## TOWN WARRANT FOR 1968

L.S.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Seabrook in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the lower hall of the Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 86, on Tuesday, March 12, 1968, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon and to cast ballots from that hour until at least 6 o'clock in the evening of the same day and to act on the following articles:

ARTICLE 1. To elect by Non-partisan ballot: a Town Clerk; one Selectman, Assessor, and Trustee of the Trust Funds for a term of three (3) years; a Town Treasurer; a Collector of Taxes; a Chief of Police; a Chief of the Fire Department; three (3) constables; one member of the Budget Committee for a term of three (3) years; one member of the Park Commission for a term of three (3) years; a Road Agent; and many other officers for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 2. To choose Delegates At Large, Alternate Delegates At Large, Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the National Conventions of the various Political Parties to be held to nominate Party Candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.

ARTICLE 3. Upon the petition of Frank Palazzo and fifty-three (53) others: To see if the Town will vote to abolish the Zoning Ordinance of the Town of Seabrook adopted at the Annual Town Meeting of March 9, 1954, and amended at subsequent Town Meetings.

(Ballot Question)

ARTICLE 4. Upon the petition of Frank Palazzo and sixty-eight (68) others: To see if the Town will vote to abolish the Subdivision Control Ordinance of the Town of Seabrook adopted at the Annual Town Meeting of March 8, 1960, and amended at subsequent Town Meetings.

# (Ballot Question)

- ARTICLE 5. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the expense of the General Government, for the Protection of Persons and Property, for Health and Sanitation, for Highways and Bridges, for support of Town Poor and all other necessary expenditures for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to renew and refund Town notes.
- ARTICLE 7. To see what action the Town will take regarding the balances of the Special appropriations: New Land, 3,000.00; Cross Beach layout, 4,285.00; Street Survey, 305.00; Planning and Zoning (Tax map, etc.) 1,900.08; Fire Alarm Spec., 1,483.19; Mosquito Control, 1,165.39; Cemetery Road, 612.39; River Street, 1,000.00; Dwight Avenue (Spec.), 173.00; New Equipment, 1,382.50.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to revise the salaries and wages of the Town officials and employees.
- ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept bids for the purchase of a new combination Cruiser-Ambulance for use by the Police Department and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 (Two Thousand Dollars) for same.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept, as a gift from the Seabrook Law Enforcement Association and the Seabrook Firefighters Relief Association, the vehicle known as the Town Ambulance and authorize the selectmen to execute such documents as are necessary for the acceptance of said gift.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 (Three Thousand Dollars) for the purchase of wire, material and labor to extend the Closed Circuit Fire Alarm System.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund to be known as the "Tax Reassessment Fund", said fund to be used for the reassessment of the Town by State Tax Commission appraisal, said appraisal to be made in the year 1969 or subsequent thereto; and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to be deposited in said fund and expended in accordance with the purposes thereof.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,500.00 (Eleven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars) for the purpose of purchasing a back hoe and all accessory equipment necessary for the operation thereof.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to sell, at public auction, the gravel pit situated at Collins Street in the Town of Salisbury, County of Essex, Commonwealth of Massachusetts which premises were conveyed to the Town by deed dated May 22, 1917, and recorded in Essex County Registry of Deeds, Southern District, Book 2765, Page 421, and to execute all agreements, deeds, or other documents necessary to accomplish the same.

- ARTICLE 15.. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to convey the premises acquired by the Town by Collector's Deed dated December 10, 1964, and recorded in Rockingham Records, Book 1753, Page 455, at private sale, upon such terms and conditions as the Selectmen, in their discretion, deem to be in the best interest of the Town, and to execute such agreements, deeds, or other documents necessary to accomplish the same, said property being known as "Edgecomb" land.
- ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to appoint permanent police officers, each of said officers to be employed by the Town, on a full time basis, at a salary of \$90.00 (Ninety Dollars) per week.
- ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will authorize and empower the Selectmen to appoint permanent town employees to be assigned by the Selectmen to perform work for various departments of the Town, each of said employees to be employed, by the Town, on a full time basis, at a salary of \$90.00 (Ninety Dollars) per week.
- ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and empower the Selectmen to employ the highway agent on a full time basis at a salary of \$125.00 (One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars) per week.
- $\label{eq:ARTICLE 19.} ARTICLE \ 19. \quad \ \mbox{To hear the report of the Planning Board and to act thereon.}$
- ARTICLE 20. Upon the petition of William E. Felch and eighteen (18) others: To see if the Town will by majority vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 41: 26-A, Section 27, and elect the Treasurer for a term of three (3) years.
- ARTICLE 21. Upon the petition of Florence D. Haley and fifteen (15) others: To see if the Town by majority, will vote to adopt the provisions of RSA 41:2-A, section 3, and elect the Tax Collector for a term of three (3) years.

ARTICLE 22. Upon the petition of Rayenold F. Perkins, Jr. and twenty-two (22) others: To see if the Town will by majority vote to adopt the Provisions of RSA 41:16A, section 17, and elect the Town Clerk for a term of three (3) years.

ARTICLE 23. Upon the petition of Peter E. Randall and fourteen (14) others: To see if the Town will vote to increase the elected membership of the Budget Committee to six instead of three members, and if so, to provide that at the March, 1969 Town Meeting that two (2) persons be elected for a term of three (3) years, one (1) person for a term of two (2) years, and one (1) person for a term of one (1) year, and thereafter have two (2) persons elected each year for three (3) year terms.

ARTICLE 24. Upon the petition of Wilbur Fowler, Jr. and twenty (20) others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 (Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars) for the purchase of a four-wheel drive dump truck equipped with a snow plow, to be under the care of the Highway Department.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 25. Upon the petition of Alton D. Eaton and nine (9) others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 (Two Thousand Dollars) to improve Adams Avenue from near the residence of Helen Knowles to Route #86.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 26. Upon the petition of Bruce Brown and fourteen (14) others: To see if the Town will vote to hire two (2) men for twenty (20) weeks during the summer to care for the several cemeteries within the Town and to set their salary at \$85.00 (Eighty-five Dollars) per week and to raise and appropriate \$3,400.00 (Three Thousand Four Hundred Dollars) to pay for the same. Said men to be hired by the Selectmen and to work under their direction.

(Approved by the Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 27. Upon the petition of Lester M. Knowles and twenty-two (22) others: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 (Two Thousand Dollars) for a hot-topped parking lot and a boat ramp to low water mark at the River Street pier.

(Without Recommendation - Budget Committee)

ARTICLE 28. To transact all other business that legally may come before said meeting.

#### ADJOURNED TOWN MEETING

March 17, 1967 Seabrook, N.H.

Adjourned Town Meeting called to order by Moderator Richard L. Holloway at 7:15 P.M. in Passaconaway Hall, Seabrook Firemen's Association Building, Route 86.

Salute to the Flag omitted because no flag in the Hall. Invocation by Rev. Allen Lurvey, Pastor, Rand Memorial Church. One minute of silent prayer in memory of late Representative and C.D. Director Montervill Leslie.

Moderator stated no votes will be accepted from the hallway. Inquired if any visitors or non-voters were present.

Moderator read the responsibility of the Moderator.

Mssrs. Louis Sampson and Melvurn Morgan appointed as Tellers.

Moderator asked if Meeting wished to limit debate on the question. Since there was no dissenting voice, Moderator ruled unlimited time for debate providing it is confined to the question on the floor.

Moderator ruled no voice vote. All votes will be by either hand or standing vote.

ARTICLE 2 read by the Moderator - Budget

Motion by Emery Eaton, second by Frederick Felch, that Article 2 be acted on after Article 20.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 3 read by the Moderator: - "---- allow Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes -----."

Motion by Robie M. Beckman, second by Charles Felch, that Article 3 be accepted as read.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 4 read by the Moderator: - "---- action on balances of Special appropriations"

Motion by Emery Eaton, second by James S. Eaton, that balances under Article 4 be used for the purposes intended. Robie M. Beckman inquired as to legality of acting in 1967 on articles voted in 1966.

Action declared legal by Town Counsel Robert Tetler. Harry Small inquired what had been done to layout road to Cross Beach and stated all that people in that area wanted was lights.

Frederick Felch stated land has to be acquired before road can be laid out and Electric Light Co. will not run lines until land is acquired.

Question moved by Harry Small, second by Charles H. Felch. Carried.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 5 read by the Moderator:-"---- revision of salaries and wages"

Motion by Salvatore Rubera, second by Peter Randall, to pass over Article 5 temporarily and proceed to act on Article 19.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 19 read by the Moderator: - "---- report of Wage and Dept. Study Comm."

Motion by Merle D. Straw, Jr., second by Robie M. Beckman, to hear the report of the Wage and Department Study Committee at this time.

Motion carried.

Report given by Comm. Chairman Edward F. Goodwin.

# ARTICLE 5 read by the Moderator

Motion by Charles Felch, second by Horatio Lattime that salaries and wages of Town Officials and Employees be revised.

Leonard DiBartolomeo questioned legality of motion and asked Town Counsel if the article is legal under Municipal Budget Law.

Atty. Tetler stated that as long as notice is given regarding a certain subject it is satisfactory as far as giving notice.

Motion carried.

Motion by James S. Eaton, second by Louis Gardella, that permanent Fire Department members' starting salary be established at \$85.00 (eighty-five dollars) per week with yearly increments of \$5.00 (five dollars) per week until the maximum of \$100.00 (one hundred dollars) per week is reached and that prior service be considered in setting said wages; and that the salary of the Fire Chief be established at \$300.00 (three hundred dollars) per year.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 6 read by the Moderator: - "---- Authorize the Board of Selectmen to accept bids for the purchase of new combination cruiser-ambulance for use by the Police Department and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 (one thousand dollars) for same."

Motion by Frederick Felch, second by Charles Felch, that Article 6 be adopted.

Motion by Robie M. Beckman, second by Alice L. Holloway, that Article 6 be amended to read "---- to authorize a Committee of five composed of 1 selectman, 1 member at large of the Budget Committee, 1 Police Officer and 2 taxpayers to be named by the Moderator to accept -----".

Amendment defeated.
Motion carried.

ARTICLE 7 read by the Moderator: - "---- \$3,500. for purchase of wire, material and labor to extend Closed Circuit Fire Alarm System"

Motion by Charles Felch, second by Horatio Lattime, that Article 7 be adopted as read.
Carrol Pineo inquired where extensions will be.
Horatio Lattime replied last year's money would go to Weare Rd., Lake Shore Drive, Worthley Ave.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 8 read by the Moderator: - "---- petition of Robert Beale ---- install drains on, to grade, and to resurface Dwight Avenue ---- \$2,000. to defray cost of same".

Motion by Robert Beale, second by Colin W. Stard, that Article 8 be adopted as read.

Motion carried.

ARTICLE 9 read by the Moderator: "---- petition by Wilbur Fowler, Jr. ----- to set wages of employees of the Rubbish Department at \$2.00 per hour"

Motion by Louis Sampson, second by Bruce G. Brown, that Article 9 be accepted as read.

Motion by Robie M. Beckman, second by Neil Janvrin, to amend Article 9 to change wording from "employees of the Rubbish Dept." to "all hourly employees".

Motion to amend defeated. Motion carried.

ARTICLE 10 acted upon by referendum on Ballot

ARTICLE 11 read by the Moderator: "----- to authorize and empower the Selectmen, effective on the second Tuesday of March, 1968, to appoint all permanent and temporary Police Officers, including the Chief of Police -----."

Motion by Edward F. Goodwin, second by Louis Gardella, that Article 11 be accepted as read.

Yes - 33 No - 47 Motion defeated.

Motion by John B. Fowler, second by Joshua Eaton, that Article 12 be postponed indefinitely.

Moderator ruled motion temporarily out of order.

#### SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Seabrook for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

#### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Municipal Court, Trustees of Trust Funds, Special Water Account and Bi-Centennial Account.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1966 - December 31, 1967: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1966 and December 31, 1967, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$18,016.80 in 1967.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

### Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$4,466.76, plus a revenue surplus of \$1,502.86, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$5,969.62.

#### Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1967, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1967, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

#### Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit G)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1967, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit G.

#### Other Departmental and Special Accounts: (Exhibits E-1, E-2, F, H, I & J)

Statements of the activities in the Municipal Court, Trust Funds, Bond & Coupon Account, Special Water Account and Bi-Centennial Account are presented in the above exhibits.

#### AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements submitted by depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes (except 1967 property) was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

#### GENERAL COMMENTS

#### Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) decreased by \$2,993.20, from \$19,318.95 to \$17,270.59 in 1967, as shown herewith:




