

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of Center Harbor qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town House in said town, on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for repairs of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to hire money for town purposes, in anticipation of taxes.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise \$100.00 to defray the expenses of Memorial Day.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to raise \$756.30 to defray the expense of the electric street lights in Center Harbor Village.

- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise \$500.00 for welfare work.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise money for aid to the Laconia Hospital, and if so, how much.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$83.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise \$250.00 for care and equipment of Fire Department.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise \$200.00 for Band Concerts in Center Harbor.
- 12. To see if the town will choose an agent or agents to care for the fountain at Center Harbor Village.
- 13. To see if the town will choose a committee to take charge of the wharf and make regulations for same.
- 14. To see if the town will choose and agent or agents to care for the cemeteries throughout the town.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to accept Sate Aid for construction of roads to be expended on the Dane Road and raise the sum of \$1,248.00 for the same, the State to contribute \$2,496.00 or to accept Class V assistance, the town must raise \$237.01 and the State to contribute \$948.06.

- 16. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the cross road leading from Lewis Eastman's to the foot of Piper Hill.
- 17. To choose agents and committees in relation to any article in the warrant and hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen.
- 18. To choose a delegate to the Constitutional Convention to be held in Concord, the 2nd Wednesday of May 1938.

Any comment on the foregoing table could only be in the nature of commendation for the excellent record maintained during the past year. In every particular—length of school year, percentage of attendance, and small number of tardinesses—Center Harbor's record shows up very well in comparison with the State average. The very few tardinesses at West Center Harbor, and the distinct improvement in the Village Grammar school's record in this respect over last year, are especially to be commended.

Standardized Tests

For two years, standardized tests have been given once or twice a year to determine the proficiency of our pupils as compared with those elsewhere. Results show that our schools seem to be doing as well as the average in reading, arithmetic, and language, but are somewhat less successful in spelling. Special efforts are being made this year to reteach the ancient art of sounding letters and groups of letters. Specialists have told us that this kind of training has been overdone in past years, and that such over-emphasis has caused inefficient habits of reading. The newer methods have evidently improved our pupils' reading ability, but at the cost of some loss in ability to spell correstly.

Changes in Supervisory Unions

In accordance with a law passed by the recent session of the General Court, the number of supervisory unions in the state has again been decreased. This union now consists of the following six districts, with the number of teachers and pupils in each as indicated:

Transportation of High School Pupils

At the 1937 district meeting it was voted to defray the expense of transporting pupils to high school, the total cost not to exceed \$1.50 per week per pupil. This is a step in the direction of equalizing educational opportunity for all. At the present time 40 or more of the school districts of the state are paying part or all of the cost of high school transportation.

Our "No School" Signal

The school board has recently arranged with the fire department to sound an alarm on days when roads or weather make it expedient to close the schools. The intention is that the signal shall be used only on rare occasions, when the health and safety of the children require that they be kept at home.

The signal is ten short blasts on the fire whistle, blown at 7:30 in the morning, and indicates that there will be no session of school for the day either the Village or Town House school. At West Center Harbor, where the whistle cannot be heard, arrangements for closing the school can be made by telephone.

Conclusion

As usual, the schools owe a debt of gratitude to organizations and individuals who have cooperated in many helpful ways with teachers and school authorities. Let us continue to work together for the good of our children.

It is a pleasure to submit the following report to the Citizens of Center Harbor:

- 89 pupils were inspected
 - 7 pupils were found with defective vision
 - 1 pupil was found to be under treatment for cardiac disease
- 55 pupils were found with defective teeth
 - 5 pupils were found with symptons of diseased tonsils
 - 5 cases of measles were reported
- 70 visits to schools
- 51 visits to homes
- 53 pupils were transported to Meredith for dental treatment in Dr. Pottle's office.

Report of the Dental Clinic

- 45 pupils were examined
- 38 pupils were treated
- 37 had their work completed
- 29 cleanings were done
 - 5 temporary teeth were extracted
 - 1 pernament tooth was extracted
- 65 Amalgam fillings were made
- 18 porcelain fillings were made
 - 1 x-ray was taken

7 patients received novacaine 126 total operations

The above work was almost wholly paid for by the parents. Some aid was given by the Red Cross.

The children in Center Harbor are unusually free from physical defects.

The regular co-operation with the Dental Clinic has certainly reduced the cost of the yearly visit to the dentist to the minimum.

Thanks are due to all who have helped completion of the school program.
