at a minimum.

Tuition charges are becoming a burden on sending districts and in Benton this represents a major share of the school budget.

May I take this opportunity to thank the Benton School Board and taxpayers for their fine support during the past year.

SUPERVISORY UNION #23 REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent.

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union #23, during 1969-1970, will receive a salary of \$16,000.00, which is made up as follows: \$3,000.00 to be paid by the State Department of Education and \$13,000.00 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1,500.00 for travel within the Union is also prorated as stated above.
