To the inhabitants of the town of Goffstown, in the county of Hillsborough, in said state, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools, for the maintenance of the poor, for the repair of roads and bridges, for Memorial Day.

3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the Rogers Free Library.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to pay rent of G. A. R. Hall.

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to pay on existing debts of town.

6. To see if the town will vote to have some person employed to convey the books each week for such persons in Grasmere and vicinity as may desire to patronize the town library, agreeable to the petition of E. B. Swett and eleven others.

7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise to establish a public drinking fountain at the west village, agreeable to the petition of E. A. Blaisdell and eighteen others.

8. To take sense of the qualified voters whether the alterations and amendments of the constitution proposed by the constitutional convention shall be approved.

9. To hear the report of agents, auditors, committees, and all other officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

10. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Tenney road, so called, from its junction with the Bog road to its junction with the road leading to S. M. Patten's, by the Eaton place, said road to be subject to gates and bars.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come

before said meeting.

REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

The board of health has had but few cases of contagious disease to contend with during the past year.

In March a case of smallpox developed in a family having just moved into town. It was a mild case and there was no spreading of the disease.

In November diphtheria threatened to be epidemic, eleven cases coming on within a few days. Happily the threatened epidemic proved abortive and was confined to the eleven original cases. Measles appeared but were confined to a few cases.

We wish to impress upon the minds of the inhabitants of Goffstown the special need of vaccination to prevent the spread of smallpox.

About the usual number of complaints have been lodged with the board relating to imperfect sink drains, unsanitary water-closets, etc.

There needs to be considerable missionary work done to get the people educated up to the point of having reasonably sanitary drains and closets.

We wish to reiterate the advice so often given for the care and cleanliness of drains, closets, and cellars. Keep the drain open and free; closets frequently cleaned and disinfected; cellars dry if possible, and see that all decaying vegetables are at once removed.

The water supply of the houses should be looked after, and all sources of contamination removed.

By attending to these suggestions many of the so-called contagious and epidemic diseases would be mitigated and perhaps eradicated.

REPORT OF BOARD OF EDUCATION OF INDEPENDENT DISTRICT.

The Board of Education submit the following report:

This report gives the condition of the schools for the year ending September 1, 1902.

The schools have been in session 36 weeks,—one term of 14 weeks and two terms of 11 weeks.

Whole number enrolled during the year, 202: of these 190 belonged to the district.

The average attendance has been as follows: High school, 34; grammar school, 28; middle school, 24; higher primary school, 35; lower primary school, 30: total, 151.

The average membership for the year was 174.

The percentage of attendance was highest in the grammar school, being 95 per cent, and lowest in the primary, being 66 per cent. In the other schools the percentage was about 90.

In June a class of 6 graduated, 5 girls and 1 boy. At presant there are in the lower primary room 20 boys and 21 girls. How many of the boys will graduate?

In our last report we called your attention to the sanitary conditions at the school, and at a special meeting it was voted to raise one hundred dollars to defray expenses of such repairs as might be deemed necessary. In accordance with the vote taken the committee have made the repairs and consider the result satisfactory.

We have also expended fifty dollars in purchasing physical apparatus. The committee have long had this matter under consideration, and felt that it was necessary to procure this to successfully teach physics and to maintain the standard of the school.

Mr. Barton taught the high school during the spring term, when he declined a re-election, returning to college to complete his course. Mr. Barton had had charge of the school for two years, and had proved to be a very successful teacher.

At the beginning of the fall term Mr. Walter B. Pierce assumed the principalship. Mr. Pierce came to us well recommended and is doing good work, having the confidence of pupils and parents alike, so far as we have been able to ascertain. Mr. Pierce has taken entire charge of the music in this room, thus enabling the music teacher to devote more time to the other schools.

Miss Annie M. French has continued as assistant, and is doing well.

Miss Laura M. Blood is finishing her second year in the grammar room, and is keeping a good school.

Mrs. Barton resigned at the close of the spring term and Miss Nina Kendall was elected to take charge of the intermediate room. She is doing excellent work.

Miss Helen B. Carr and Miss Mary A. Warren have had charge of the higher and lower primary rooms respectively, and as usual have been successful.

Miss Etta M. Hadley has had a successful year as music teacher.

We have long felt the necessity of increasing the work in the two lower rooms, or adding another year to the course. This could be done by securing the services of another teacher or by adding half a year to the work in the two rooms mentioned.

We would earnestly request that you give this matter your attention and consult with the committee at any time.

The best results can only be obtained by the united efforts of pupils, teachers, and parents, and we feel that this has been sadly lacking in the years past.

Visiting school the last day of a given term does not in any marked degree aid in this movement. Too often we hear complaints from parents that their children are crowded too much, when, upon investigation, it almost invariably happens that the complaint comes entirely from the pupil, and an explanation

convinces the parent that the seeming mountain is only a molehill.

We do not wish in any way to lay the blame entirely upon the pupil, but we all know the tendency of scholars to look upon extra work as a burden.

What we would especially recommend is that the parents should more thoroughly acquaint themselves with the workings of the school, also to attend our annual district meeting. Last year there were but eleven present, and we hope that the attendance this year will be many times doubled.

The annual meeting will be held March 7, at 7.30 o'clock in the afternoon, at the town house. It is essentially necessary that there should be a large attendance at that time, as it will be necessary to choose a successor to the late Judge Samuel Upton.

For eighteen years he devoted the greater part of his time to school work, and how well he performed that duty we all know. It was one of the pleasures of his life to take an active interest in our schools, and at no time did he seem as happy as when he was in the school-room surrounded by boys and girls.

While it will not be possible, perhaps, for any one to devote the time to the school that he did, yet we should endeavor to choose some one who will be able to bring the school to that level toward which he was striving.


