

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Chesterfield in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chesterfield on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at 6:30 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects: (Polls will open at 3 P.M.)

Article 1. To vote by Australian Ballot for all necessary Town Officers.

Article 2. To determine the method of collecting taxes for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 4. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums of money for:

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to have the annual audit of its accounts for the year 1961 made by the Division of Municipal Accounting of the State Tax Commission, and to make an appropriation to cover the cost of the audit.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 for street lighting.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$238.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region.

Article 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$536.00 as its fair share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,139.21 for Town Road Aid, thereby receiving an additional \$7,594.76 from the State.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$9,000.00 for Winter Maintenance of Roads.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the repair and upkeep of Highway Equipment.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,000.00 for Summer Road Maintenance.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 to continue the so-called Long Range Program on our Town Highways, the location of the work to be under the supervision of the Selectmen. (Approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to open the road leading from West Chesterfield to Cobleigh Corner and appropriate the sum of \$6,500.00 to be used with the Capital Reserve Fund of \$2,500.00 appropriated in 1960, to construct a sectional pipe arch to replace the bridge on said road; \$2,-500.00 to be raised this year and the balance in long term notes for two years. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$650.00 for drainage and blacktop surface on the road leading from the Atherton Hill Road a distance of 550 feet past the Fritz Richter, Sr. property known as the "Erbhof." (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for drainage and black top surface on Welcome Hill Road, beginning where the present reconstruction ends and continuing up the hill as far as the appropriation will permit. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum, not to exceed \$1,000.00, to improve by drainage and black top surface the section of the so-called Maple Road from Route No. 9 to Route No. 9A. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to allocate the Town Road Aid money to continue the improvement of and/or reconstruction of the Old Westmoreland Road to the Westmoreland Town Line or as far as the funds will extend such improvement.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light at the west end of Maple Lane where it connects with Route No. 9, and to raise \$25.00 to pay for same. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 21. To see if the Town will provide street lights on Route 63, south from the last existing light opposite the Chesterfield lnn, these lights to be placed at reasonable intervals and especially at the corners near the Town Garage, the road leading to the Frank Hubner and the James O'Neil properties and the road leading to the Grout-Mitchener and the Gordon Kendall properties. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light at the intersection of Maple Road and Route No. 9A, and to raise the sum of \$25.00 to pay for the same. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning and Building Regulations of the Town of Chesterfield as provided by Article 7 thereof by deleting Article 1 thereof and adding in place thereof the following:

#### ARTICLE 1

For the purpose of these Zoning and Building Regulations, the Town of Chesterfield is divided into two districts as follows: (1) Residential District No. 1, namely all lands to a depth of five hundred feet on each side, from the center line of all paved Public Roads and Highways in existence within the Town of Chesterfield and any additional roads that may be hereafter paved; (2) Residential District No. 2, all other lands within the Town of Chesterfield.

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning and Building Regulations of the Town of Chesterfield as provided by Article 7 thereof by amending Article 2A to read as follows:

#### ARTICLE 2

Section A. Every dwellinghouse or camp to be established in Residential District No. 1, specified in Article 1, shall have a minimum ground floor area of six hundred square feet, approximately 20x30 feet, for each family unit, and shall be placed on a permanent foundation or continuous supporting wall of masonry, masonry units, concrete or other similar materials, extending at least 3 feet below normal ground level.

Exception: This provision shall not effect motels or cabins, used for guests staying overnight or by the week, and cottages not used the year around.

Section A1. The minimum land area for each dwelling shall not be less than 20,000 square feet with a frontage of no less than 100 feet.

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning and Building Regulations of the Town of Chesterfield as provided in Article 7 thereof by adding the following sections or regulations pertaining to trailers and Trailer or Mobile Home Parks.

#### ARTICLE 2

Provisions: Applicable only to District No. 1 unless otherwise so specified in the section.

Section K. Trailer Parks or Mobile Home Parks will be permitted in Residential District No. 2, and shall conform to the following specifications:

1. None shall be smaller than (5) acres or larger than (10) acres in size.

2. The individual lots within the Park shall be no less than  $40 \ge 60$  feet in size.

3. The Parks must be screened on the two sides and the rear by a vegetative buffer 20 feet wide, composed of trees or shrubs or a combination of both.

4. All Trailer and Mobile Home Parks shall meet the

minimum standards of sanitation as set forth by the New Hampshire State Department of Health.

Section L. A single Trailer or Mobile Home may be located anywhere in the Town provided it meets the minimum standards as follows:

1. It shall be located on a lot with a minimum of 10,000 square feet, with a 100 foot frontage.

2. It must be placed on a permanent foundation or continuous supporting wall of masonry, masonry units, concrete or other similar materials, extending at least 3 feet below normal ground level.

3. It shall conform to the minimum standards of sanitation as set forth by the New Hampshire State Department of Health.

4. Such Trailers and Mobile Homes shall be considered buildings or dwellings within the terms of this ordinance.

Section M. The temporary parking of a single trailer or mobile home outside a trailer or Moible Home Park, or their use as temporary living quarters within the Town shall be permitted for a period of not more than 30 days in any one year.

#### Definitions

A trailer, trailer coach or mobile home, within the terms of these regulations, means any vehicle or similar portable structure used for sleeping or living purposes.

A mobile home or trailer park is land upon which two or more mobile homes or trailers are parked and occupied for living purposes, regardless whether or not a charge is made for such accommodations.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for maintaining the Civil Defense unit and the procurement of small items that become available under surplus. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 to establish a Civil Defense Headquarters by renovating the old wood shed at the Town Hall into a completed room. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for the purchase of First Aid Equipment to be used by Civil Defense and the Town in any emergency. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for two 5000 watt portable gasoline generators for West Chesterfield and Spofford and one 10,000 watt unit for Chesterfield to be used by Civil Defense and the Town in any emergency. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$702.00 for three Gouset radios for Civil Defense. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for equipment of a Civil Defense Auxiliary Police Force. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to adopt a card and sticker system for taxpayers and bona fide guests for controlling the use of all entrances to Spofford Lake.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to post signs at the two public entrances to Spofford Lake prohibiting pienicking, dogs not on leash, car washing and disrobing.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.00 from the Carl F. Carlson Estate; this sum to be added to the Byard-Chickering Trust Fund, and the income from same to be used for the perpetual care and maintenance of the Byard-Chickering burial lot in the Chesterfield West Cemetery, and to be known hereafter as the Byard-Chickering-Carlson Trust fund.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$150.00 from the Madeline D. Allen Estate, the income from same to be paid to C.W.C.A., for the care and upkeep of the Raymond D. Allen Lot No. 67 in Chesterfield West Cemetary.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.00 from Hattie Pond, to be known as the Charlie Pond Trust Fund, the income to be paid to C.W.C.A. for the perpetual care and upkeep of the Charlie Pond Lot in Chesterfield West Cemetery.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from William & Elizabeth Johnson, to be known as the Oramel Holden-Day Trust Fund, for the perpetual care of the north-west corner lot in the Robertson burial ground.

Article 36. To hear reports of Standing Committees and act thereon.

Article 37. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

## TOWN MEETING, 1960

Proceedings of the Annual Meeting of the voters of the Town of Chesterfield, New Hampshire, called at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, March 8, 1960.

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, James E. O'Neil, at nine o'clock in the forenoon and the Warrant through Article 1 was read by him. He then declared the polls open for balloting for all necessary Town Officers.

At ten o'clock the Moderator called the meeting to order, Norman L. Amidon and Mildred W. Gauthicr took over their duties as Assistant Moderator and Assistant Clerk respectively and the rest of the Warrant was read by the Clerk. The Articles of the Warrant were then disposed of as follows:

Article 2. Voted by voice vote on motion made by F. Stratton Morse and supported by Waldemar Sherwin that the method of collecting taxes for the ensuing year be the same as for last year. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 3. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Arvid W. Pearson that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 4. Robert D. Smith, Chairman, reporting for the Budget Committee, stated that their report was given in the Annual Town Report on pages 18 to 21, that the Committee had been increased by three members. They held three regular meetings and although the Public Meeting was well attended there was not too much discussion on the money to be spent by the Town. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Joslin and supported by Winston Cray to accept the report of the Budget Committee. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 5. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Winston Cray and supported by Arvid Pearson that in Item 7 of Article 5 the sum of \$700 be earmarked for a Civilian Defense Fire truck. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by George Marrow to delete \$500. from care of cemeteries and add \$200. to Town Officers Expenses. The Moderator declared the vote carried in the negative and therefore did not pass.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry E. Winn and supported by Clifford E. Chickering that Article 22 be taken up before voting on Article 5. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 22. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry E. Winn and supported by Paul E. Welcome to accept the sum of \$15,268.31 from the Etta L. Hubbard Trust, said Trust to be deposited with the Trustees of Trust Funds, the income to be paid yearly on May 1st. to the Town for the care and upkeep of Town Cemeteries. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 5. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Harry Winn, to amend the Article and to delete from the Article's list of appropriations No. 18, for \$500.00 for care of cemeteries. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on the Article as amended to raise and appropriate the following sums of money:

Article 6. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Winford Chickering to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,300.00 for street lighting. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 7. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul M. Penning and supported by Winston Cray to raise and appropriate the sum of \$232.00 (1/00th of 1% of the valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire, for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspapers and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty seven towns of the Monadnock Region. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 8. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Paul Welcome to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 as approved by the Budget Committee as the Town's fair share of the operating cost of the Elliot Community Hospital. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 9. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Genevieve Thomas to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,144.58 for Town Road Aid, thereby receiving an additional \$7,630.53 from the State. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 10. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Susan Fleisher and supported by Dexter Thomas to raise the sum of \$9,000.00 for Winter Maintenance of Roads. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 11. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Winston Gray and supported by George Marrow to table Article 11 until after taking up Article 16. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carrier in the affirmative.

Article 16. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Donald Moore to amend the article and recommend that the old truck be traded in as part payment on the new one. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Winford Chickering and supported by Fred Korradi on the Article as amended, To raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$6,000.00 to buy a new dump truck, \$1,000.00 of the cost to be raised by 1960 taxes, and the balance to be paid in 5 yearly payments, on long term notes and recommend that the old truck be traded in as part payment on the new one. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affimative.

Article 11. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Winford Chickering and supported by Richard Goodell to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 as approved by the Budget Committee for the repair and upkeep of highway Equipment. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 12. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Clif-

ford Chickering and supported by Harry E. Winn to amend the Article and earmark \$4,000.00 for maintenance on tarred roads. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by H. Claude Mowry to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,000.00 for Summer Road Maintenance, earmarking \$4,000.00 of this sum for maintenance on tarred roads. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 13. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Clifford Chickering to appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for permanent road improvements with the recommendation it be spent on the Harlan Fiske Stone Memorial Drive. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. This vote was challenged by Susan Fleisher and the Moderator called for a show of hands with two of the Selectmen, Winston Cray and George Joslin to count. This resulted in Yes 38, No 19 out of a total of 57 voting. The Moderator declared the vote carried in the affirmative.

Article 14. Voted by voice vote on motion made by William Mitchell and supported by Clifford Chickering to raise the sum of \$2,500.00 to make up for the deficiency caused by the overdraft of 1959 appropriations. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 15. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Otto S. Schlichting and supported by Carl Johnson to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 to replace the present wooden bridge over the Gulf Brook, at the lower end of the Gulf Road, with a sectional plate pipe arch. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 17. Voted by voice vote on motion made by William Mitchell and supported by Lawrence Chickering to raise the sum of \$600.00 to purchase a new truck snow plow. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 18. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Barrett and supported by Laura Atema to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for drainage and black top surface on Welcome Hill Road, beginning at its intersection with Route 9 and continuing up the hill as far as the appropriation will permit. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 19. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Anna Hubner to amend the article to read \$2,000.00 instead of \$2,500.00. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Voted by voice vote on Article as amended, To raise and appropriate a sum, not to exceed \$2,000.00 to improve and surface with tar, the West Swanzey Road and the bend of the Tuttle Road, beginning at State Highway No. 9 and ending 500 feet from the West Swanzey Road on the Tuttle Road. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 20. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Joslin and supported by Lawrence O'Kelly to tar the Street from Route 9, opposite the store of John N. Ball, to High Street and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the same. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 21. A motion made by Paul Welcome and supported by Harry Winn to accept the Article as read was withdrawn by both.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Welcome and supported by Anna Hubner to pass over the Article. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. This vote was challenged and a vote by show of hands resulted in Yes 45, No. 48. The Moderator declared the motion carried in the negative.

Voted by paper ballot on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Marjorie Stoddard to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for reconstruction of the bridge in West Chesterfield. This ballot resulted as follows:

The Moderator declared the vote carried in the affirmative.

To the inhabitants of the school district in the town of Chesterfield qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the school in said district on the 11th day of March, 1961 at 3 o'clock in the afternoon to bring in your votes for the election of the following officials: (Polls will open at 3 P.M. and close not earlier than 9 P.M.)

 A moderator for the coming year. A clerk for the ensuing year. A member of the school board for the ensuing three years. A treasurer for the ensuing year. Two auditors for the ensuing year.

You are hereby further notified to meet at the School at 8 P.M. on March 11, 1961 to take up the following:

2. To determine and appoint the salaries of school board members and the truant officer, and to fix the compensation of any other officer or agents of the district.

3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To choose agents, auditors and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

5. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers, auditors and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of any sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

6. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to enter into tuition contracts with the Keene School District for tuition at Keene High School at the rate of \$515. per pupil, and the Brattleboro School District for tuition at Brattleboro High School at the rate of \$641. per pupil or any other approved high school.

7. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) as its share of Supervisory Union contribution to the N. H. Educational Television Channel WENH.

8. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600) as matching funds for funds available under provision of the National Defense Education Act and to authorize the School Board to accept and use, in the name of the district, any Federal funds for public school education.

9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate two thousand, six hundred sixty-six dollars and forty cents (\$2,666.40) to be made available prior to June 30, 1961 as a deficit appropriation for teacher's salary caused by the employment of a part-time teacher to assist with the heavy pupil enrollment during the present school year.

10. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT TO CHESTERFIELD SCHOOL DISTRICT

It is a pleasure to write my second annual report to the citizens of Chesterfield as Superintendent of Schools.

Our teaching staff has remained the same except for the replacement of Mr. William Carey, who resigned to accept another position. Mr. Carey was replaced by Mr. Alan P. Steenbergen in January of 1960. It is safe to say that a fast rate of turn-over of teachers, slows down educational progress and sometimes shows discontentment within our school. I am glad we have a low turn-over rate.

The role of education grows in its importance to the preservation of freedom and the maintenance of our democratic institutions. At the same time, throughout the nation, we are confronted with many problems which bear on education and must be solved. To do less is to invite disaster. The challenge belongs to every citizen. It cannot be shrugged off. Every citizen needs to understand the pressures which are being exerted on school systems everywhere. Most of these pressures resolve around the need for adequate financing, adequate school facilities, additional school construction, adequate supply of good teachers and equal opportunities for all youth. In the face of this it is mandatory for every citizen to concern himself with education, if we are to keep the quality of our program and maintain the good product. The understanding of the role of education and the need for continuing to support it adequately is of great importance in our fast moving world today.

Realizing that the best in education is "none too good" for the citizens of tomorrow, the school must work conscientiously to maintain the best possible educational program. Although much has been done in the past, we realize that a great deal remains to be done because education is a continual process. My immediate concern deals with the future of our high school boys and girls plus the ever-increasing enrollments in our elementary grades. To be ready for tomorrow depends on how we treat the problems which are now in focus for all of us to see.

I sincerely feel that the citizens of Chesterfield will continue to give their support, efforts and energy to find a solution to our immediate problems.

# CHESTERFIELD LUNCH PROGRAM REPORT

July 1, 1959-June 30, 1960

The Hot Lunch Program opened September 9th, 1959. with the school enrollment of 233 children. Each day we average from 160-180 balanced meals.

The rate of reimbursement from Federal Funds remained at 5c for each Type A meal. Under the Special Milk Program we received 4c reimbursement for each  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint of milk served.

Menus are made up in advance for the entire month and copies are given to each child and teacher, thus the parents know what the children are eating each day.

At the beginning of each term the first graders are served small quantities of food with the understanding to try everything. If more is wanted they can return for seconds. It is wonderful to see how quickly they learn and the good appetites they have.

We are very fortunate to receive Government Surplus Commodities also a generous supply of eating apples and apples for salads from one of our good neighbors. Due to the high cost of living we are trying our best to keep the charge for lunches at the present rate of 25c a day. If, for any reason such help should be discontinued, or prices of food rise higher, the meal charges would have to be raised somewhat.

In serving our Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners in which all the children and School Staff participated, we had the extra help of Mrs. Valerie MacKerron and Mrs. Elli Herrick.

I wish to thank the town folks of Chesterfield for granting the program \$150. We have received several dozen of knives, forks, spoons, plates, soup bowls and cups plus 5 baking pans.

I wish to express my sincere thanks to our Principal, Mr. Alan Steenbergen, and the teachers, Mrs. Inez Houghton, my assistant, and Mr. Allen MacKerron, our custodian. Thanks to our School Board members and our Superintendent of Schools, Mr. Paul L. Clark, for their help and cooperation in making the Hot Lunch Program a success.

The following surplus commodities from the government were were received during the school period.

Butter, powdered milk, frozen ground pork, flour, processed cheese, peas, turkeys, cherries, peaches, corn, green beans, apple streudel, peanut butter, tomatoes, plums, dried eggs, tomato paste, apple sauce, sliced apples, ground hamburg, tins of pork in gravy, and grapefruit sections.

# **REPORT OF PRINCIPAL**

To the Superintendent of Schools:

September found the Chesterfield School swelled with an enrollment of 250 students. This is an increment in the student body equal to that of a small class. Some classes reached forty.

As the wheels of education were slowly grinding out knowledge, the three R's were held foremost in our minds. With the mobility of the American family today, education must reach far beyond the local community needs. Many children educated here will one day live in other parts of our country.

Few schools have a professional staff that works as well together as the present faculty of the Chesterfield School. Their dedication to better education has exemplified itself on more than one occasion. Good teachers, coupled with years of experience, are the very foundation blocks of any school.

The increased number of students in the lower and upper grades necessitated an additional staff member. Mr. Arthur O'Neil, Jr., joined us last December to fill this position.

In attempting to bridge the vast gap between the large and small school, enriching social life was made part of the year's program. Trips of educational value in the field of science were taken, highlighted by the Science Fair last April.

The upgrading of the physical education program has made a favorable impact on the community.

New school programs, such as the Rifle Club and School Band, have met with a great deal of fine backing by the parents of this area.

On the medical scene, Mrs. Stella Chickering replaced Mrs. Marion Warner as our school nurse, working with Dr. John Houpis to form a health team of the highest caliber.

In the Foods Department, Mrs. Louise Leu and Mrs. Inez Houghton have shown a corresponding increase in service to the now 160-180 average student settings per day. I feel that these figures alone stand as testament to the services performed.

The never ending task of building maintenance and general repair has been the responsibility of Mr. A. Allen Mac-Kerron for the past two years.

There is neither function nor future that could come to pass without the continued individual participation by all the people of this community.

I look forward to serving you another year.

# SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

School District Meeting Chesterfield Central School Chesterfield, New Hampshire March 5, 1960

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, Harry Winn, and the warrant through Article 1 was read by the Clerk.

Article 1. To bring in your votes for the election of the following officials:

A moderator for the coming year

A clerk for the ensuing year

A member of the school board for the ensuing three years

A treasurer for the ensuing year

Two auditors for the ensuing year

The moderator then declared the polls open for balloting by the Australian Ballot for the necessary school district officers. Anna C. Hubner, Mildred Gauthier, and Phyllis Henchey, ballot elerks, appointed by the School Board, took oath of office from moderator Harry Winn. The moderator appointed Otto W. Schlichting assistant moderator. He took the oath of office from the moderator.

At 8:01 p. m. the moderator ealled the meeting to order and the elerk read the remainder of the warrant.

James O'Neil asked permission to introduce Superintendent of Schools, Paul Clark and Alan Steenbergen, principal of Chesterfield Central School. Permission was granted and the introductions made.

Article 2. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board members and the truant officer, and to fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district. James O'Neil moved the adoption of the Article be passed as read. Seconded by Agnes B. Chickering. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Anna C. Hubner presented the report of the committee on high school tuition. The report was read by the clerk.

Agnes B. Chickering moved that the report be accepted and placed on file. Seconded by Edward Somes. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Anna C. Hubner moved that article 6 be taken up at this point. Seconded by Marjorie Hadlock. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to pay tuition to both Brattleboro and Keene, as they have in the past, so that high school students may continue to go to the school of their choice. Arvid Pearson moved that the article be passed as read. Seconded by Ronald Guyette. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 7. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to investigate the tuition rates at Brattleboro and Keene High Schools for 9th grade students from Chesterfield, or any new high school students moving into town, and to enter into contract with the school having the lower rate. Parents will have the privilege of sending their children to either school, provided they pay the difference in the tuition rate. Tuition of students already enrolled in Keene or Brattleboro High Schools will be paid for in full by the district.

Russell Johnson moved that the article be passed over. Seconded by Wm. Mitchell. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 4. To choose agents, auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant. Agnes B. Chickering moved that the article be passed over. Seconded by Fred Korradi. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of the school district officers, auditors and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of any sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

James E. O'Neil moved that the district raise and appropriate the sum of \$120,556.89 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers, anditors and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of any sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Seconded by Edward Somes. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 8. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to enter into tuition contracts with Brattleboro and Keene school districts, or any other approved secondary school district for the education of high school pupils.

James E. O'Neil moved that the article be accepted as read. Seconded by Fred Korradi. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) as its share of Union contribution to the New Hampshire Educational Television Channel WENH.

James O'Neil moved that the article be amended to read \$25.00 instead of \$200.00. Seconded by Winnifred Cray. Motion earried in the affirmative.

Article 10. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600) as matching funds for funds available under provision of the National De-

fense Education Act and to authorize the school board to accept and use, in the name of the district, any Federal funds for public school education or construction.

Agnes B. Chickering moved that the article be passed as read. Seconded by Fred Korradi. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 11. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred and sixty dollars (\$660) to be made available prior to June 30, 1960, as a deficit appropriation for teacher's salary caused by the employment of a part-time teacher to assist with a heavy grade-one enrollment during the present school year.

Raymond Harris moved that the article be passed as read. Seconded by Edward Somes. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 12. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventeen hundred dollars (\$1700) for the development of a drain field for sewage disposal.

Lester H. Chickering moved that the article be passed as read. Carl Johnson seconded the motion. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 13. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to withdraw from the Capital Reserve Fund the sum of twenty-six hundred dollars (\$2600) to be used for the part payment towards the drain field sewage disposal.

Edward Somes moved the article be passed as read. Seconded by George Joslin. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 14. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred and fifty (\$150) for the purchase of dishes for the school lunch program.

Alfred Gatty moved that the article be passed as read. Seconded by Winifred Chickering. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 15. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting. H. Claude Mowry asked temporary leave as clerk to offer the following motion: I move that we recommend to the school board that they have one of their members sit-in on any of the area school discussion groups to enable them to bring to us (the school district meeting) any developments that may be of help in solving our secondary school problems. Seconded by Kenneth Wiggin. Motion carried in the affirmative.

At 10:21 p. m. the meeting was recessed by the moderator.

At 10:22 p. m. the moderator declared the polls closed. A count of the Ballots cast resulted as follows:

For Moderator: Harry Winn had 180 votes, H. Claude Mowry had 3 votes, Agnest B. Chickering had 1 vote, Ronald Guyette had 1 vote, Robert Woodman had 1 vote, Clinton Davis had 1 vote, Alfred Gatty had 1 vote, George Barrett had 1 vote, Kenneth Wiggin had 1 vote, James E. O'Neil had 3 votes, Wm. Mitchell had 1 vote, Arvid Pearson had 1 vote, Harry Winn was declared elected.

For clerk: H. Claude Mowry had 55 votes, Grace Welcome had 3 votes, Imogene Chickering had 4 votes, Anna C. Hubner had 3 votes, Agnes B. Chickering had 2 votes, and the following had 1 vote each: Robert Woodman, William Mitchell, George Barrett, Harry Winn, Otto Schlichting, Joyce Winn, Winston Cray, Dorothy Mowry, Jane Allen, Phyllis Henchey, Henry Chickering, Barbara Hall, Monique Fisher, Audrey Ericson, Avis Gauthier, George Joslin, Carl Johnson and Mildred Gauthier. H. Claude Mowry was declared elected.

YOU can put an end to this shameful wastel PRE-VENTION is YOUR business!

YOU, whether YOU be a farmer, homemaker, business or professional man or woman, municipal, state or federal official, clerk or woodsman can play an important part in the continuing and vital prevention program.

First — by setting a good example YOURSELF — being sensible and complying with the necessary laws and regulations governing the use of fire in and near woodlands.

Second — by using YOUR individual influence in your community and valued council with others in insisting and encouraging them to do likewise.

The following simple rules may be used as a guide both for YOU and for them.

- 1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden the law requires it.
- 2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning don't leave it.
- 3. Make certain your fire, camp or debris, is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
- Don't throw down lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes or from moving vehicles — make sure they are out — Use your ash tray.
- Don't burn at home use your town dump and save yourself much possible difficulty, both personal and financial.
