Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,122.83 for Town Road Aid, thereby receiving an additional \$7,485.55 from the State.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$11,000.00 for Winter Maintenance of Roads. (\$9,000.00 approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the repair and up-

keep of Highway Equipment. (Approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$16,000.00 for Summer Road Maintenance. (Approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 to continue the Road Improvement Plan on our Town Highways. The location of the work to be under the supervision of the Selectmen in cooperation with the Road Committee. (Approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new Fire Truck of class A specifications, cost not to exceed \$15,700.00 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,300.00 this year. The balance to be paid in five yearly payments of \$2,000.00 each. The Fire truck reserve fund of \$3,425.63 to be used to make the total amount. (Submitted without recommendation.)

Article 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for a new roof on the West Chesterfield Fire station. (Approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 to participate in Tone Control for the South-western New Hampshire Fire Mutual Aid System. (Approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise a sum not to exceed \$3,500.00 for the purpose of installing a furnace, new toilet facilities and insulating the ceiling in the Town Hall. (Submitted without recommendation.)

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for drainage and black top surface on Welcome Hill Road, beginning where the present reconstruction ends and continuing up the hill as far as the appropriation will permit. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to open the road leading from West Chesterfield to Cobleigh corner, and build a bridge for light traffic with the \$2,500.00 appropriated in 1960 and also form a committee to look into this situation. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for the advancement of Civil Defense and maintaining the Auxiliary Police Force. (Approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum, not to exceed of \$5,000.00, to hire a full time Police Officer, to be known as Chief of Police, Town of Chesterfield. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to maintain the Police Department. (No approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to rezone from residential to limited Commercial for specific use as a parking lot a triangular parcel of land across the channel from the so called "Bud & Dolly's Restaurant" with frontage of approximately 250 feet on the channel and approximately 300 feet on the North Shore Road.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$15,664.45 from the Etta L. Hubbard Trust, said Trust to be deposited with the Trustees of Trust Funds, the income to be paid at the end of each year to the Treasurer of the Chesterfield Library for the support of Town Libraries.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from Maurice L. Amidon, the income from same to be paid to C. W. C. A. for the perpetual care and upkeep of the Lorenzo S. and Maurice L. Amidon Burial Lot and to be known as the Lorenzo S. and Maurice L. Amidon Trust Fund.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.00 from Francis W. Oakes, the income from same to be paid to C. W. C. A. for the perpetual care and upkeep of the Amidon-Stewart Burial Lot.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to adopt revised zoning and building ordinances recommended by the Planning Board to supersede the ordinances now in effect.

Article 28. To hear reports of Standing Committees and act thereon.

Article 29. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

TOWN MEETING 1961

Proceedings of the Annual Meeting of the voters of the Town of Chesterfield, New Hampshire, called at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, March 14, 1961.

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, James E. O'Neil, at three o'clock in the afternoon and the Warrant through Article 1 was read by him. He then declared the polls open for balloting for all necessary Town Officers.

At six-thirty o'clock the Moderator called the meeting to order and asked if there were any objections to recessing the meeting for ten or fifteen minutes to see if more voters might come into the hall. Hearing no objections he declared the meeting in recess. At six-forty-five he again called the meeting to order.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by George Joslin to dispense with the reading of the rest of the Warrant. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

The Articles of the Warrant were then disposed of as follows:

Article 2. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Clifford E. Chickering and supported by Winston Cray to use the same method of collecting taxes for the ensuing year as in the past. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 3. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Agnes Chickering and supported by Ronald Guyette to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 4. The Chairman of the Budget Committee reported that they held three meetings, that at the public meeting there was a good discussion and that their report was given on pages 23 to 26 inclusive of the Town Report. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Ronald Guyette and supported by Richard Goodell to accept the report as given. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 5. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Harry Winn to take up Article 6 next. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 6. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Oscar Ericson to pass over this article concerning having the annual audit of the town's accounts for the year 1961 made by the Division of Municipal Accounting of the State Tax Commission, and to make an appropriation, to cover the cost of the audit. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article was passed over.

Article 7. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Welcome and supported by Harry Winn to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 for street lighting. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 8. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Joseph James to raise and appropriate the sum of \$238.00 (1/100th of 1% of the valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 9. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Joslin and supported by Paul Welcome to accept

the recommendation of the Budget Committee and raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 toward the operating cost of Elliot Community Hospital. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 10. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Floyd Fuller to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,139.21 for Town Road Aid, thereby receiving an additional \$7,594.76 from the State. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 11. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Joseph James to raise the sum of \$9,000.00 for Winter Maintenance of Roads. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 12. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Ronald Guyette and supported by Oscar Ericson to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the repair and upkeep of Highway Equipment. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 13. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Joseph James to amend the Article and raise the sum of \$16,000.00 for Summer Road Maintenance, earmarking \$4,000.00 for oil and \$12,000.00 for maintenance. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. A voice vote on the motion as amended was declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 14. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Clifford Chickering to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 to continue the so-called Long Range Program on our Town Highways and that the amount not spent on the Harlan Fiske Stone Memorial Drive last year out of the amount raised be earmarked out of this sum this year and the remainder be spent under the supervision of the Selectmen. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 15. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Marjorie Stoddard and supported by Alfred Champney to open the road leading from West Chesterfield to Cobleigh Corner and appropriate the sum of \$6,500.00 to be used with the Capitol Reserve Fund of \$2,500.00 appropriated in 1960, to construct a sectional pipe arch to replace the bridge on said road; \$2,500.00 to be raised this year and the balance in long term notes for two years. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative and therefore lost. This was not approved by the Budget Committee.

Article 16. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Joseph James that we raise the sum of \$450.00 to be spent with an offered gift of \$200.00 by Mr. Richter toward the project for drainage and blacktop surface on the road leading from Atherton Hill Road a distance of 550 feet past the Fritz Richter, Sr. property known as the "Erbhof". Vote was declared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative and therefore lost.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry to amend the Article to read "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for drainage and blacktop surface on the road leading from the Atherton Hill Road a distance of 550 feet past the Fritz Richter, Sr. property known as the "Erbof" if Mr. Richter will assume the rest of the cost. This motion was supported by Arvid Pearson. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Ronald Guyette to adopt the Article as amended. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 17. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Welcome and supported by Winford Chickering to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for drainage and blacktop surface on Welcome Hill Road, beginning where the present reconstruction ends and continuing up the hill as far as the appropriation will permit. Vote de-

clared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative and therefore lost.

Article 18. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Barrett and supported by Dexter Thomas to pass over the Article concerning raising and appropriating the sum, not to exceed \$1,000.00, to improve by drainage and blacktop surface the section of the so-called Maple Road from Route No. 9 to Route No. 9A. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and therefore passed over.

Article 19. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by William E. Walston to allocate the Town Road Aid money to continue the improvement of and/or reconstruction of the Old Westmoreland Road to the Westmoreland Town Line or as far as the funds will extend such improvement. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. George Joslin explained that the State may require the road to be finished first that was started last year.

Article 20. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Marjorie Stoddard and supported by JoAnn Morse to pass over this Article concerning the installing of a street light at the west end of Maple Lane where it connects with Route 9, and to raise \$25.00 to pay for same. Vote declared by Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 21. Voted by voice vote on motion made by JoAnn Morse and supported by Russell Johnson to pass over the Article concerning providing street lights on Route 63, south from the last existing light opposite the Chesterfield Inn, these lights to be placed at reasonable intervals and especially at the corners near the Town Garage, the road leading to the Frank Hubner and the James O'Neil properties and the road leading to the Grout-Mitchener and the Gordon Kendall properties. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 22. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Joseph James and supported by Anna Hubner to pass over the Article concerning installing a street light at the intersection of Maple Road and Route No. 9A, and raising the sum of \$25.00 to pay for the same. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 23. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Barrett and supported by Daphne Ericson to dispense with reading the entire Article. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by George Barrett to amend the Zoning and Building Regulations of the Town of Chesterfield as provided by Article 7 thereof by deleting Article 1 thereof and adding in place thereof the following:

Article 1

For the purpose of these Zoning and Building Regulations, the Town of Chesterfield is divided into two districts as follows: (1) Residential District No. 1, namely all lands to a depth of five hundred feet on each side, from the center line of all paved Public Roads and Highways in existence within the Town of Chesterfield and any additional roads that may be hereafter paved; (2) Residential District No. 2, all other lands within the Town of Chesterfield. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Russell Johnson to amend Section A1 to be not less than 10,000 sq. ft.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Harry Pierce to amend Article 2, Section A1 to read "with a frontage of no less than 75 feet." The Moderator declared that the "Nos" had it. This vote was challenged and the Moderator called for a show of hands with George Joslin and Winston Cray, Selectmen, as

counters. This resulted in a tie with "Yes" having 52 votes and "No" having 52 votes. The Moderator declared the motion lost.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Paul Welcome to amend the Article to read "with a frontage of no less than 50 feet". This vote was declared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative and to be lost.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by James Lyons and supported by Jane Allen to accept the Article as first amended as follows:

To amend the Zoning and Building Regulations of the Town of Chesterfield as provided by Article 7 thereof by amending Article 2A to read as follows:

Article 2

Section A. Every dwellinghouse or camp to be established in Residential District No. 1, specified in Article 1, shall have a minimum ground floor area of six hundred square feet, approximately 20x30 feet, for each family unit, and shall be placed on a permanent foundation or continuous supporting wall of masonry, masonry units, concrete or other similar materials, extending at least 3 feet below normal ground level.

Exception: This provision shall not affect motels or cabins, used for guests staying overnight or by the week, and cottages not used the year around.

Section A1. The minimum land area for each dwelling shall not be less than 10,000 square feet with a frontage of no less than 100 feet.

Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Robert Woodman and supported by JoAnn Morse to amend the Zoning and Building Regulations of the Town of Chesterfield as provided in Article 7 thereof by adding the following sec-

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 for the advancement of Civil Defense and maintaining the Auxiliary Police Force. (Approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum, not to exceed of \$5,000.00, to hire a full time Police Officer, to be known as Chief of Police, Town of Chesterfield. (Not approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to maintain the Police Department. (No approved by the Budget Committee.)

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to rezone from residential to limited Commercial for specific use as a parking lot a triangular parcel of land across the channel from the so called "Bud & Dolly's Restaurant" with frontage of approximately 250 feet on the channel and approximately 300 feet on the North Shore Road.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$15,664.45 from the Etta L. Hubbard Trust, said Trust to be deposited with the Trustees of Trust Funds, the income to be paid at the end of each year to the Treasurer of the Chesterfield Library for the support of Town Libraries.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 from Maurice L. Amidon, the income from same to be paid to C. W. C. A. for the perpetual care and upkeep of the Lorenzo S. and Maurice L. Amidon Burial Lot and to be known as the Lorenzo S. and Maurice L. Amidon Trust Fund.

Article 26. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$200.00 from Francis W. Oakes, the income from same to be paid to C. W. C. A. for the perpetual care and upkeep of the Amidon-Stewart Burial Lot.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to adopt revised zoning and building ordinances recommended by the Planning Board to supersede the ordinances now in effect.

Article 28. To hear reports of Standing Committees and act thereon.

Article 29. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

TOWN MEETING 1961

Proceedings of the Annual Meeting of the voters of the Town of Chesterfield, New Hampshire, called at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, March 14, 1961.

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, James E. O'Neil, at three o'clock in the afternoon and the Warrant through Article 1 was read by him. He then declared the polls open for balloting for all necessary Town Officers.

At six-thirty o'clock the Moderator called the meeting to order and asked if there were any objections to recessing the meeting for ten or fifteen minutes to see if more voters might come into the hall. Hearing no objections he declared the meeting in recess. At six-forty-five he again called the meeting to order.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by George Joslin to dispense with the reading of the rest of the Warrant. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

The Articles of the Warrant were then disposed of as follows:

Article 2. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Clifford E. Chickering and supported by Winston Cray to use the same method of collecting taxes for the ensuing year as in the past. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 3. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Agnes Chickering and supported by Ronald Guyette to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 4. The Chairman of the Budget Committee reported that they held three meetings, that at the public meeting there was a good discussion and that their report was given on pages 23 to 26 inclusive of the Town Report. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Ronald Guyette and supported by Richard Goodell to accept the report as given. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 5. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Harry Winn to take up Article 6 next. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 6. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Oscar Ericson to pass over this article concerning having the annual audit of the town's accounts for the year 1961 made by the Division of Municipal Accounting of the State Tax Commission, and to make an appropriation, to cover the cost of the audit. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article was passed over.

Article 7. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Welcome and supported by Harry Winn to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,200.00 for street lighting. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 8. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Joseph James to raise and appropriate the sum of \$238.00 ($1/100$ th of 1% of the valuation of the Town) to the Monadnock Region Association of Southwestern New Hampshire for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, and by other means calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in cooperation with the other thirty-seven towns of the Monadnock Region. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 9. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Joslin and supported by Paul Welcome to accept

the recommendation of the Budget Committee and raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 toward the operating cost of Elliot Community Hospital. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 10. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Floyd Fuller to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,139.21 for Town Road Aid, thereby receiving an additional \$7,594.76 from the State. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 11. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Joseph James to raise the sum of \$9,000.00 for Winter Maintenance of Roads. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 12. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Ronald Guyette and supported by Oscar Ericson to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the repair and upkeep of Highway Equipment. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 13. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Joseph James to amend the Article and raise the sum of \$16,000.00 for Summer Road Maintenance, earmarking \$4,000.00 for oil and \$12,000.00 for maintenance. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. A voice vote on the motion as amended was declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 14. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Clifford Chickering to raise the sum of \$3,000.00 to continue the so-called Long Range Program on our Town Highways and that the amount not spent on the Harlan Fiske Stone Memorial Drive last year out of the amount raised be earmarked out of this sum this year and the remainder be spent under the supervision of the Selectmen. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 15. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Marjorie Stoddard and supported by Alfred Champney to open the road leading from West Chesterfield to Cobleigh Corner and appropriate the sum of \$6,500.00 to be used with the Capitol Reserve Fund of \$2,500.00 appropriated in 1960, to construct a sectional pipe arch to replace the bridge on said road; \$2,500.00 to be raised this year and the balance in long term notes for two years. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative and therefore lost. This was not approved by the Budget Committee.

Article 16. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Joseph James that we raise the sum of \$450.00 to be spent with an offered gift of \$200.00 by Mr. Richter toward the project for drainage and blacktop surface on the road leading from Atherton Hill Road a distance of 550 feet past the Fritz Richter, Sr. property known as the "Erbhof". Vote was declared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative and therefore lost.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry to amend the Article to read "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450.00 for drainage and blacktop surface on the road leading from the Atherton Hill Road a distance of 550 feet past the Fritz Richter, Sr. property known as the "Erbhof" if Mr. Richter will assume the rest of the cost. This motion was supported by Arvid Pearson. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Ronald Guyette to adopt the Article as amended. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 17. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Welcome and supported by Winford Chickering to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for drainage and blacktop surface on Welcome Hill Road, beginning where the present reconstruction ends and continuing up the hill as far as the appropriation will permit. Vote de-

clared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative and therefore lost.

Article 18. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Barrett and supported by Dexter Thomas to pass over the Article concerning raising and appropriating the sum, not to exceed \$1,000.00, to improve by drainage and blacktop surface the section of the so-called Maple Road from Route No. 9 to Route No. 9A. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and therefore passed over.

Article 19. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by William E. Walston to allocate the Town Road Aid money to continue the improvement of and/or reconstruction of the Old Westmoreland Road to the Westmoreland Town Line or as far as the funds will extend such improvement. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. George Joslin explained that the State may require the road to be finished first that was started last year.

Article 20. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Marjorie Stoddard and supported by JoAnn Morse to pass over this Article concerning the installing of a street light at the west end of Maple Lane where it connects with Route 9, and to raise \$25.00 to pay for same. Vote declared by Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 21. Voted by voice vote on motion made by JoAnn Morse and supported by Russell Johnson to pass over the Article concerning providing street lights on Route 63, south from the last existing light opposite the Chesterfield Inn, these lights to be placed at reasonable intervals and especially at the corners near the Town Garage, the road leading to the Frank Hubner and the James O'Neil properties and the road leading to the Grout-Mitchener and the Gordon Kendall properties. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 22. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Joseph James and supported by Anna Hubner to pass over the Article concerning installing a street light at the intersection of Maple Road and Route No. 9A, and raising the sum of \$25.00 to pay for the same. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 23. Voted by voice vote on motion made by George Barrett and supported by Daphne Ericson to dispense with reading the entire Article. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by George Barrett to amend the Zoning and Building Regulations of the Town of Chesterfield as provided by Article 7 thereof by deleting Article 1 thereof and adding in place thereof the following:

Article 1

For the purpose of these Zoning and Building Regulations, the Town of Chesterfield is divided into two districts as follows: (1) Residential District No. 1, namely all lands to a depth of five hundred feet on each side, from the center line of all paved Public Roads and Highways in existence within the Town of Chesterfield and any additional roads that may be hereafter paved; (2) Residential District No. 2, all other lands within the Town of Chesterfield. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Russell Johnson to amend Section A1 to be not less than 10,000 sq. ft.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Harry Pierce to amend Article 2, Section A1 to read "with a frontage of no less than 75 feet." The Moderator declared that the "Nos" had it. This vote was challenged and the Moderator called for a show of hands with George Joslin and Winston Cray, Selectmen, as

counters. This resulted in a tie with "Yes" having 52 votes and "No" having 52 votes. The Moderator declared the motion lost.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Harry Winn and supported by Paul Welcome to amend the Article to read "with a frontage of no less than 50 feet". This vote was declared by the Moderator to be carried in the negative and to be lost.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by James Lyons and supported by Jane Allen to accept the Article as first amended as follows:

To amend the Zoning and Building Regulations of the Town of Chesterfield as provided by Article 7 thereof by amending Article 2A to read as follows:

Article 2

Section A. Every dwellinghouse or camp to be established in Residential District No. 1, specified in Article 1, shall have a minimum ground floor area of six hundred square feet, approximately 20x30 feet, for each family unit, and shall be placed on a permanent foundation or continuous supporting wall of masonry, masonry units, concrete or other similar materials, extending at least 3 feet below normal ground level.

Exception: This provision shall not affect motels or cabins, used for guests staying overnight or by the week, and cottages not used the year around.

Section A1. The minimum land area for each dwelling shall not be less than 10,000 square feet with a frontage of no less than 100 feet.

Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Robert Woodman and supported by JoAnn Morse to amend the Zoning and Building Regulations of the Town of Chesterfield as provided in Article 7 thereof by adding the following sec-

tions or regulations pertaining to trailers and Trailer or Mobile Home Parks.

Article 2

Provisions: Applicable only to District No. 1 unless otherwise so specified in the section.

Section K. Trailer Parks or Mobile Home Parks will be permitted in Residential District No. 2, and shall conform to the following specifications:

1. None shall be smaller than (5) acres or larger than (10) acres in size.

2. The individual lots within the Park shall be no less than 40 x 60 feet in size.

3. The Parks must be screened on the two sides and the rear by a vegetative buffer 20 feet wide, composed of trees or shrubs or a combination of both.

4. All Trailer and Mobile Home Parks shall meet the minimum standards of sanitation as set forth by the New Hampshire State Department of Health.

Section L. A single Trailer or Mobile Home may be located anywhere in the Town provided it meets the minimum standards as follows:

1. It shall be located on a lot with a minimum of 10,000 square feet, with a 100 foot frontage.

2. It must be placed on a permanent foundation or continuous supporting wall of masonry, masonry units, concrete or other similar materials, extending at least 3 feet below normal ground level.

3. It shall conform to the minimum standards of sanitation as set forth by the New Hampshire State Department of Health.

4. Such Trailers and Mobile Homes shall be considered buildings or dwellings within the terms of this ordinance.

Section M. The temporary parking of a single trailer or mobile home outside a trailer or Mobile Home Park, or their use as temporary living quarters within the Town shall be permitted for a period of not more than 30 days in any one year.

Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Robert Woodman and supported by Joseph James to accept the following:

Definitions

A trailer, trailer coach or mobile home, within the terms of these regulations, means any vehicle or similar portable structure used for sleeping or living purposes.

A mobile home or trailer park is land upon which two or more mobile homes or trailers are parked and occupied for living purposes, regardless whether or not a charge is made for such accommodations.

Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 24. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Oscar Ericson and supported by Joseph James to pass over this Article concerning raising and appropriating the sum of \$200.00 for maintaining the Civil Defense unit and the procurement of small items that become available under surplus. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 25. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Paul Lawton and supported by Joseph James to pass over this article concerning the raising and appropriating the sum of \$600.00 to establish a Civil Defense Headquarters by renovating the old wood shed at the Town Hall into a completed room. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 26. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Robert Woodman and supported by Joseph James to pass over the Article concerning the raising and appropriating the sum of \$1,200.00 for the purchase of First Aid Equipment to be used by Civil Defense and the Town in any emergency. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 27. Voted by voice vote on motion made by JoAnn Morse and supported by Joseph James to pass over this Article concerning the raising and appropriating the sum of \$2,500.00 for two 5000 watt portable gasoline generators for West Chesterfield and Spofford and one 10,000 watt unit for Chesterfield to be used by Civil Defense and the Town in any emergency. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article Passed over.

Article 28. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Oscar Ericson and supported by Joseph James to pass over this Article concerning the raising and appropriating the sum of \$702.00 for three Gonset radios for Civil Defense. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 29. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Joseph James to amend the Article and raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 instead of \$1,500 for equipment of a Civil Defense Auxiliary Police Force. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Raymond Clark to accept the Article as amended. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 30. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by James Lyons to pass over the Article to instruct the Selectmen to adopt a card and sticker system for taxpayers and bona fide guests for controlling the use of all entrances to Spofford Lake. Vote

declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative and the Article passed over.

Article 31. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Ronald Guyette and supported by Winford Chickering to amend the Article and leave out the word "picnicking". Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Oscar Ericson and supported by Ronald Guyette to instruct the Selectmen to post signs at the two public entrances to Spoford Lake prohibiting dogs not on leash, car washing and disrobing. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 32. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Clifford Chickering and supported by George Joslin to accept the sum of \$200.00 from the Carl F. Carlson Estate; this sum to be added to the Byard-Chickering Trust Fund, and the income from same to be used for the perpetual care and maintenance of the Byard-Chickering burial lot in the Chesterfield West Cemetery, and to be known hereafter as the Byard-Chickering-Carlson Trust Fund. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 33. Voted by voice on motion made by Winston Cray and supported by George Joslin to accept the sum of \$150.00 from the Madeline D. Allen Estate, the income from same to be paid to C.W.C.A., for the care and upkeep of the Raymond D. Allen Lot No. 67 in Chesterfield West Cemetery. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 34. Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Oscar Ericson to accept the sum of \$200.00 from Hattie Pond, to be known as the Charlie Pond Trust Fund, the income to be paid to C.W.C.A. for the perpetual care and upkeep of the Charlie Pond Lot in Chesterfield West Cemetery. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 35. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Winston Cray and supported by Oscar Ericson to accept

the sum of \$100.00 from William and Elizabeth Johnson, to be known as the Oramel Holden-Day Trust Fund, for the perpetual care of the north-west corner lot in the Robertson burial ground. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Article 5. Voted by voice vote on motion made by Robert Woodman and supported by Harry Winn to add the sum of \$500.00 to No. 4, expenses of Town Hall and other buildings, said added sum for repairs and improvement on the Town Garage. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Anna Hubner that the painting of the Garage be let out to contract. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Otto Schlichting and supported by Grace Kearney to purchase lights from the school and install them in the Hall. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by Arvid Pearson and supported by Russell Johnson to accept Article 5 as amended and raise the following sums of money for:

The Board members shall consist of one Selectman and four (or six) other citizens appointed by the Selectmen, as provided in Sections 1-15, Chapter 53, Revised Laws of New Hampshire 1942, as amended. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Voted by voice vote on motion made by H. Claude Mowry and supported by Daphne Ericson that the regulations on new road construction be printed in next year's report. Vote declared by the Moderator to be carried in the affirmative.

Otto Schlichting, Sexton, suggested that the road to the Noyes-Robertson Cemetery be kept passable.

George Joslin asked for a rising vote of thanks to the Moderator for the excellent way in which he conducted the meeting.

The Moderator declared the Ballot Box closed and a

**THE REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF
THE ROAD IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE ARE
AS FOLLOWS:**

1. The program of long range improvement of roads should be continued with the expenditure of \$3,000 this year for this purpose.

2. In order that effects of those improvements are not gradually dissipated, minimum standards of construction should be observed. Specifically, each section to be improved should be adequately drained, be cleared as required of trees and brush, and surfaced with asphalt.

3. In accordance with the above, it is suggested that the following sections, previously improved under this program, be surfaced with asphalt this year in the order indicated: the section of the road to the Harlan Fiske Stone Memorial, the uncompleted section of the Lincoln Road off old Route 9, and the Streeter Hill Road. As required, this may include clearing of brush and trees, cleaning of ditches and pipes, top dressing and grading with gravel, and surfacing with asphalt.

4. The committee plans to continue the study and development of a long range program considering maintenance costs, present and future anticipated traffic requirements, and the TRA program to improve further such sections of our road system as may be economically feasible to the minimum specifications above.

5. It is also suggested that the elected or appointed road agent be made a permanent member of this committee, in order that the best advantage may be had of his intimate knowledge of our road system in the review of present and future road improvement programs.

**REPORT OF PROVISIONS FOR
ACCEPTING TOWN ROADS**

1. There must be permanent homes already built on the road to be accepted.
2. The right of way must be at least fifty (50) feet wide, plus slope and drainage easements.
3. The person or persons wishing to have the Town accept the road shall pay for all culverts and suitable drainage, and shall build the road with at least 12 inches of gravel 18 feet wide at no cost to the Town.
4. All dead-end roads shall be supplied with sufficient right of way to enable plows and other equipment to turn around.
5. The layout and design of the road shall be approved by Selectmen prior to construction.

REPORT OF BUILDING INSPECTOR FOR 1961

The past year again shows an increase in building activity in the town of Chesterfield. Fifty-four permits were issued. Twenty-seven are still in process or have not been approved. Many hours have been spent in the past checking permits to find if work has been completed. This inspector now feels that building regulations have been in effect long enough in Chesterfield so that any person not obtaining a permit will be treated as a violator, or any person having a permit not reporting work completed shall be considered in violation upon the expiration of the permit.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank all those who have been co-operative the past year.

H. Claude Mowry made the motion, supported by George Moehle, to authorize the Commissioners to dispose of the Buffalo truck, the proceeds to be used to buy new equipment.

Vote was in the affirmative.

Jane J. Allen made the motion, supported by Harold E. Foster, that the proceedings of this meeting and also

the itemized budget, be printed in next year's Town report and every year thereafter.

To the inhabitants of the school district in the town of Chesterfield qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the school in said district on the 10th day of March, 1962, at 3 o'clock in the afternoon to bring in your votes for the election of the following officials: (Polls will open at 3 P.M. and close not earlier than 9 P.M.)

1. A moderator for the coming year.
A clerk for the ensuing year.
A member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
A treasurer for the ensuing year.
Two auditors for the ensuing year.

You are hereby further notified to meet at the School at 8 P.M. on March 10, 1962 to take up the following:

2. To determine and appoint the salaries of school board members and the truant officer, and to fix the compensation of any other officer or agents of the district.

3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To choose agents, auditors and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

5. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers, auditors and agents,

for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of any sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

6. To see if the district will raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$100,000. for the design, construction and equipment of an addition to the Chesterfield Central School and in order to provide these funds authorize the school board to issue serial notes or bonds on the credit of the district for all or any portion of the amount so appropriated, further authorize the school board to determine the time and place of payment, the rate of interest and to do any or all acts as they deem necessary to their issuance in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act RSA 33 and any amendments relating thereto and to authorize the school board to enter into all contracts for the design, construction and equipment of the addition.

7. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to enter into a tuition contract with the Keene School Board for the tuition of Chesterfield's Grades 7 through 12 and furnish transportation. (Add to basic budget \$17,751.)

8. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to enter into a tuition contract with the Keene School Board for tuition of Chesterfield's Grades 7 through 12 and furnish transportation for the 7th and 8th Grades only. (Add to basic budget \$13,101.)

9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to enter into tuition contracts with the Brattleboro School Board and the Keene School Board for the tuition of Chesterfield's Grades 9 through 12 and with

the Keene School Board for tuition of Grades 7 and 8 and furnish transportation for 7th and 8th grades only. (Add to basic budget \$18,379.)

10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to enter into tuition contracts with the Brattleboro School Board and the Keene School Board for tuition of Chesterfield's Grades 7 through 12 with transportation for 7th and 8th grades only. (Add to basic budget \$23,765.)

11. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to enter into tuition contracts with the Keene School District for tuition at Keene High School at the rate of \$515. per pupil, and the Brattleboro School District for tuition at Brattleboro High School at the rate of \$645.50 per pupil or any other approved High School.

12. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.) as its share of Supervisory Union contribution to the New Hampshire Educational Television Channel WENH.

13. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.) as matching funds for funds available under provision of the National Defense Education Act and to authorize the School Board to accept and use, in the name of the district, any Federal funds for public school education.

14. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to allow the Chesterfield Tiny Tots Kindergarten to use an empty room in the school, if available, rent for classroom space to be determined by the School Board.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT TO THE CHESTERFIELD SCHOOL DISTRICT

It is a pleasure to submit my third annual report to the citizens of Chesterfield.

School opened in September with an enrollment of 283 pupils, an increase of 33 over last year. This created a very heavy classroom pupil enrollment, especially for grades one, three, and four. Upon very careful study with the help of the School Board and Town Budget Committee it was decided to apply to the State Department of Education for permission to hire two additional teachers at a

cost of \$8,000 to take care of the increase enrollments. The State Department of Education granted our request and two additional teachers were hired immediately. The first grade was divided and preparations made in the cafeteria for the extra classroom space, and a combination class was made from grades three and four using areas in the corridor for space. I would like to commend our teaching staff for the outstanding work and service offered during this period of adjusting and solving the problem of heavy classroom enrollments. Our staff includes the following: Mr. Robert Bellavance, Principal, grades seven and eight; Mr. George Adams, grades seven and eight; Mrs. Margaret Hurley, grade six; Mr. John Letourneau, grade 5; Mrs. Barbara Mackey, grade four; Mrs. Eleanor Fuller, grade three; Mrs. Dorris Parker, grade 2; Mrs. June Derjue, grade one; Mrs. Barbara Lammela, grade one; and Mrs. Willa Moore, combination grades three and four.

It is hoped that the citizens of Chesterfield will consider in the immediate future the very serious problem of overcrowded conditions. The constantly increasing pupil enrollment has grown now to the height of not finding space in our school for this growth. The School Board, Selectmen, and Budget Committee have all given time and effort in studying our school problems and it is now time for the voters to look ahead to a long-range solution for our boys and girls of Chesterfield.

It has been a pleasure to have had the opportunity to work with the School Board members and people of Chesterfield, and may I say, in all sincerity, that our future educational problems will be solved only as we move forward in our fast changing world.

July 1, 1960—June 30, 1961

The Hot Lunch Program opened September 7th, 1960. Mrs. Louise Leu as the Manager and Mrs. Inez Houghton as her Assistant.

The reimbursement rate from the Federal Funds remained at 5c for each Type A meal served. Under the Special Milk Program we received 4c reimbursement for each $\frac{1}{2}$ pint of milk served. Each day we served from 150-180 balanced meals.

We were fortunate to receive a generous supply of eating apples and apples for salads from one of our good neighbors. We were also very fortunate to receive Government Surplus Commodities. Without this help we would not be able to serve hot lunches.

Our extra helpers during the term were Mrs. Elli Herick and Mrs. Ethel Mills.

I wish to thank the town folks of Chesterfield for granting the program \$300 which will be paying off part of our milk bill.

I wish to express my sincere thanks to all those who helped in making the Hot Lunch Program a success.

The following surplus commodities from the government were received during the school period:

Butter, flour, corn meal, processed cheese, powdered milk, pea beans, apricots, cherries, frozen ground beef, sliced peaches, peanut butter, canned tomatoes, green beans, corn, frozen turkeys, rice, apple sauce, cabbage, canned beef in gravy, ripe olives and frozen chickens.

A special clinic was held in which throat cultures were taken on the entire student body and school staff for the purpose of determining the cause for the high absenteeism. A high carrier rate of Streptococcus was found present. This particular Streptococcus causes Septic Sore Throat and Scarletina, the aftermath of which Rheumatic Fever or Kidney disease may occur. The throat cultures were continued the remainder of the school year with the carrier rate remaining quite high. No mass treatment was initiated, but parents of students with positive throat cultures were notified and advised to consult their family physician at the first indication of illness.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their cooperation and patience during this most difficult year.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

To the citizens of Chesterfield:

September, 1962, saw the school at Chesterfield open its doors to the largest number of students in its history. Classes were overflowing in the first four grades to such an extent that old desks and chairs had to be taken from the attic and hurriedly repaired until new ones could be bought. The enrollment was so unexpected that hurried plans had to be made to cope with the situation. These plans concerned equipment and materials which were found to be lacking. Certainly something had to be done, especially about the first grade which had registered fifty new children. When this situation was known, immediate steps were taken to correct the condition. Within a short time, two new teachers were hired to relieve the load in grades one, three, and four. Grade one was divided, half being placed into the auditorium and the other half remaining in grade one. In grades three and four the extra teacher took special groups to give them extra help. These were taken to the front hall where a classroom was set up. In addition to grades three and four, she relieved the principal of one class in order to give him time to take care of the administrative duties.

Faculty

As the doors opened on a new school year, the students not only faced crowded conditions but also new teachers. Of these, only one remained from the previous year. With the exception of this one teacher, the others faced classes for the first time. These new teachers were to teach the following grades: Mrs. June Derjue, grade one; Mrs. Eleanor Fuller, grade three; Mrs. Barbara Mackey, grade four; Mr. John Letourneau, grade five; Mrs. Mar-

garet Hurley, grade six; Mrs. George Adams, grade seven, and Mr. Robert Bellavance, grade eight and principal. At a later date Mrs. Barbara Lammela and Mrs. Jeffrey were hired to take up their duties in grade one and grades three, four, and eight respectively. Within a short time Mrs. Jeffrey left and was replaced by Mrs. Wilma Moore.

Facing them would not only be students but also curriculum problems. These would have to be overcome in order to provide an effective teaching program for the year. As the school year progressed, problems disappeared and the program seemed to be running smoothly.

Lunch Program

Mrs. Leu again directed the lunch program with her helper, Mrs. Houghton. Though problems existed, they were shortly overcome and corrected to some satisfaction. Though the situation is not now ideal, it is certainly situated as well as possible under the present arrangement.

Under Mrs. Leu's direction, the milk program was continued from grades one through four.

Christmas Program

The annual Christmas Program, under the direction of Mrs. Azalea Wilson, was prepared at the school with the help of the teachers. In its early stages, it was questioned where the program would be held, for the auditorium was being used as a classroom. The Town Hall seemed to be the answer to the problem, so we immediately made the arrangements and went ahead with our plans. We also found that the Town Hall would seat more people than the school auditorium; which, we were advised, would certainly be needed. With the plans completed, the night of the program arrived and so did the snow storm. We certainly felt this would affect the size of the audience, but we found this to be untrue. The program itself was a success and many favorable comments were received from some of the local people.

Athletic Program

Thought we have no facilities to speak of, we have been fortunate enough to run a part-time Physical Education Program. The scheduled periods come on Monday and Friday afternoon. The program itself normally consists of fifteen minutes of calisthenics and then other activities of various types.

School Maintenance

Mr. Norman Patnode, our custodian, not only cleaned the school but also painted the halls for the coming year. During the early fall, he spent a considerable number of hours keeping the building reasonably clean and in good repair.

Transportation

Having most of our students transported by bus posed a few problems. These pertained to constant changing of seats by the students, excess noise, and the lack of seating according to stops. As a result, students had to look for seats every morning and evening, the bus drivers could not be heard over the noise, and the students had to step over one another to enter or leave the buses. Some of these, we felt, could be corrected by a bus seating plan. Not only would this keep the students from changing seats daily but would also prevent them, in some cases, from sitting with their friends. We also felt that if they were seated according to stops, they would load and unload the buses much more quickly. Not only would the unloading be easier, but the students would not have to step over one another to enter or leave. This procedure, we find, saves time and cuts down on potential trouble. It also points out the trouble areas on the buses so they can be corrected. In the over-all picture, it is much more effective to have assigned seating on the buses.

SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

School District Meeting
 Chesterfield School
 Chesterfield, New Hampshire

March 11, 1961

The meeting was called to order at 3:03 p.m. by the Moderator, Harry E. Winn, and the Warrant through Article 1, was read by the Clerk Pro Tem, Anna C. Hubner.

Article 1. To bring in your vote for the election of the following officials:

A moderator for the coming year.

A clerk for the ensuing year.

A member of the school board for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

The moderator then declared the polls open for balloting, by Australian ballot, for the necessary school district officers.

Esther Bevis, Phyllis Henchey and Anna C. Hubner, ballot clerks appointed by the School Board, took the oath of office from Moderator Harry E. Winn. Due to illness of Clerk, H. Claude Mowry, the Moderator appointed Anna C. Hubner to fill his chair. Agnes B. Chickering was then appointed to act as a ballot clerk. Mrs. H. Claude Mowry was appointed Assistant Moderator and Clifford Chickering, Assistant Clerk. They took the oath of office from Harry E. Winn, Moderator.

At 3:02 p.m. the Moderator called the meeting to order and the Clerk Pro Tem read the remainder of the Warrant.

James E. O'Neil asked permission to introduce Supt. Paul Clark and Kenneth G. Hewitt, Helping Teacher of the

Union, and permission to speak during the meeting. Permission was granted and the introductions acknowledged.

Article 2. To determine and appoint the salaries of School Board Members and Truant Officer, and to fix the compensation of any other Officers or Agents of the District.

George E. Joslin moved the adoption of the Article be passed as read. Seconded by Agnes B. Chickering. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 3. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

James E. O'Neil moved that the reports be accepted as printed in Town Report and placed on file. Seconded by Agnes B. Chickering. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 4. To choose agents, auditors and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

James E. O'Neil moved that this Article be passed over. Seconded by Agnes B. Chickering. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 5. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers, auditors and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of any sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

The Budget Committee Chairman, Arvid Pearson moved an amendment to the Article as read, that High School Tuition be earmarked for tuition only. Seconded by Robert Woodman. After much discussion, the amendment was withdrawn.

Arvid Pearson moved that the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$127,581.52 for the support of schools,

for the salaries of School District Officers, auditors and agents, for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriations of any sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, together with other income, the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town, which is the sum approved by the Budget Committee. Seconded by Robert Woodman. The Moderator called for a paper ballot. The results were as follows:

The Moderator declared the vote in the affirmative.

Article 6. To see if the district will vote to authorize the School Board to enter into tuition contracts with the Keene School District for tuition at Keene High School at the rate of \$515. per pupil, and the Brattleboro School District for tuition at Brattleboro High School at the rate of \$641. per pupil or any other approved high school.

Fred Korradi moved an amendment to the Article as read to include The Frances Alley Hicks School (Brattleboro School for Retarded Children) and The Austine School of Brattleboro. Seconded by James E. O'Neil. Motion carried in the affirmative. A voice vote was then taken to see if the Article be passed as amended. The article as amended was voted in the affirmative.

Article 7. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.) as its share of Supervisory Union contribution to the N.H. Educational television Channel WENH.

Arvid Pearson moved that the Article be accepted as read. Seconded by Robert Woodman. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 8. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600.) as

matching funds for funds available under provision of the National Defense Education Act and to authorize the school board to accept and use, in the name of the district, any Federal funds for public school education.

Moved by Robert E. Woodman that the article be accepted as read. Seconded by George Joslin. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 9. To see if the district will vote to raise and appropriate two thousand, six hundred sixty-six dollars and forty cents (\$2,666.40) to be made available prior to June 30, 1961, as a deficit appropriation for teacher's salary caused by the employment of a part-time teacher to assist with the heavy pupil enrollment during the present school year.

Moved by Clara B. Wellington that the article be passed over. Seconded by James E. O'Neil. Motion carried in the affirmative.

Article 10. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

At 9:41 p.m. the meeting was recessed by the Moderator.

At 9:42 p.m. the Moderator declared the polls closed. A count of the Ballots showed 133 Ballots cast, resulting as follows:

For Moderator: Harry Winn had 112 votes, H. Claude Mowry had 11 votes, James E. O'Neil had 3 votes, George Joslin had 2 votes, George Barrett had 2 votes, Warren Allen had 2 votes, Robert Woodman had 1 vote, Howard Kaiser had 1 vote, Kenneth Wiggin had 1 vote and Arvid Pearson had 1 vote. Harry Winn was declared elected Moderator for the coming year.

For Clerk: H. Claude Mowry had 122 votes, Anna C. Hubner had 4 votes, Joseph James had 1 vote, Arvid Pearson had 1 vote and Grace Welcome had 1 vote. H. Claude Mowry was declared elected Clerk for the ensuing year.

For a member of the school board for the ensuing three years: James E. O'Neil had 92 votes, Robert Woodman had 20 votes, Anna C. Hubner had 3 votes, Jane Allen

had 2 votes, Joseph James had 2 votes, Arvid Pearson had 1 vote, Grace Welcome had 1 vote, William Schaufmann had 1 vote, Grace Kearney had 1 vote, William Richardson had 1 vote, Gordon Kendall had 1 vote, Kenneth Wiggin had 1 vote, and Paul Welcome had 1 vote. James E. O'Neil was declared elected a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

For treasurer: Evelyn Winn had 127 votes, Albert Bradstreet had 1 vote. Evelyn Winn was declared elected Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Two auditors: Warren Allen had 33 votes, Carl Johnson had 25 votes, George Marrow had 4 votes, Joseph James had 3 votes, Marilyn Shield had 3 votes, Arvid Pearson had 2 votes, The following had one vote each: Anna Hubner, Mary Webb, Ray Patmos, William Mitchell, Agnes Chickering, Margaret Johnson, Jean Hubner, Albert Bradstreet, Grace Kearney, Paul Penning, Raymond Harris, Ken Kendall, William Richardson, Jr., William E. Fuller, John N. Ball, George Joslin, R. T. Guyette, L. Warren Allen and Carl Johnson were declared elected for Auditors for the ensuing year.

Harry Winn, Moderator, and James E. O'Neil, School Board member, took the oath of office from Imogene L. Chickering, Town Clerk.

James E. O'Neil moved that the meeting be adjourned. Seconded by Clara B. Wellington. Motion carried in the affirmative.

AN APPEAL FROM YOUR FOREST FIRE WARDEN

In these days of constantly rising taxes and wages, any unnecessary expense is an added burden on everyone's pocketbook — yours and mine. Forest fires cost money and damage our valuable woodlands. Lightning sets some forest fires, but we have no control of lightning. Children cause many fires. Ninety-eight percent of our forest fires result from human carelessness — our carelessness. This, we — you — and I can do something about.

When we require you to obtain a permit for out-of-doors burning or forbid you to burn on days or high fire danger or set up regulations — hours, etc., governing the use of the town dump we are simply protecting yours and the town's interests.

The ever present threat of forest fires is the concern of all of us; the responsibility for preventing them is ours and the costs of extinguishing are ours. We can do something about this problem, by being aware of and alert to the danger and by cooperating with your warden.

Do the things that are required of you —

1. Follow the warden's directions.
2. Secure the required burning permit.
3. Keep your fires under control.
4. Completely extinguish your fires before leaving them.
5. See that your children are properly cautioned.

Everyone will benefit by it.
