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TOWN WARRANT

(L. S.) THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Grantham in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday, the 14th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one Town Clerk, one Town Treasurer, one Police Officer, and one Overseer of the Poor for the ensuing year; one Selectman, one Trustee of Trust Funds, and one Trustee of the Public Library for the ensuing three years, and one Supervisor of the Check List to finish the unexpired term of Wesley D. Currier.
- Art. 2. To choose one or more Highway Agents and all other necessary town officers, agents and committees, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges.
- Art. 4. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of the poor, and Old Age Assistance.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to apply for Town Road Aid.
- Art. 6. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges.
- Art. 7. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for snow bill.
- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one-hundredth of one percent (1/100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1950 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise \$400 for control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry Department.
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to have an Old Home Day, and take any action thereon.
- Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to raise \$50.00 to have the history of the town printed in a booklet to be published by the New Hampshire Veterans Association.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money if any the town wants to raise for the fire department.
- Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money if necessary.
- Art. 16. To hear the reports of the officers, agents, and committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Grantham School Board:

I am pleased to report on the activities of the Grantham schools during the past twelve months.

In the Grantham Village school Mrs. Mabel Pillsbury has resigned and she has been replaced by Mrs. Marion Heath, a teacher with experience. We have seldom had an exchange of teachers in Grantham whereby we have been able to fill a position with a teacher of experience and previous success. It is highly gratifying to have this good fortune.

Some comment was made about the heating conditions at the North Grantham school during the last district meeting. The Board has been able to secure a circulating, coal burning stove which seems to add a good deal to the comfort. We now have a stove at each end of the room which ought to take care of the situation in the most severe weather. The building is hard to heat because there are windows on three sides and the foundation is not especially tight. Grantham could do with one good new building sufficient to take care of the fifty children in two rooms, with a third to allow for a noon lunch program, but this is probably a very remote possibility.

The teachers were able to spend the first four days of the school year at a workshop conducted for elementary teachers in Hanover. This seems to be helpful as well as an enjoyable occasion for teachers and I hope it may be continued.

We may be surprised when we look at the size of the request for high school tuition but we already have fifteen enrolled in high schools with probably four to graduate but there are ten in the eighth grade at the present time. Should these attend high school we would have a total of twenty-one. It is not likely that we will have over eighteen but at \$175 per pupil or in some schools even \$300 the high school tuition is going to be a considerable item.

Grantham was fortunate in that it did not suffer, but in fact gained, in the amount of state aid although there was a general reduction in most of the school districts of the state and a great many districts received nothing.

Miss Eveleth has a report in another place telling about the medical inspection and what defects she has found and what corrections she has been able to make. Some children have been fitted with glasses from the Lindsay fund in Hanover through her efforts.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the members of the School Board, the teachers and pupils for their kindness and helpfulness during the past year.
