ANNUAL REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

The Health Services offered the children of Chatham School for the school year 1954-65 included vision testing, hearing testing weighting and measuring, individual health inspections and patch testing for tuberculosis-new entries and grades one, four and seven.

The interest shown by the children and parents in following-up on defects discovered, either in their physical examination program at Memorial Hospital for grades one, four and seven or in the screening programs at the school was good.

With the realization that primary responsibility for the health of children rests with the home, it is gratifying to find the child's attitude toward health procedures acceptable as part of growing up. Their regard for 'Their Doctor' as a good friend who tries to keep them well - the enthusiasm they show when they have received boosters for continued protection against Diptheria, Tetanus, Small Pox, Polio and Measles is a credit to all concerned.

The teacher has every child's interest at heart and is alert to observe any diversity from normal among her pupils.

Although dental problems continue to be one of the outstanding defects found, it is encouraging to find the number of pupils who have had timely dental care. Also the interest in proper nutrition as it effects the child and his future, not only in regards to good teeth but also to optimum health and its relation to the learning process.

I wish to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to everyone who has helped to make this program possible.

Most of us who live in New Hampshire and the thousands of vacationists that visit us every year love the State for the variegated woodlands that encircle our clean lakes and clothe the hills and mountains. Most of us appreciate these values, but still there were enough careless people among us to cause over 880 grass and woodland fires to start in 1965. True this was a much dryer than normal year but this should have meant the use of extra care. Fortunately the fire fighting forces have held the line against such careless acts. It is up to each one of us to be ever mindful that a spark or flame is a potential fire.

WE MUST ALL BE CAREFUL:

- To teach our children the danger of lighting matches.
- To never discard lighted smoking material from a car or while walking through fields or woods.
- 3. To safely dispose of rubbish preferably at the town dump. If you must burn rubbish or brush:
 - a. Always get a permit to burn from the warden.
 - b. Start your fire late in the day after 5 p.m.
 - c. If burning a field or brush have equipment and adequate help on hand. The heat from your fire creates its own draft to spread fire.

Our carelessness with fire is costing our State and Towns thousands of wasted dollars in suppression and hundreds of acres of destroyed woodlands. Yours never to enjoy.
