#### **TOWN WARRANT**

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Croydon, in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, (polls not to close earlier than 6 o'clock in the afternoon) to act upon the following subjects:

ART. 1. To choose one Selectman for three years, a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector and Highway Agent and two Auditors for one year, one Library Trustee for three years, one Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, and all such Officers and Agents as may be necessary for the transaction of the Town's business for the ensuing year.

ART. 2. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.

ART. 3. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V roads and vote to raise and appropriate \$606.12 for same: the State to contribute \$4,040.81.

ART. 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for Class V Highways and Bridges and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for that purpose.

ART. 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for summer and winter road maintenance.

ART. 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of Town Dump.

ART. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for General Expense of the Highway Department.

ART. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cutting brush.

ART. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for upkeep of cemeteries.

ART. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Capital Reserve Fund to be used for new equipment.

ART. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights and Lighting Town Buildings.

ART. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Social Security on Town Employees for the ensuing year.

ART. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to become a participating member in the Newport Area Public Health Nursing Association; this Association being a certified Public Health Association as specified by the Medicare Program.

ART. 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$76.00 for White Pine Blister Rust.

ART. 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire all necessary sums of money for use during the year in anticipation of Taxes.

ART. 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

ART. 17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Insurance.

ART. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to defray the cost of Library, including Librarian's salary, heat, etc.

ART. 19. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Regional Association.

ART. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 for the Newport Hospital.

ART. 21. To see if the Town will vote to have the term of office of the Town Clerk, the Town Treasurer and the Tax Collector extended to three years.

ART. 22. To see if the Town will vote to quarantee a rate of \$50.00 for grave preparations; the Town to pay the balance not covered by other sources.

ART. 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Road Agent to install culverts at new private residential sites at the discretion of the Selectmen.

ART. 24. To see if the Town will vote to charge a fee for all burial lots. The receipts from these fees to offset general cemetery expenses.

ART. 25. To see if the Town will vote to increase the hourly rate for Road Agent and the hourly rate for road help.

ART. 26. To see if the Town will vote to act on any zoning ordinances brought before this meeting.

ART. 27. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

#### NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS - Laws of New Hampshire

#### RSA 1955; 466:1

Every owner or keeper of a dog three months old or over shall annually on or before April 30 cause it to be registered, numbered, described and licensed for one year from the first day of the ensuing May, in the office of the clerk of the city or town wherein said dog is kept, and shall cause it to wear around its neck a collar distinctly marked with its registered number. Said tag shall be furnished by the clerk at the expense of the city or town from the amount received from dog license fees.

Legislative Acts 1965; 325:1-2

In addition to the license fee for dogs provided by this subdivision there shall be a charge of one dollar if said fee is not paid before the first of June in any year. The mayor of each city and the selectmen of each town shall annually, within ten days from May first, issue a warrant to one or more officers or constables, directing them to proceed forthwith either to collect the fees due and pay them over to their respective town or city clerk, or to kill or cause to be killed all dogs within such city or town not licensed and collared according to the provisions of this chapter, and to enter complaint against the owners or keepers thereof; and any person may, and every police officer and constable shall, kill or cause to be killed all such dogs, whenever and wherever found.

#### RSA 1967; 442-A:2

Every dog three months of age and older shall be vaccinated against rabies. Young dogs shall be vaccinated within thirty days after they have reached three months of age. Unvaccinated dogs acquired or moved into the state must be vaccinated within thirty days after purchase or arrival, unless under three months of age, as specified above. Every dog shall be revaccinated at not more than twelve-month intervals with killed vaccine or thirty-six months chick embryo, LEP Flury Vaccine. In rabies infected areas, dogs recently vaccinated should be kept under control for at least thirty days before being allowed to run free.

#### 442-A:8

The rabies control authority shall authorize a pound or pounds, or shall enter into a cooperative agreement with a licensed veterinarian for the establishment and operation of a pound. Any dog found off the owner's premises and not wearing a valid vaccination tag shall be impounded. All impounded dogs shall be given proper care and maintenance. Each impounded dog shall be kept and maintained at the pound for a minimum of ten days unless reclaimed earlier by the owner. Notice of impoundment of all animals, including any significant marks of indentification, shall be posted at the pound as public notification of impoundment. Any unvaccinated dog may be reclaimed by its owner during the period of impoundment by payment of prescribed pound fees and complying with rabies vaccination requirement of this statute within seventy-two hours of release. Any vaccinated dog impounded because of lack of a rabies vaccination tag may be reclaimed by its owner by furnishing proof of rabies vaccination and payment of all impounded fees prior to release. The impoundment fee shall not exceed two dollars per day. If the dog is unclaimed at the end of ten days, the rabies control authority may dispose of the dog in accordance with applicable laws or rules and regulations. If the animal is a stray the town will be responsible for the expense incurred.

#### 466:1-a

Before a license is issued under the provisions of this subdivision, except under the provisions of Section 6, the owner or keeper of a dog shall furnish to the clerk a certification that said dog has been vaccinated against rabies in accordance with the provisions of RSA 442-A.

# THE CROYDON GOOD NEIGHBOR CLUB

The Croydon Good Neighbor Club has existed for approximately twenty-five years and is the only service organization in town with an adult membership. The activities of the club are many and varied. Every year the Good Neighbors sponsor the Christmas Tree Party at the Town Hall for children under thirteen years of age. At this time every child receives a gift, candy and oranges, in conjunction with which the Village School has a program which usually includes a play and the singing of Christmas Carols.

The annual bazaar which takes place the end of July is the club's major activity, the proceeds of which finance the organization's expenditures which include buying equipment and furnishings for the Town Hall and the Village School, which are not otherwise subsidized by taxes.

Gifts are purchased for all new born babies, and flowers, cards or gifts are sent to townspeople who are hospitalized or shut-in.

Thanksgiving baskets are sent to all of the Town's senior citizens and those who are staying at Safford's Rest Home in Croydon Flat.

Christmas Decorations in the form of wreaths are provided for the town buildings and the garden spot at the Croydon Flat sign on Route 10 is maintained by the club.

Food sales which are held during the year provide additional revenue. The largest of these is always held on Town Meeting Day when light lunches are made available to those who want them. Hot dogs and sandwiches, cookies and cakes provide the one special lunch during the year to the children at the Village School and is considered quite a treat by them.

The success of the Good Neighbor Club is, of course, dependent upon the cooperation of the people of the town. Whenever food or money is solicited, the results are more than gratifying to the members and encourages them to continue their efforts on behalf of the town. The "Good Neighbors" would like to take this opportunity to extend to everyone in Croydon their heartfelt thanks for their help and support. The following six year financial report will give a fairly comprehensive accounting of the moneys spent by the organization and is published herein for the public's edification.

- 2. Take debris and waste to the town dump.
- 3. Maintain a clean, safe dump.
- 4. Keep matches away from young children.
- 5. Be sure matches and smoking material are dead out when we discard them.
- 6. Set a good example for others in fire prevention.

#### **REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS**

### To the Citizens of Croydon:

Mrs. Edith Fowle is again teaching Grades 1-3 with an enrollment of 24 pupils divided as follows:

Mrs. Fowle continues to do an excellent job in giving her pupils a solid foundation in the basic skills. We are fortunate to have her services. I am sure a word of appreciation from the parents would be in order.

### **AREA** School District

Tuition Charge . . .

Under the Newport-Croydon A R E A School Plan, Croydon continues to pay the tuition fee in Grades 7-12 without a rental charge. This difference from the amount paid by other sending districts is as follows:

Incentive Aid . . .

The New Hampshire Statutes call for a payment to A R E A Schools of \$60 for a junior high student and \$75 for a senior high student. (The Newport-Croydon A R E A Plan calls for such money to be divided between the two Districts.) In the past, no money was ever appropriated by the State to pay this "incentive aid." However, the 1967 Legislature did provide a sum of money to partially implement this program. A technicality in the appropriation prevented A R E A schools from receiving this aid this year. It is expected that this 1967-68 allotment, estimated at \$600, and an additional allotment for 1968-69, estimated at \$1,000, will become available during the next budget.

#### State Foundation Aid

Although you will be receiving some new funds from "incentive aid" under the A R E A Plan, the latest equalized valuation of Croydon has increased to the point that you are are not eligible for "foundation aid" in 1968-69.

According to figures from the Tax Commission, your equalized valuation increased from \$1,585,594 to \$2,274,134, an increase of 43.42%. This per cent of increase was considerably greater than the average throughout the State.

Since your number of resident students did not increase appreciably, the large boost in equalized valuation served to cut your eligibility to receive "foundation aid."

This is another example of a State Statute where insufficient funds are provided to fully implement a program.

#### SCHOOL WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Croydon, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on the 6th day of March 1968 at 7:30 o'clock p.m. to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To see if the District will vote to adopt as the checklist for School Meetings the chcklist of the Town.

Article 2. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.

Article 3. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Article 5. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year. Article 6. To choose one or more Auditors and such

other Officers and Agents as the voters may judge necessary. Article 7. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for School District Officials and Agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.

Article 9. To see if the District will raise and appropriate the amount of \$1,000 as a deficiency appropriation to become available during the school year 1967-68 as a result of additional tuition students, and instruct its Clerk to issue a certificate therefor to the Selectmen of the Town.

Article 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
