### TOWN WARRANT STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Orange, in the county of Grafton in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Orange on Tuesday, the 9th of March next at four of the clock in the afternoon, to act on the following subjects.

ARTICLE 1. To choose by ballot and plurality vote, a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Seectman for three years, a Tax Collector, a Road Agent, a Constable, one Trustee of Trust Funds for one year, one Cemetery Agent, one Overseer of Pubic Welfare, Fence Viewers, Measurers of Wood, Bark and Lumber, and all other officers that the town may judge necessary.

And then beginning at SEVEN O'CLOCK in the evening, to vote on the following articles:

- ARTICLE 2. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,995.00 for the payment of Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to pay Town House Expenses.
- ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,100.00 for the summer maintenance of highways and bridges.
- ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the winter maintenance of highways and bridges.
- ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,200.00 for the upkeep of the Town Grader.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$288.35 for town road aid and the State will contribute \$1,922.35.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$175.00 for insurance on the Town House and Grader.

- ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for Workmen's Compensation to cover town employees.
- ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$20.00 for the Town Library.
- ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the maintenance of the Town Cemeteries.
- ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$10.00 for the decoration of Soldier's Graves on Memorial Day.
- ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be paid to the Town of Canaan for for the use of fire equipment. In case of fires in Orange, the only cost to the town of Orange will be for labor.
- ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the fire truck fund, and \$100.00 for the truck fund.
- ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$940.00 to be paid toward the principal of our 5 year note.
- ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000.00 to be paid toward the principal of the Grader loan.
- ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes to pay necessary town charges.
- ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$650.00 to pay interest on borrowed money.
- ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and the Deeding Agent to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired through Tax Collector's deeds in the town.

- ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to give a discount on taxes paid in full within thirty days from the date of tax bill of 3 per cent.
- ARTICLE 21. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$83.50 to help support a nursing service in conjunction with the Mascoma Health Council.
- ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to be paid to the Town of Canaan for use of the Canaan Town Dump.
- ARTICLE 23. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for dues in the New Hampshire Municipal Association.
- ARTICLE 24. By petition of ten voters of the Town of Orange the following article: To see if the Town will vote to discontiue, subject to gates and bars (as covered in Public Law 238.2) The steep hill portion of the crossroad otherwise known as the Turnpike Road. A portion which extends from the junction with Tuttle Hill Road down the cross road in a southwesterly direction 1/10th of a mile to the bottom of the hill.
- ARTICLE 25. By petition of 10 voters of the Town of Orange the following article: To see if the Town will create a Planning board and authorize the Selectmen to appoint members as specified by Section 36.2 of the N.H.R.S.A. The Planning Board will operate under state law and have only the power to recommend ordinances to the town to vote.
- ARTICLE 26. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for cutting brush along the highways.
- ARTICLE 27. To see if the Town will allow the Home Extension Group the use of the Town House for some of their meetings. They will pay for gas they use plus \$1.00 a month for lights.

- ARTICLE 28. To see if the Town will accept or reject the road known as Wheeler Road, a distance of 2135 feet, beginning at project station 14+00 to station 35+35 as shown on state maps.
- ARTICLE 29. To see if the Town will accept or reject the road known as the Sturtevant Road, a distance of 1549 feet, beginning at Project Station 36+00 to Station 51+49 as shown on State Maps.
- ARTICLE 30. To hear the reports of agents, auditors and other officers heretofore and pass any vote relative thereto.
- ARTICLE 31. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting not included in the warrant.
- ARTICLE 32. The polls shall not close earlier than eight o'clock in the evening.



### REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN & DISTRICT CHIEF

During this past year, the public has shown a great deal of cooperation in the prevention of fires. We wish to express our thanks for a job well done.

Your Forest Fire Warden's job would be easier if everyone understood the State laws that govern the kindling of outdoor fires, a synopsis of these laws follows.

### FIRE PERMITS

A fire permit is needed for all outdoor fires in or near woodland anytime the ground is not covered with snow. This includes household waste burning, even if in an incinerator, grass burning, garden trash as well as brush burning (SUCH BURNING IS RESTRICTED BY REGULATION TO BE PRIOR TO 9:00 A.M. and AFTER 5:00 P.M.).

An Air Pollution regulation forbids the burning of household waste in towns where such rubbish is collected by the town.

### **EXCEPTIONS**

Commercial or Industrial burning is allowed under normal conditions with permission of the District Fire Chief and a permit from the Fire Warden.

Camp or cooking fires are allowed on your own property with permission of the Fire Warden. On another's property, with written permission of the landowner and permission of the Fire Warden. The Warden can forbid such fires if in a hazardous area. Permits for cooking fires in the White Mountain National Forest can be obtained from the Laconia Office or at the Ranger Stations. Permits are not required in public camp or picnic grounds where fireplaces have been built for this purpose.

### MASCOMA AREA HEALTH COUNCIL

Summary of Services for Town Report January 1, through December 31, 1970

The Mascoma Area Health Council, a non-profit visiting nurse association, covering the towns of Grafton, Orange, Canaan, and Enfield is now in its second year of operation. Ellen Williams, R.N., the pioneer of our organization, resigned in November to spend more time with her family. Gertrude Clark, R.N., who has been with us almost since the beginning is now taking Ellen's place. During the Summer the Council was fortunate to have Thelma (Webster) Smith's professional services while Ellen was on leave. Mrs. Smith left in the fall to take a full time position and Carolyn Shattuck, R.N., of Hanover was hired. The two nurses, Trudy and Cory work 40 hours a week from 8 A.M. to 4 P.M. having a central office in the M.V.R.H.S. with their own private phone (632-7234). By sharing the work load, these two part-time nurses give the towns the equivalent of one full time nurse. One nurse is funded by the towns and the other through a State Grant.

During the past year the nurses made approximately 1374 visits to patients in our surrounding towns. These visits inculde the new mother, well child or infant, mentally disturbed patient, cancer patient, hadicapped patient, diabetic patient and many health promotion visits. During the Spring a series of immunization clinics was held in Enfield and in the Fall in Canaan for all the pre-school children of the towns covered. The Council is now planning a vision and hearing clinic for pre-school children (4-6 years) in the Spring and also more immunization clinics.

The nurses are involved in many things as well as visiting patients. They are willing to do as much as they are professionally able to help our small community and its citizens.
