### POLLS OPEN 10:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Strafford in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Strafford Elementary School in said Strafford on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

# PLEASE NOTE: Articles 2-24 will be taken up at 8:00 P.M.

- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Public Welfare, including Old Age Assistance.
- 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$6,000.00 for Class II highway construction on the Province Road North side of Bow Lake.
- 5. To see if the Town will transfer \$6,000.00 of the Capital Reserve Fund N.H. RSA 35:1 to the Class II highway construction fund of Province Road.
- 6. To see if the Town will accept the Town Road Aid and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,097.40 to which the State will contribute \$7,271.69.
- 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Highways and Bridges.
- 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for White Pine Blister Rust control program.

- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Lakes Region Association.
- 10. To see if the Town will increase hourly rate of highway labor to \$2.00 per hour.
- 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate money for Poison Ivy control.
- 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$100.00 for use of the Conservation Committee R.S.A. 36A.
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for observance of Memorial Day.
- 14. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate an increase of \$100.00 per year to each Selectman.
- 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$300.00 for maintaining and improving present swimming facilities near Bow Lake Dam.
- 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$500.00 for maintenance of Bow Lake Fire Dept.
- 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 as a donation to the Center Barnstead Fire Dept. for providing ambulance service in our area.
- 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$500.00 for operating the Town Library.
- 19. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,900.00 for control and operation of the Town Dump.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to join the Rural District health council and raise and appropriate the sum of \$775.00 in support of this organization's Visiting Nurse Services; and that the Selectmen be authorized to appoint two representatives to the Rural District Health Council.
- 21. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for use of Strafford's Sesquicentennial celebration and appoint a permanent committee.

- 22. To see if the Town will grant 2% discount on taxes paid within thirty-five days of mailing tax bills.
- 23. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### STRAFFORD'S SESQUICENTENNIAL

Planning for celebration of Strafford's 150th anniversary began June 11, 1968 as directed by the people during the March 1968 Town Meeting. A temporary Sesquicentennial Committee was organized and the following submitted for voter approval.

Antique auto rally, parades, auctions, carnival, horse show, regatta, marathon, dances, band concerts, beard-growing contest, centennial queen competition, minstrel show, summer stock theater, and local art exhibits. The committee would produce anniversary coins, plates, and medallions for sale during 1970. A special public relations and promotions unit will be formed to help insure success of the celebration.

Every Strafford citizen is welcome and encouraged to take part in preparations for the sesquicentennial.

## REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN & DISTRICT CHIEF

People cause fires. Our records show that the number of fires increase in an area as the population increases and our state is growing tremendously. This means that we all must be aware of fire causes and do our best to prevent their occurrence.

When we are very young the lighted matches is an adventure, burnt fingers and a dropped match is another fire. A little older we like to have a woodland cookout, or go out by ourselves for a smoke but fire and forests get together for another statistic. We adults like to clean up in the spring, burn the old debris and the dead grass, result — escaped fires and much personal expense.

With new homes and summer cottages located in woodlands and with abandoned fields and forests crowding the back yard of our villages' streets, it is necessary that everyone be aware all through the fire season, which comes with the disappearance of the snow, of the need to be careful with outdoor fires and fire sources.

The following action will help:

1. To teach our children the danger of lighted matches.

- 2. To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- 3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn
  - a. You need a written permit from the town fire warden for all debris burning except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooking fires in outdoor fireplaces or in charcoal brasiers in your own back yard is permitted on notification of the warden.
  - b. The warden is forbidden by regulation to allow burning of household rubbish on **grass** by householders between 9:00 A.M. and 5:00 P.M.
  - c. Have equipment on hand to control the fire **before** you light the match.
- 4. Promptly report any fire out of control to your fire warden or fire department.

Help to keep our town out of the fire occurrence column and save your tax dollars for useful purposes.

### **Tentative Warrant**

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Strafford qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby qualified to meet at the Strafford School in said district on the 18th day of March 1969, at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 2. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 3. To choose agents and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 4. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district.
- 5. To see if the district will approve the following two amendments to the articles of agreement of the Authorized Regional Enrollment Area School between Strafford and the city of Rochester:
  - H. Any incentive aid, as provided in RSA 195 A:10, I and II, shall be credited to the sending district of Strafford in the amount made for the students from each district in the Area School according to the grade level in which they are enrolled.
  - I. The written plan may be amended by the several districts comprising the region, consistent with the provisions of RSA 195-A, except that no amendment shall be effective, unless the question of adopting such amendment is submitted at an annual school district meeting to the voters of the districts voting by ballot with the use of the check list after reasonable opportunity for debate in open

meeting, and unless a majority of the voters of each district who are present and voting shall vote in favor of adopting such amendment. Furthermore, no amendment to the written plan shall be considered except at an annual meeting of the several districts and unless the text of such amendment is included in an appropriate article in the warrant of such meeting. It shall be the duty of the school board of each district to hold a public hearing concerning the adoption of any amendment to the written plan at least ten days before such annual meeting and to cause notice of such hearing and the text of the proposed amendment to be published in a newspaper having a general circulation in the area before such hearing.

As time passes, there seems to be little diminution in the size, number, or complexity of problems facing public education on any level of government-national, state, or local. Included among these are financing, housing, teacher recruitment, and, most important, maintaining a reasonable level of educational opportunity for our young people.

In New Hampshire, the problem of financing is most acute, as so great a portion of the burden falls upon the local community, in contrast with the situation in other states. At this writing, there seems little likelihood that this burden will be reduced by the creation of other sources of school monies, unless pressure is exerted on local representatives of the general court that the state must accept greater responsibility in supporting education. To date, the voters and taxpayers have risen to the task of providing a good school system for the community, and is being requested to continue to do so. However, it is time that the legislators face up to their responsibilities and implement the existing statutes by one hundred (100) percent funding and stop deceiving their constituents.

In closing, we would like to express our appreciation for the cooperation received from the citizens, school board, children and professional staff of the Strafford School District.

### SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

To the Superintendent of Schools:

As part of the school health services for the year 1967-68, all elementary pupils in Barrington, Epsom, Northwood, Nottingham and Strafford received routine health inspections by the school nurse.

This type of inspection includes weighing, measuring, checking teeth and tonsils, checking hair and scalp for the presence of head lice or any infectious condition and doing screening tests to determine if a child has any vision or hearing handicap.

Whenever defects were found, the parents were informed. This is ordinarily done by means of a note, letter or telephone call although, in many cases a home call is made by the nurse. Parents have been very cooperative in having such defects corrected, as is shown in the following summary:

A series of three immunization clinics were held in the fall of 1967 in both Barrington and Strafford. Sylvia Kennedy, M.D. of Exeter was the physician in attendance. The clinics were jointly sponsored by the New Hampshire Bureau of Public Health and local organizations — the Barrington Woman's Club and the Strafford Parent-Teachers Association.

For the first time, all five towns participated in either the Matching Funds Dental Program (which provides for filling and/or extracting teeth) or the Prophylactic Dental Program for having teeth cleaned and topical fluoride solution applied. Both programs are co-sponsored by the New Hampshire Bureau of Dental Public Health and by one or more local organizations. Epsom and Northwood again had both programs, and it is to be hoped that these will soon become an established part of the health program in each town.

The health education film "The Story of Menstruation" was shown to the majority of the girls in grades 5 through 8 in each school. This was well received and will be repeated annually for the 5th and 6th grade girls.

Referrals made by the nurse included one to New Hampshire Department of Public Welfare for custodial care of a child, three to New Hampshire Crippled Children's Service, four to Mental Health Centers for psychological evaluation and one to Camp Lincoln. Vision examinations and glasses were provided for two children — one paid for by the Concord Chapter of the Lions Club and the other by the Nottingham Chapter of the American Red Cross.

A total of 103 home calls were made, and 198 first-aid cases were cared for by the nurse. Transportation was provided to Pittsfield, Rochester, Dover, Concord and Manchester in order for certain children to receive medical care.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank Mr. Martineau, Mr. Morgan, members of the School Boards, the townspeople who sponsored and assisted in carrying out health programs, and the school children for their help and cooperation.
