TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Epping, in the County of Rockingham, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs;

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Epping on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for roads and bridges.

4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate as per contract with the Portsmouth Power Co.

5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Public Library.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Decoration Day expenses.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the winding of the Town Clock.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Class V Highways the sum of \$554.13 on condition that the State contribute \$2,217.31.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,344.00 on condition that the State contribute \$2,688.00 for the continuation of the improvement of the road leading off the North Epping road to the Hedding Camp Ground and the Newfields town line in the Town of Epping.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

12. To see what action the town will take in accordance with the repeal of the State Law requiring vital statistics to be published in the Town Report.

13. On petition of George A. Gilmore and twenty others to see if the town will vote to adopt the Australian Caucus Law.

14. To see what action the town wishes to take in regard to placing markers on the streets.

15. To see if the town will vote to discontinue certain highways no longer necessary for public travel, namely:

- (a) Road leading from Nottingham Square to the residence of True Wells.
- (b) Road leading from Route 125, known as French Hill road.
- (c) Road leading from the residence of William Grant to Diamond Hill.
- (d) Road leading off Boar's Head Hill, opposite the residence of Francis Dearborn, to the residence of Mrs. Joseph Muir.

16. To see if the town will vote to install traffic lights at the four corners and raise and appropriate the sum of \$250 for the same.

REPORT OF HEALTH OFFICER

I herewith submit my report as Health Officer for the year ending January 31st, 1940.

The following contagious diseases were reported to me during the year, two pertussis, two scarlet fever and several cases of measles.

Several complaints were made to me about dogs and cats being left beside the road, killed by automobiles. I had them buried, but no monuments have been erected.

Several samples of milk were sent to the State Laboratory of Hygiene for analysis and I regret to report that a few were dirty, adulterated and had excessive bacteria counts. The dealers were notified that they would be prosecuted if this condition existed in the future.

Samples of town water were sent up about every month and the same report, considerable turbidity and excessive iron.

The town is confronted with the proposition of how best to take care of sewage. I know that we very much need of a sewerage system, a new or filtered water supply and a clean, healthy new high school building. In order to have these improvements we must use our best judgment, practice economy, eliminate politics, be united. honest and sincere, and our efforts will be crowned with success.
