### The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bridgewater in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Grange Hall in said Bridgewater on Tuesday the Eighth day of March to act upon the following subjects:

Polls to be open from 1 P.M. to 7 P.M. Business meeting at 8 P.M.

- 1. To chose a Selectman for three (3) years and all other necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,400.00 for the purchase of the Ford Four Wheel Drive ¾ Ton Truck, now under lease purchase agreement to the Town and to authorize the Selectmen to issue a series of notes for a period not to exceed three (3) years.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to adjust the salary of the Road Agent.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Current Maintenance Expenses for the ensuing year, as estimated in the budget, excepting the following: Highways and Bridges, Old Home Day, Newfound Area Nursing Association.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$428.74 for T.R.A., providing the State contributes \$2.837.14.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Maintenance of Highways and Bridges, Summer and Winter.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to set a reasonable charge for the plowing of driveways.

- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to reduce the current operating deficit.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,831.96 to pay principal and interest on long term note due December 17, 1960.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, not to exceed \$200.00, for the Newfound Area Nursing Association.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for the establishment of a Capital Reserve Fund, as provided in Chapter 35 RSA, for the eventual creation of a Bridgewater Fire Department.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes and to deliver inventory blanks when assessing.

### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

### Financial Condition During Fiscal Year 1959

The current deficit was reduced by \$525.02. Despite an appropriation of \$1,000.00 and unexpended balances in other departments as shown in Schedule A-3, emergency funds authorized for the Highway Department accounted for a continuing deficit.

### Highways:

As a result of the storm of Oct. 24, 1959 it became necessary to authorize an expenditure of \$1,026.25 for emergency repairs to the town roads. Considering damages to surrounding towns, our expenditure was not excessive.

Regular meetings were held with the Road Agent at least twice a month and a budget procedure followed. All bills except labor were paid by the selectmen and a continuous breakdown of payments maintained.

Despite the vote of last year's Town Meeting we feel that the Town should acquire a loader for better material handling. We also feel that a sander should be purchased from the regular Highway appropriation in the current fiscal year.

The driveway problem is still with us despite a \$1.00 fee. A total of 92 drives were serviced this winter. Common sense will indicate that this amount will defray only a very small percentage of the cost. We still recommend that the Town Meeting adopt a fee of \$10.00 per driveway.

We have placed an article in the warrant for the purchase of a 4-wheel drive truck. This vehicle has been in use by the town this winter under a lease-purchase agreement with Fred's Auto Service. After being advised by the Tax Commission that such action was proper, we leased the truck for \$175.00 per month for a term of 4 months with the stipulation that three of the payments should apply to the purchase price if the Town Meeting decides to buy the truck. We feel that it is desirable to own this vehicle rather than to hire equipment; with the Town purchasing gasoline at less than 17

cents per gallon, exempt from registration expense and able to purchase new equipment at municipal discounts with Federal taxes also removed, there can be no doubt that it is more economical to own equipment than to hire.

### Town Dump:

The many favorable comments received on the care of the Town Dump were greatly appreciated. A program of periodic bulldozing and burning, plus the use of D-Con for rat control was carried out. Through the kindness of Mr. Gustafson in allowing us to cut all tree growth back about 30 feet on his property next year's fire hazard should be greatly reduced.

For the benefit of people on the River Road an arrangement has been made with Alfred Jenness to use his dump.

### Fire Department:

Due to the interest shown in the plan for organizing a Bridgewater Fire Department we have placed an article in the warrant to raise \$500 for this purpose. It is suggested that this sum be placed in the hands of the Trustees of Trust Funds and continuing funds be raised each year until a sum be accumulated to make a fire department feasible.

### SUMMARY OF FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

### Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Bridgewater for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collecton, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets-

December 31, 1958 - December 31, 1959: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1958 and December 31, 1959, are presented in Exhibit A-1 As indicated therein, the Net Debt decreased by \$3,217.98, from \$7,598.56 to \$4,380.58 during 1959.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues:

(Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net overdraft of appropriations of \$1,213.33, less a revenue surplus of \$744.40, resulted in a net budget deficit of \$468.93.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1959, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1959, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

### AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds, were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

### GENERAL COMMENTS

### Current Deficit:

It is noted that the current deficit (excess of current liabilities over total assets) decreased from \$3,126.64 to \$2,601.62, in 1959, as shown herewith:

It is recommended that an annual deficiency appropriation of \$1,000.00 be made each year, starting with 1960, until such time as the current deficit is completely liquidated.

### Plowing Driveways:

It is noted that the Town Meeting of 1959 voted to "make an *annual* charge of one dollar (\$1.00) for snow plowing each private driveway."

It is recommended that the Town adopt a more realistic approach to this matter and inaugurate a service charge which will represent the actual cost of this service. A decision of the New Hampshire Supreme Court which was rendered a few years ago made such procedure mandatory.

From a financial standpoint, it is also necessary that such procedure be followed in view of the fact that the appropriation for "Town Maintenance" was overdrawn by \$1,431.90, which was the chief contributing factor to the continuing current deficit.

Tax Collector's Cash Book:

It is again recommended that the Tax Collecter adopt the use of the standard form of columnar cash book and that remittances to the Treasurer and the accompanying reports be made on the basis of cash book totals.

### Conclusion:

Provisions of Chapter 184, of the Laws of 1955, require that this report of the summary of findings and recommendations (Letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Bridgewater for their assistance during the course of the audit.

## PREVENTION IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

The year 1959 was fortunate from a forest fire standpoint. New Hampshire had the best record in the nation. Fewer acres were burned, suppression costs were substantially reduced and damage to woodlands held to a minimum. The record resulted from a combination of favorable weather conditions, an alert warden service and a cooperating public.

Yet, despite all this, there still persists a disturbing note. 58%, or 6 out of every 10 fires in 1959 were caused by careless smokers and debris burners. 10%, or 1 out of every 9 fires was caused by children.

Careless, indifferent, thoughtless and independent minded individuals and failure of parents to properly supervise children and keep matches out of their reach, annually cause these unnecessary fires which cost large sums to extinguish and cause extensive damage. The elimination of these three causes of fires would radically change this picture. The rules are simple —

- 1. Before burning, secure a permit from your local forest fire warden the law requires it.
- 2. Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
- 3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.
- 4. Don't throw lighted matches, cigars and cigarettes from moving vehicles use your ash tray.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Once again the Bridgewater School District needs a deficiency appropriation due to increased transportation and elementary tuition costs. At this moment, late in January, \$1300 seems to be necessary. As has been previously stated there is no way by which we can figure accurately what our tuition costs either elementary or high school will finally be 18 months from now. Where no leeway is built into a budget one may predict with some degree of certainty that deficiencies in Bridgewater will be the rule rather than the exception.

For next year tuition estimates and transportation account for the large increases in the budget. It will be necessary again to have a transportation route up Bridgewater Hill, no small item it itself.

Just for the sake of comparison, Bridgewater with an assessed valuation of \$1,310,000 has less than 70 pupils in school while Canaan with \$1,546,000 has about 370!

### SCHOOL WARRANT

## The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Bridgewater qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the River Road School House in said district on the 1st day of March 1960, at eight o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the school district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,300 the same to be made available during the current fiscal year.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
