To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- ARTICLE I. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

- ART. VIII. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$30.00 for the celebration of Memorial Day.

# SCHOOL DISTRICT

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Langdon School Board:-

I herewith submit my eighth annual report as your superintendent of schools.

Last spring Miss June Clark and Miss Frances Grindstaff accepted better positions in other districts, and we hired two graduates of Keene Normal School, class 1937, to fill their places. Miss Hazel Lewis has grades 3-6 and Miss Lauraine Crosbie grades 1 and 2.

I anticipate with pleasure the schools being placed in the new school building this fall. At a legally called special meeting the voters of Langdon gave absolute authority to a Building Committee to make a contract to re-build the present building according to a plan presented. This invokes on the Langdon School Board the obligation that they have plans to care for the children at such time as the Building Committee desire to begin work. Such plans have been made, but the parents and pupils must expect as well as the teachers some inconveniences during that time, but I trust that each will help in every way because of the great good to be obtained in the end.

Already an artesian well has been drilled. It insures plenty of water for the schools.

The success of the plan to erect a building for Langdon schools is due in a great part to the generosity of Miss Sarah A. Porter, who has offered to give the District three thousand dollars toward the work. I reverence those who do for others without any expectation of returns, especially is my esteem heightened when such kindness is done that the children may have better opportunities. I know that the Langdon School Board, and I trust that the citizens of Langdon, feel as I do. I hope that we may be able to meet with Miss Porter's desires, and that she may be happy in knowing that the children of Langdon are happy.

In my report of 1937 I wrote: "There should be a plan to adjust the flow of heat without going to the furnace room." With a larger building, this need will be even greater. If the teachers leave the room day after day to tend a furnace there is bound to be disorders in the room. Such a plan is not fair to the teachers nor to the pupils. Grade pupils are not old enough to take the responsibility of tending a furnace for so large a school building. We cannot hire a janitor at the salary that we have been allowed to stay in the building all day as is done in larger places. The amount of money allowed for janitor and for fuel by the State, as I understand the plan, depends on two items—the number of class-rooms and the type of furnace used. There will be the same number of class-rooms in the new school and, I believe, the same furnace.

Perhaps we cannot afford it now, but soon, I feel sure, we shall be forced to install some type of furnace that is self-operating for a period of a day or two. I know of two types—an oil furnace, and an iron fireman.

I wish to thank the Langdon School Board for their patience and support, the teachers for their loyalty, and the citizens for their interest in school work.
