

(As known February 7, 1962)

Time of meeting: 7:30 p.m., March 13, 1962 Polls open from 1:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same as set forth in the following budget:

Article 3. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to sell a parcel of land located on Scrag Mountain which abuts upon the property of Arnold Polonsky.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 to purchase a used power road grader.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 toward the purchase of a new truck, the balance to be taken from the equipment reserve fund.

Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 and authorize the selectmen to use the same for the purpose of advertising the Town of Franconia's summer and winter attractions.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the pur-

chase of storm windows and curtains for the stage at the town building.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$22,000.00 for the water department to enable it to do the following:

- (1) Rebuild and enlarge Howe reservoir.
- (2) Drill a deep well and install pumping equipment for same.
- (3) Build a heated workshop and pumping station.

(The town to issue serial notes or bonds for a period of 15 years to cover the payments of interest and principal.)

Article 9. To see what action the town wishes to take in regard to the collection of rubbish and garbage and raise the necessary funds for same.

Article 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 to "hot top" the town building walks and parking area, including the fire station driveway.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to allow a discount for early payment of taxes.

Article 12. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Dr. Ralph Parker, serving as school physician, gave complete physical examinations to all pupils whose parents requested them. These examinations also included the checking of hemoglobin and urinalysis.

A Tuberculosis clinic was held in January.

In April a Polio clinic was held and attendance was excellent.

One pupil is regularly attending the Speech clinic in Hanover; and one pupil was seen at the Orthopedic clinic at the Littleton Hospital.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of the Franconia School District:

I herewith submit my nineteenth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The total enrollment of your school last year was 63, the average membership was 56.1 and the percent of attendance was 93.02. There were 18 tuition pupils enrolled, 5 from Easton and 13 from Lisbon Town School District. Last year there were 32 pupils enrolled at Littleton High, 14 in grades 7 and 8 at Littleton, one pupil at Newport, Vermont, one pupil at Gould Academy and one pupil at Bethlehem High School.

The enrollment this year at Franconia Elementary School is 55. Four pupils from Easton and 11 pupils from Lisbon Town are included. There are 46 pupils attending public schools outside the district, 11 at Littleton Junior High, 32 at Littleton High, 2 at Lisbon Public School and one at St. Johnsbury Trade School.

Graduating from Littleton High School this year are the following Franconia pupils: Paul Champagne, Richard Gawel, Barbara Nelson, Jon Peabody, Craig Raynor, Pauline Rousseau, Pamela Phillips and David Sullivan.

I have just been talking with Principal Arthur Kenney of Littleton High School and he tells me how much he enjoys working with the Franconia children. He says that the Franconia pupils are well prepared scholastically. They adjust well to the Littleton High School program. They participate extensively in sports and school activities and provide a full measure of school leadership. The Franconia School District is to be commended for their excellent bus facilities. Mr. Kenney feels that the second bus in the afternoon works out advantageously for the Franconia students.

The districts of Littleton and Franconia have worked together cooperatively. The School Boards meet jointly several times a year. The Littleton-Franconia associa-

tion is a pleasant one which we hope to continue for the years to come.

I have just completed reading Mrs. Leavitt's excellent report. She has given you a very complete picture of Franconia Elementary School, its accomplishments and requirements. As you read this report you will clearly see what the school is doing.

May I call your attention to the special article in the school warrant relating to Physical Education and Kindergarten services. Last spring your Board received a petition from thirteen mothers, strongly urging an establishment of a Kindergarten in the Franconia school. Physical education is highly recommended as a part of the National program for physical fitness. This article is presented at the annual meeting so that the particulars may be fully discussed and acted upon.

On behalf of the district and School Board, I wish to thank the teachers for their excellent work and cooperation this year. My personal thanks are extended to the School Board. I trust that each of you finds that service to the school children of Franconia is a rewarding experience.

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL

I herewith submit my third annual report as Principal of the Franconia Elementary School at Dow Academy.

ADMINISTRATION:

The present school year began on Wednesday, September 6, 1961 with a total registration of 58 pupils. As of this writing, there are 55 pupils enrolled in the six grades.

A breakdown of this figure shows that 7 are in Grade 1, 10 in Grade 2, 8 in Grade 3, 10 in Grade 4, 5 in Grade 5, and 15 in Grade 6.

The school day has been lengthened fifteen minutes because of the increased curriculum load. Grade 1 is dismissed at 2:15 P.M. Grades 2 through 6 are dismissed at 3:00 P.M. This new time schedule seems to be working out well.

The teaching staff remains the same, with Mrs. Leone Philbrook of Sugar Hill teaching Grades 3 and 4, and Mrs. Natalie Wheeler of Franconia teaching Grades 5 and 6. They are to be commended for their unflagging loyalty and cooperation.

Mrs. Marion Callender's services as music teacher are excellent and much enjoyd by the children.

Robert McLachlin is continuing to do a very conscientious job as school custodian.

CURRICULUM:

The program of studies is carefully carried out. Much stress is laid on the teaching of the basic fundamentals in each subject.

The phonetic approach in reading is taught with care and precision from grades one through six. The daily use of the school's new Speed-i-o-scope improves visual memory and visual response.

The staff, in its teaching, tries at all times to allow for individual differences. Each child is encouraged to progress at his own rate and to work at all times to the best of his ability. Personal guidance is definitely stressed.

An Orientation Day at Littleton High School was again held for the sixth graders. Principal Arthur Kenney and Guidance Director Louis Bougie of that school also came to the Franconia Elementary School. The record of each sixth grader was carefully studied and personal discussions, relative to each child, were held with both Mrs. Wheeler and myself. In conclusion, Mr. Kenney gave a most informative talk to the pupils and both he and Mr. Bougie answered questions.

I have reported this matter at some length as much time and effort are expended by all those concerned to make this transitional period both pleasant and educationally profitable for your children. The cooperation between the Franconia and Littleton schools is excellent in this and all other matters.

SCHOOL LUNCH:

The school lunch program, under the very capable management of Mrs. Alma Shores, has been in effect since school began in September. Approximately 46 pupils participate daily in this program.

SCHOOL HEALTH:

Dr. Ralph Parker and Nurse Ruth Robar have given complete physicals to the pupils whose parents so desired.

Mrs. Robar has conducted eye and ear examinations. She visits the school regularly and is on call at any time.

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES:

Special holidays and events are continuing to be observed by school assemblies. These assemblies are the outgrowth of actual classroom work. For instance, some phases of the school's visual and auditory aids program have been demonstrated. The opaque projector and tape

recorder have been used. Parent attendance at these morning assemblies has been greatly appreciated by both the faculty and the pupils.

A series of parties were planned and are being carried out, including room festivities at Christmas. The annual Christmas program, with 100% pupil participation, was presented in the school hall.

The 1961 Ski Program, sponsored by the Franconia School District, proved very successful. As of this writing, plans are going into effect for another carefully managed ski program for the winter of 1962. At present, 31 elementary school pupils have registered for this program.

CONCLUSION:

Once again, I wish to express my sincere thanks to the people of Franconia, the Board of Education, Superintendent Ronald Perham, the faculty and pupils for their cooperation and assistance.

SUPERVISORY UNION NO. 34 REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire, requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent.

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union #34, during 1960-1961, received a salary of \$8,250.00 which was made up as follows: \$4,250.00 paid by the State Department of Education from the per capita tax and \$4,000.00 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1,100.00 for travel within the Union was also prorated as stated above.

The table below shows the proration of salary and travel charged to each school district.

Program of the White Mountains Region Association

The White Mountains Region Association as a voluntary non-profit organization, receives support from the communities of the Region, the state and from individual members so that a program of cooperative promotion and development of northern New Hampshire may be carried on.

The Association publishes and distributes six different folders a year advertising the many advantages of the Region. It receives and carefully answers about 6,000 letters per year from people interested in a vacation in the North Country. The value of this single service cannot be over-emphasized. Recent surveys have shown that the tourists attracted by this mailing service have spent many hundreds of thousands of dollars in the Region. The Association sponsors the annual fall foliage tours, and represents the Region at national travel shows.

Through its board of directors, it is able to speak for the Region's needs at state and national hearings and at important meetings within the Region. It maintains a news release service to local newspapers to help inform the citizens of the North Country of worth-while activities and economic trends.

• This winter the Association is running a cooperative ad program with the chambers of commerce in the ski areas to promote skiing in the White Mountains. It cooperates with private promotional groups, local chambers of commerce, and with the state promotional agencies. It promotes the sale of real estate through the mailing of real-estate purchase bulletins to real estate brokers. It conducts labor surveys for groups interested in industrial development, maintains an award program for the 4-H Clubs, and promotes agriculture within the Region.

In uninterrupted service since 1938, it has helped establish the White Mountains Region as a vacation center as fine as any in the world and contributed in many other ways to the economic betterment of all forty-six communities in northern New Hampshire.
