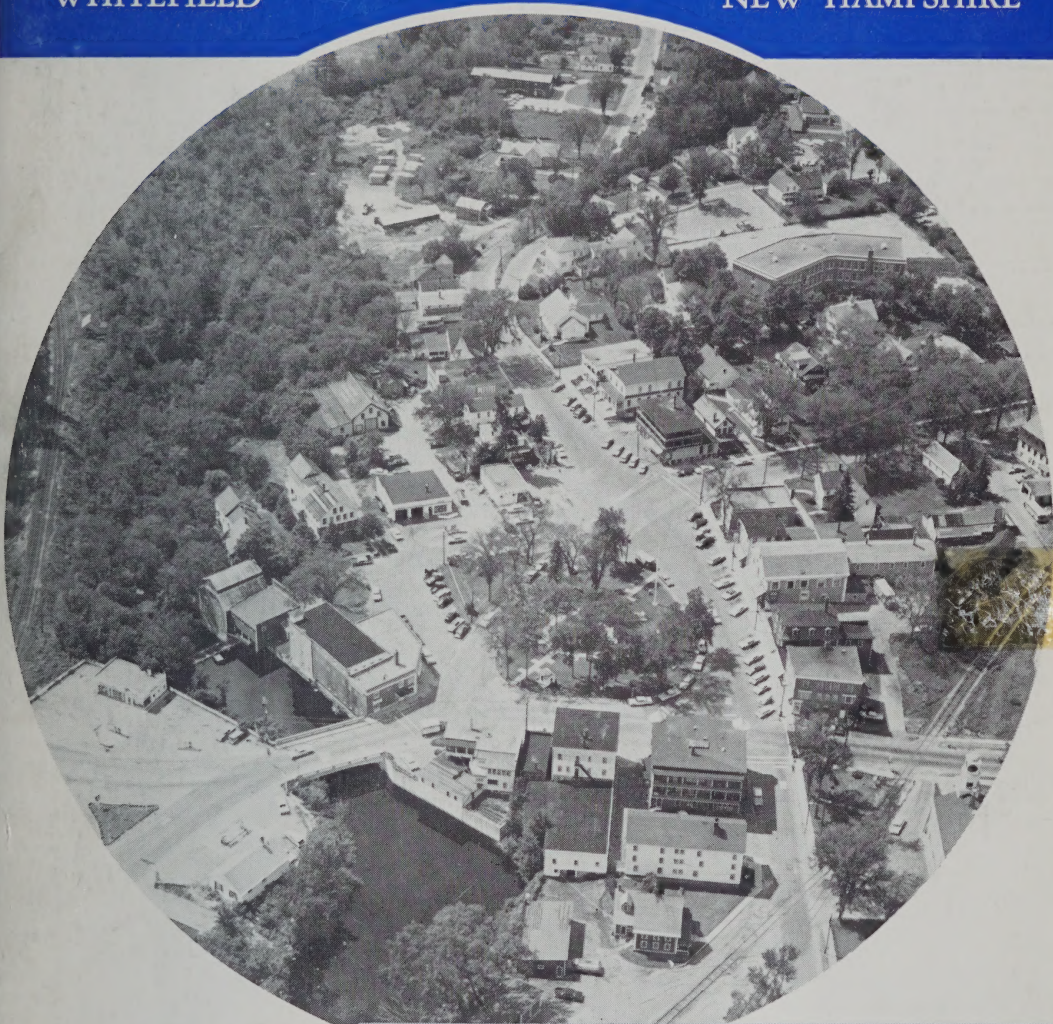

**TOWN WARRANT**

---

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs. You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the ninth day of March next, at two o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following subjects. The polls shall open for voting at nine o'clock in the forenoon and shall not close before six o'clock in the afternoon.

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, two Trust Fund Trustees, one to serve for two years and one to serve for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for:

- a. General Government
  - 1. Town Officers' Salaries
  - 2. Town Officers' Expenses
  - 3. Election and Registration Expenses
  - 4. Municipal Court Expenses
  - 5. Expenses Town Hall & Other Town Buildings
- b. Protection of Persons and Property

  - 3. Insurance
  - 4. Civil Defense
  - 5. Precinct Water and Hydrant Service
- c. Health
  - 1. Morrison Hospital
  - 2. Care of Town Dump

  2. Town Road Maintenance
  3. Street Lighting
  4. General Expenses of Highway Department

3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion, Lions Club, Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington Grange, Rotary Club, Chamber of Commerce and all church organizations for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds, or otherwise, until rescinded.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$900.00 for the overhaul and complete electrification of the tower clock on the Town Hall.

7. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a portion of old Route 116 from the Barnett homestead south.

8. To see if the Town will vote to have that part of old Route 116 otherwise known as Jefferson Road and/or the Knothole Road, entering at the property of John Dodge and ending at the property of Barnett, be changed to "Partridge Lane." (By Petition)

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$8,500.00 for the purchase of a heavy-duty truck, 2½ to 3 ton capacity. This sum to be amortized over a period of three years.

10. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal of the Town this eighteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-five, and of the independence of the United States of America the one hundred and eighty-ninth.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Whitefield for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

**Scope of Audit**

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer, Municipal Court, Trustees of Trust Funds, Cemetery Association and Regional Airport.

**Financial Statements**

**Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1963—  
December 31, 1964: (Exhibit A-1)**

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1963 and December 31, 1964, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the financial condition of the Town changed from a Surplus of \$9,185.94 to a Net Debt of \$9,436.06, in 1964.

**Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)**

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

**Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)**

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964 are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4) a revenue surplus of \$1,757.09, plus a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$1,215.65, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$2,972.74.

**Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures:  
(Exhibit B-1)**

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1964, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1964, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

**Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit J)**

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1964, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit J.

**Audit Procedure**

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipts and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.



### General Comment

#### Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$2,939.34, from \$22,411.28 to \$25,350.62, as shown herewith:

It is again noted that there are substantial amounts of uncollected taxes on the warrants of 1961 and prior years, and unredeemed taxes from the tax sales on account of the levies of 1961 and prior years, as indicated herewith:

The Tax Collector and Board of Selectmen should carefully go over the uncollected lists on these warrants and such taxes thereon as appear to be uncollectible should be abated by the Board. The inclusion of uncollectible taxes on prior years' warrants in the Balance Sheets as asset accounts year after year, tends to distort the true picture of the Town's financial condition.

The Tax Collector should deed to the Town the properties represented by the tax liens on account of the tax sales for the levies of 1961 and prior years, inasmuch as the two year period provided by law for redemptions has expired.

#### **Surety Bonds:**

The surety bonds of the Town Clerk and Town Treasurer should be increased in amount as follows:

Town Clerk—\$3,000 to \$4,000

Town Treasurer—\$18,000 to \$21,000

#### **Conclusion:**

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Whitefield for their assistance during the course of the audit.

## MORRISON HOSPITAL & ASSOCIATION REPORT

It is again with pleasure that we can take this opportunity to present a condensed summary of Morrison Hospital activities in the 1964 annual report of the Town of Whitefield. It is your community hospital and the entire scope of its operation is geared to serve your health requirements.

During 1964, Morrison Hospital fared well. The conscientious efforts of Dr. Jorge A. deVillafane, the entire hospital staff and Board of Directors made continued improvements possible in all departments. Now, with the addition to the regular medical staff of Dr. Edward F. Greer, who combines the practice of surgery with general medicine and obstetrics, further improvements will be possible where and when needed.

In its first full year of operation, the Geriatric Unit on the third floor was at near or full capacity, providing 37% of total gross earnings for the 12-month fiscal period, and an all-important service for long-term patients. Routine service income was down slightly in 1964 due largely to a physician procurement problem, but this will be rectified in 1965 with two full-time doctors in practice in Whitefield.

Fund-raising income reached a record high in 1964. Some of this money was used to reduce Building Fund indebtedness; the remainder to establish a reserve for future projects. This financial response to the hospital call was highly gratifying. Any person who contributes, regardless of amount, automatically becomes a member of the parent corporation, the Morrison Hospital Association, for that year.

Your hospital will grow as a result of improved patient care. You can help through your continued use, interest and support.

The Heaf testing program for tuberculosis was carried out in the school, and 204 individuals participated in the program. One hundred twenty-six people attended the Chest Diagnostic Clinic.

At the Immunization Clinics held in the Spring, 230 immunizations were administered. Six children attended the Orthopedic Clinics in Berlin, and three children attended the Pediatric Cardiology Clinics in Lancaster. The Standard First Aid Course was given to one of the Home Economics Classes.

To improve our community health programs, we must realize that the enjoyment of the highest standard of health is one of the fundamental rights of every human being, without distinction of race, religion, political belief, economic or social condition. The health of all peoples is fundamental to the attainment of peace and security, and is dependent upon the fullest cooperation of individuals and communities. ## WHITEFIELD VILLAGE FIRE DISTRICT

### Commissioner's Report

The year of 1964 started out to be a bad year for the Whitefield Village Fire Districts. In April, less than two weeks after the Annual Meeting, the pump on our large well on Cherry Mountain Road broke down. Subsequent inspection showed that a replacement of all parts, except the motor, was the only practical solution. All parts showed wear from continual use—for some from 20 to 25 years.

Here we were, our first budget, not two weeks old and already an unplanned-for expense of \$1,919.41. The pump was entirely renewed at the aforementioned price, and no further major system repairs were necessary during the year.

Before discussing the financial items incorporated in this report, we would like to touch briefly on the quarterly billing system that has been in effect through most of 1964. Although the new system has had general acceptance, it has met with some whole-hearted disapproval. However, it has enabled the two districts to meet their obligations on time, and with a minimum of cash transfers from one district to another. Because of quarterly billing, short term borrowing in anticipation of revenue has been kept to a minimum. One note for \$2,000.00 was issued; this was for a thirty day period and repaid within the thirty days. It is hard for the commissioners to understand why four bills per year could cause such an upset in the normal daily routine of some of our water customers. Most water users have given their full cooperation, and the commissioners feel that the quarterly billings should continue.

Reduction in the overall debt is continuing as

scheduled. Long term notes and bonded indebtedness for the two districts were reduced as follows:

In July of 1965 the final payment of \$2,000.00 on the original bonds that bought and developed District #2 will be made.

Because it is cheaper to transfer funds from one District to another, than it is to borrow, a transfer of \$500.00 was made from District #1 to District #2. This amount was repaid to District #1 within the month that the transfer was made. A permanent transfer of \$868.16 was made to District #1, thus reducing the amount due District #1 by that amount.

The operating expense item for District #1 shows an increased of \$4,391.82. This was due in part to the cost of the aforementioned pump parts on the large well on Cherry Mountain Road. The rest is due to a change in bookkeeping procedures, which allotted a larger and a fairer share of operating expense to District #1.

In District #2 operating expense decreased by \$6,178.26. A major portion of this decrease is actual. Approximately \$2,000.00 of the decrease is reflected

within the District #1 increase. A true picture of the total operating expense is as follows:

This decrease can be traced to the cost of salaries, labor, and the cost of equipment hired. In 1963 these three items totaled \$13,666.21. In 1964 these same items totaled \$11,126.00.

This is not as serious as it appears because approximately two-thirds of this amount was paid in January, 1965, and will be a part of operating revenues for this year.

Revenues from water rentals in District #1 were \$2,192.58 less than the 1963 water rentals. We cannot find any reason for this decrease, and it will have to go as unexplainable. In District #2 water rental revenue was \$3,653.26 less than in 1963. This was due to the following reasons:



1. In September and October of last year severe drought conditions and increased usage brought the water level in the Bray Hill Reservoir to a dangerously low level. Our customers were made aware of this condition and cooperated fully by sharply curtailing water usage.

2. Rate decreases were made in 1963 to the large commercial establishments.

3. Whenever accounts receivable increase, as mentioned above, revenue decreases by a like amount.

During 1964 an effort was made to establish a capital reserve fund in excess of \$3,000.00, as provided for in the 1964 budget. Because of decreased revenue this goal became unattainable. However, we are pleased to report that \$2,000.00 has been set aside in a savings account for the two districts. This year's budget provides for another \$2,000.00 to be added to capital reserve. There will be an article in this year's warrant, specifying that this fund is to be used for a new fire truck.

In the published budget for District #2, an item for the drilling of a new well has been entered for your approval. This item is listed as new construction, and is in the amount of \$10,000.00. It is the plan of the commissioners to raise this money by issuing a note in that amount. It is further the plan of the commissioners to amortize the note over a period of ten years, and with part of the \$2,000.00 that will no longer be required for payment on the original bonds. As mentioned earlier, these bonds will be paid for in July of this year.

The need for a new water source has been evident to your water department for some time. This need was made more apparent during October of 1964. District #2 started the week of October 12th with

nine inches of water over the pipe in the reservoir; by the end of the week the water level had dropped seven inches. The water level measured two inches over the top of the intake pipe. It is only with approval of this budget item that future drastic shortages such as this can be averted.

The Annual District Meeting will be held on Monday, March 29th at 8:00 P.M. Please attend this Annual Meeting. We feel that 1964 has been a year of great accomplishments. We have managed to do more toward efficient operation, on less revenue, than has been possible for many years. It is active participation of all that has enabled the districts to do this. It is this active participation that we wish to promote. So, once again, please attend the Annual Meeting of your water department.

## Program of the White Mountains Region Association 1964

The White Mountains Region Association this year has published and distributed 136,000 promotional folders and cooperated with the five other Region Associations in publishing 400,000 copies of the New Hampshire Accommodations Booklet.

We received a total of 7,500 individual inquiries about the Region which were answered with a package of folders and with personal letters. Because we are closely associated with the State of New Hampshire promotional effort, we receive in our office inquiries which are generated by the State. The Region Association's address is listed on one and one-half million individual pieces of literature published by the State.

In addition to maintaining an active and effective mailing office, the Association has encouraged and promoted many important developmental projects for the region. Such projects include Northern Ventures, a venture capital corporation to assist people who have ideas for industry; Temple Monorail System at Twin Mountain; the Kilkenny project in Lancaster; Mt. Agassiz Development in Bethlehem and Big Bear Ski area at Bartlett.

Through our Industrial Council we have changed the emphasis of industrial development of the State of New Hampshire so that it includes the northern three countries and also encourages a "do it yourself" attitude with industrial development groups.

Last year we assisted in promoting an appropriation of \$65,000 for the construction of the Whitefield Regional Airport and went on record opposing the Livermore Falls Dam in the Pemigewasset Valley.

Presently we are planning to establish an active Historical Sites Committee which will encourage the development of major historical sites in the region, an asset which we have which has not been developed to its full potential.

The work of the Association is continually hampered by a lack of adequate funds. In order to do the work necessary to raise our economy, the full support of all towns in the region is needed.
