WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Columbia, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- To vote and bring in ballots for the election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Columbia for the ensuing year.
- 2. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required by law.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor for the year ensuing.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for Old Age, Blind and Disability Assistance for the year ensuing.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to take such action regarding plowing or otherwise keeping winter roads open in said Town for the year ensuing, as in their judgment seems most conducive to the best interests of the Town, and appropriate money for the same.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$478.02, the State to contribute the sum of \$3,186.78.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply any surplus remaining in their hands at the end of the fiscal year 1962 to the defraying of Town charges for the fiscal year 1963 in order to effect a proportionate reduction of the amount to be raised by taxes.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$83.03 for the purpose of uniting with the 45 other towns in the White Mountains Region Association in publicizing and otherwise promoting the natural and commercial factors upon which the economy of the North Country is based.
- 10. To see what action the Town will take with reference to hiring the Colebrook Fire Precinct for the purpose of extinguishing fires in said Town, and in the event of favorable action to make necessary appropriation for the same,
- 11. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the upkeep of cemeteries.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of the taxes for the ensuing year, and to pay such debts out of tax money when the same is received.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- 15. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of cutting and removing the bushes from the side of the highways in such places as the Selectmen think most expedient.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of agents, auditors, Selectmen and all other officers, and ratify and confirm the same.
- 17. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

Report of the Superintendent

To the School Board and the Citizens of the School District of Columbia

FOREWORD

Most of what has been said and written during the past few years about the strong or weak points of our American education system has had to do with conditions in the country as a whole. This has been particularly true in the discussion of size of unit, of reading methods, science subject matter, and the teaching of the concept of number. The arguments presented have by no means been confined to either what should be taught or how it should be taught, as no small part of this running educational gamut has had to do with the individual on the receiving end -- the pupil, and what is considered to be the best time to try to persuade him to take it. And all this has taken place even though becoming increasingly more aware every day of the uncertainty of how to determine ability potentials, especially from the standpoint of what can or will be accomplished when once stimulated to action.

With both the prescribed minimum standards for high schools, which goes into effect this fall, and the Interim Commission's recommendations, which applies to both the elementary and high schools, geared for larger educational units in the state, there is a definite pointing to the conviction that provision for offering more subjects in the above mentioned and other areas to a larger number will result in a better education. Whether or not this belief will be borne out, time only can tell. Past experience has shown that the spanding of more dollars, which almost invariably has been the case in the end, to provide a large school to accommodate the pupils from several smaller ones has not necessarily produced superior accomplishments. Even after all the various factors have been considered and the problems of organization have been solved, time has been found to be vitally important in the working out of the many details of implementation.

Teachers

With the shortage of elementary teachers becoming ever more serious each successive year due to the supply not keeping pace with the increase in population, we are extremely fortunate to have veteran teachers return to work with us again this year. Mrs. Florence B. Hughes teaches Grades 1-6 at the Church School and Mrs. Myra A. Holbrook teaches Grades 1-4 at the Cone School.

School Nurse - - Health

With conclusive findings of scientific studies showing that, with other factors being equal, the efficiency with which school work is done by the pupil is directly proportional to his or her overall state of health, the importance of the outstanding work done by Mrs. Ethel S. Sturgis, our school nurse, becomes ever more apparent.

The comprehensive program conducted throughout the school year includes periodic clinics for the purpose of administering immunizations, giving physical examinations, and taking x-rays, in addition to constant check-ups on height, weight, hearing, and eyesight, and continuous supervision of the general health.

Repairs · · Equipment

Repair work done during the summer vacation period included the painting of the walls and ceilings of the class-rooms in both schools now in session; the installation of a dry well at the Cone School to take care of the waste water from the sink; shingling both sides of the Church School roof; moving the basketball basket and backboard from the Grand Division to the Church School and fastening this assembly to two cedar poles set on the south side of the yard at the latter school; and the covering of the windows at the Grand Division building with board covers. Since school opened, iron pipe coat racks have been made and fastened overhead near the furnace in the cellar at the Cone School to provide a place to dry out wet clothing.

As will be noted in the warrant, an article is included relative to the providing of running water and the installation of flush toilets at the Cone School Building.

Such items of equipment as have been puchased during the past year have been incidental to instruction and minor in nature.

Enrollment and Attendance

As could be expected, with the number of pupils in the

East side of the district decreasing to the extent that one of the two schools open last year was closed, and now that the Seventh and Eighth Grades from this section are sent outside, the enrollment within the district of 42 is probably the smallest that can be remembered. In comparison there were 62, 65, 59, 58, and 54 pupils for the respective previous five years in the district's schools. The average percentage of attendance for the three schools in session last year was 95.79 and the average number of tardinesses per pupil was .01.

Just as the number of pupils enrolled in schools within the district is in all likelihood the smallest within memory, the number attending school outside of 74, 45 elementary and 29 secondary, is the largest. During the preceding successive five years, there were 60, 67, 50, 56 and 46 in this category with a breakdown taken in the same successive order of 35, 39, 30, 36 and 25 in elementary school, and 25, 28, 20, 20 and 21 in high school.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's budget for 1963-64 is \$48,351.00 in comparison to \$45,225.00 for the current year. This amount is decreased by an estimated income of \$16,000.00 which leaves a balance of \$32,351.00 to be raised by taxes by the town. Dependent upon the action taken on the article in the warrant relative to providing facilities mentioned under repairs above, the total amount appropriated may be increased. For the most part, the increase in the budget for next year is explained, as will be noted in the budget breakdown found on subsequent pages in this report, by provision for increases in salaries, cost of transportation, and tuition.

Conclusion

May I again express my sincere appreciation to the members of the School Board, parents, teachers, and citizens for all the assistance and cooperation received as we have worked together during the past several years in a joint effort to provide and maintain high standards in our schools.
