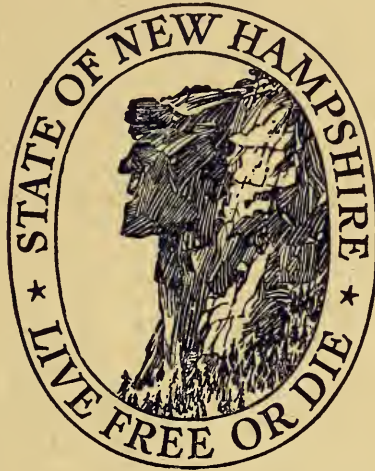

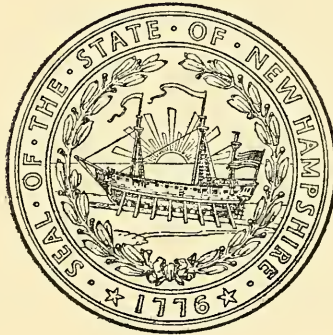

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hill in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote of Town Affairs:

(L.S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hill on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next at 7:30 p.m., to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To authorize and empower the board of selectmen to borrow for the Town by the issue of notes a sum not exceeding \$15,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1956, said notes to be expressly payable from taxes within one year from the date of their issuance; and to authorize the board of selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

4. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of title 11 of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 101 of the Revised Statutes Annotated Amended by Chapters 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to defray the Town's share of the cost thereof.

5. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the Town the necessary agreement with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the

plan and to see if the Town will designate the Road Agent as Officer to be responsible for the administration of the plan.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$59.85 which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in co-operation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

7. To see if the Town will vote to establish a capital reserve fund for the purpose of purchasing certain items of highway equipment and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for same as determined by the meeting.

8. To see what action the Town will take with regard to appropriating and expending the income from the Ferrin Fund.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and citizens of the Hill School District:

I herewith submit my second annual report as your Superintendent of Schools:

Personnel

Mrs. Ruth Rounds, who has taught for many years in Hill, continues to teach grades 1, 2, and 3.

Mrs. Marion Crowley, who has been for three years, continues to teach grades 4, 5, 6, and 7.

Mrs. Beatrice Nordholm was employed as a music teacher to replace Mrs. Estelle Watts, who retired last year.

School Finances

The budget for 1956-57 will be approximately \$17,000. Because of unforeseen expenditures during the current year, the Superintendent and the School Board now estimate a deficit of approximately \$1,600.00. This deficit is caused by the increases in the following items: Salaries, maintenance, transportation, new equipment, and Union expenses.

The deficit in the Supervisory Union, resulted from a change in the fiscal year for the Supervisory Union budget. For a considerable period of time, the smaller towns in the Supervisory Union paid their expenses into the Franklin budget. Franklin, in turn, paid for all the expenses of the Supervisory Union office out of its budget, which operated on the fiscal year of December 16-December 15. Last year, the Union Board, on the recommendation of the Superintendent, agreed to establish a separate Supervisory Union account to finance the expenses of the Supervisory Union office. The budget for that year was from January 1-December 30. All

the laws pertaining to the Supervisory Union Boards, are based on the state fiscal year of July 1–June 30. In order to simplify the budgeting and financing of the Supervisory Union business, the Union Board at their last annual meeting, approved a Deficiency Budget to cover the expenses of the Union from January 1, 1956–June 30, 1956. The Hill share of this Deficiency budget is \$162.

I wish to express my appreciation to the School Board, the school staff, and the people of Hill, for their co-operation and support during the last school year.
