

## TOWN WARRANT, 1935

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lincoln in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Lincoln, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. How much money will be raised for the Public Library?
- 4. How much money will be raised for the Police Department?
- 5. How much money will be raised for the Public Health Department?
- 6. How much money will be raised for the Fire Department?
- 7. How much money will be raised for Town Maintenance?
- 8. How much money will be raised for Miscellaneous expense?
- 9. How much money will be raised for the Public Cemetery?

- 10. How much money will be raised for support of Town Poor?
- 11. Will the Town vote to raise the sum of \$1,500 and interest to take up Water Bond due April 1, 1935?

12. How much money will be raised for maintenance of Water Department?

- 13. How much money will be raised for Street Lighting?
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 15. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds?
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act?
- 17. To see if the Voters of Lincoln will vote to elect a road agent for a term of three years?
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Australian Ballot?
- 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

#### Articles To Be Acted Upon

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To choose, Agents, Auditors and Committees, in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
- 6. To see if the District will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the School Board in its annual report.
- 7. To see if the District will vote to adopt medical inspection for the schools and to raise and appropriate money therefor.
- 8. To see if the District will vote to build a high school building and equip it, or provide in any other way for housing and equipment of the high school and raise and appropriate money therefor.
- 9. To see if the District will vote to ratify and approve the application for a loan and/or grant from the United States, under the National Industrial Recovery Act, of not exceeding \$23,000.00, such loan and/or grant, if obtained, to be applied to constructing a high school building and equipping the same.
- 10. To see if the District will authorize the issue and sale to the United States or any other purchaser or purchasers of not exceeding \$23,000.00 of bonds of the School District, said bonds to be issued in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 59, of the Public

Laws of 1926, as amended to bear interest at not exceeding 6% per annum payable semi-annually, the date of issue, the time and place of payment of principal and interest, the fixing of the rate of interest, the provision for the sale of said bonds and other matter in relation thereto to be left to the discretion of the School Board.

- 11. To see if the District will vote to authorize, ratify or approve any and all contracts or agreements in connection with any loan and/or grant, the application for which is ratified and approved at the meeting.
- 12. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to execute and deliver, in the name and behalf of the District, all contracts and agreements, and to take all action necessary or incidental to obtaining the loan and/or grant, the application for which is ratified and approved at the meeting and/or to issuing and selling the bonds authorized at the meeting.
- 13. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$150.00 to replace cash and other property belonging to school organizations and lost in the fire.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.
