

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jackson in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Jackson on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate, as follows:

3. A sum of money for maintenance of summer high-ways and bridges.

4. A sum of money for snow removal from highways, and sanding of same.

5. A sum of money for street lighting.

6. A sum of money for old age assistance.

7. A sum of money for poor relief.

8. A sum of money for maintenance of cemetery.

9. A sum of money for Memorial Day services.

10. A sum of \$500.00 for painting and repair of Town Hall.

11. A sum of money for the Library.

12. A sum of \$1000 for the improvement of certain hazardous sections in town roads.

13. A sum of \$70 for the White Mountain Region.

14. A sum of money for fire protection.

15. A sum of \$86.00 for Town Road Aid.

16. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to sell the J. H. Hodge property.

17. To raise a sum of money for repairs to the J. H. Hodge place.

18. To raise a sum of money for tarring Mill Street.

19. To raise a sum of money for tarring from junction of 16A and the Thorn Hill Road to Clifton B. Smith's residence.

20. To see what sum of money the town will raise towards permanent improvement of bridge between the residence of Daniel Dinsmore and the Dundee Schoolhouse.

21. To raise the sum of \$100 for the church.

22. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the hospital.

23. To see if the town will vote to impose a summons of .20 on poll taxes uncollected after October 15, 1945.

24. A sum of money for Eastern Slope Region.

25. To see if the town will vote to raise \$1060 for reconstruction of Six Mile Circuit Road as post war planning.

26. To see if the town will approve the use of funds appropriated for building a selectman's office, for the construction of such an office in the schoolhouse; and re-sell the land purchased for the site of same to the previous owners; the money being added to the fund.

27. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow upon credit of the town, not exceeding \$5000 in anticipation of taxes.

28. To act on any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Statistical data for the year ending in June, 1944, are as follows: Total registration during year, 29; percentage of attendance, 91; cases of tardiness, 59; visits of school nurse, 25; visits of superintendent, 14; number transported, 9.

Because the scarcity of teachers made it impossible to secure a qualified teacher who could and would teach all eight grades, it was decided early in the year to divide the school. Mrs. Elizabeth Breen was engaged for the primary room and Miss Mabel Harris for the upper grades. Both are excellent teachers and the present situation is eminently satisfactory. At

the time of this report there are 12 pupils in the primary room and 12 in the grammar school.

Pupils whose tuition is paid at Kennett High school this year are: Daniel Dinsmore, grade 12; Gordon Johnson, grade 10; Janet Kelley, grade 11; Shirley McInnnis, grade 12.
