TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE I. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

ART. II. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for same.

ART. III. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of Highways and Bridges and make appropriation for same.

ART. IV. To see what discount the Town will allow on taxes paid on or before a certain date.

ART V. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$339.00 for State Aid Construction; or if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$322.97 for Class 5 assistance.

ART VI. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the construction of a new bridge on the site of the White Iron Bridge.

ART. VII. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to paint the iron bridges.

ART. VIII. To see if the Town will vote to borrow and appropriate the money necessary to complete the State Aid Construction on the Drewsville Road on the continued appropriation plan.

IX. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the improvement of the Cemeteries.

ART. X. To see if the Town will vote to accept from William W. Dodge the sum of \$100.00 in Trust, the income to be used for the care of the Frederick C. Dodge lot in the Lower Cemetery.

ART. XI. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the repair of the settees at the Town Hall.

ART. XII. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$25.00 for the celebration of Memorial Day.

ART. XIII. Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?

ART XIV. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ART. XV. To transact any other business that may come before the meeting.

ART. XVI. To allow Accounts.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Langdon School Board:—

A new plan of organization for the Langdon schools was begun last fall. The pupils of the seventh and eighth grades are transported to Vilas High School where they have excellent opportunities; Miss June Clark teaches grades three, four, five and six, and Miss Frances Grindstaff has grades one and two. The teachers have had excellent preparation and are doing very high grade work. Rapid progress is being made in grades one and two in reading, and there is a quiet earnestness in the upper grade room that shows the pupils are interested in and like their school, and that the teacher has a nerve control of the room that does not tire the children. Good work is being done in art, music and science as well as in the three R's.

Paint and labor brightened the upper grade room. I hope that the lower grade room may be painted next year.

The school building has good natural light, electric lights, chemical toilets, but is not economical to heat. There should be some way to adjust the flow of heat without going to the furnace room.

The money raised last year for special repairs was not used for that purpose and may be reappropriated this year for other work or to cut down the appropriation for 1937-1938.

As your superintendent I feel well pleased with the work being done by the Langdon pupils this year.

I appreciate the loyalty and help from the Langdon School Board and teachers and the kindnesses from the citizens.
