








REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

YEAR ENDING MARCH, 1901.

DISTRICT No. 1.—First term taught by Miss Fales, was very successful. Second term taught by Miss Roberts was also satisfactory.

DISTRICT No. 2.—Village grammar school, first term taught by Miss Fulford. This was Miss Fulford's first school and she worked hard to advance the interests of the school, but had much to contend with. Second and third terms taught by Miss Lord. It is to be hoped that at some future time a teacher may be found who will give entire satisfaction to the people of this district. Some of the parents and many who have no children to send to school have done much faultfinding. The pupils as a natural consequence have imbibed the same spirit. The attendance has been very poor and we are sorry to say the school has not been what it should be.

PRIMARY DEPARTMENT.—First term taught by Mrs. Kelly. Mrs. Kelly did her best to interest her pupils. Second and third terms taught by Mrs. Head. We think very highly of Mrs. Head as a teacher.

DISTRICT No. 3.—First term taught by Miss Roberts. Second term by Miss Curtis. We believe this school to have been well managed and pupils made good advancement.

DISTRICT No. 4.—First term taught by Miss Foster. Miss Foster also did good work and had the interests of the school always in mind. Second term taught by Mrs. Hamlin, who is a teacher of more than ordinary ability and we were much pleased with her work.

DISTRICT No. 6.—The first term taught by Mrs. Ham, was

not a success. Second term taught by Miss Swain. Miss Swain did her best and the school seemed to improve under her management.

DISTRICT No. 7.—First and second terms taught by Miss Batchelder. Miss Batchelder is a faithful and experienced teacher. Parents, why do you not send your children to school?

DISTRICT No. 8.—This school last fall was cut short by sickness. In order to give this district the number of weeks required by law, we gave them a term of fifteen weeks this spring. Some of the pupils moving away and some of the very few remaining having attended the Piermont school in the spring. We made arrangements with the Piermont school board to school them in the fall.

DISTRICT No. 9.—First term taught by Miss French. Second by Mrs. Kelley. Mrs. Kelley did good work.

We have during the past year repaired the school houses in No. 1 and No. 6, and would suggest that one or more should be repaired each year, until all are in a better condition.
