To the inhabitants of the town of Sandwich, in said County and State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act on the following articles:

- 1. To see if the Town will determine by vote the salaries to be paid any of its officers and agents.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes the same to be repaid from the tax revenue of 1948.
- 3. To raise and appropriate \$133.92 to pay interest of School Fund Note.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the support of the Library in addition to the amount required by law. The sum recommended to be raised as a whole is \$1100.00.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the observance of Old Home Week. The sum recommended is \$200.00.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the observance of Memorial Day. The sum recommended is \$175.00.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$145.00, for Lakes Region Association.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for White Pine Blister Rust control.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the maintenance of the Notch and Dale roads. The sum recommended is \$1000.00.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept Town Road Aid (T.R.A.) and vote to raise and appropriate for that purpose the sum of \$859.22.
- 11. To see if the Town will accept State Aid construction of Class II roads, and raise and appropriate for that purpose the sum of \$2176.00 the State contributing \$4352.00.
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the maintenance of Town Highways and Bridges and for winter care and to pass any vote relating thereto. The amount recommended is \$17000.00.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Town highway from the south bank of the Bennett stream at the upper bridge to the Noss residence.
- 14. The Town Clerk's records were destroyed by fire some years ago. The Selectmen desire to know if the Town wishes them to retain legal counsel to definitely establish what roads have been discontinued and to raise and appropriate money to meet expense of same. The sum recommended is \$100.00.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1050.00 for the support of the Fire Department.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$225.00 for the support of the police department.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for the Laconia Hospital and \$50.00 for the Huggins Memorial Hospital.

- 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the care of Cemeteries.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000.00 for paying Town charges for the ensuing year.
- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4000.00 to pay the expense of General Government.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800.00 for painting the Town Hall.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to install a Fire Escape for the Town Hall or a back stairway and vote to raise and appropriate money therefor. The estimate is \$2500.00.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for recreational purposes. To be administered by the Sandwich Athletic Club.
- 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the purpose of reassessment and take any vote relating thereto.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 26. To see what action the Town wishes to take in regard to breaking dooryards.
- 27. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to issue a note for \$9000.00 to the Sandwich Town and Grange Fair Association for three years to be

paid at the rate of \$3000.00 each year beginning in 1948. This note is to include the unpaid balance of the old note.

- 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1200.00 to complete the tractor shed.
- 29. To see if the Town will vote to rescind a previous vote and allow the tractor to be used in the summer.
- 30. If favorable action is taken under article 29 to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2300.00 to equip the tractor for summer use.
- 31. To choose by ballot all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Report of the Forest Fire Warden

FOREST FIRE PROBLEM SERIOUS

The year 1947 was one of the worst periods of drouth and forest fire occurrence in eastern United States history. Lack of water ruined crops, lowered water levels and dried up brooks everywhere. Three months of deficient rainfall and abnormally high temperatures resulted in many fires which were mostly well controlled and kept within bounds. Only the high winds beginning on October 23rd caused a few fires to escape beyond immediate control. These few fires resulted in burning some 15,000 acres and the loss of 63 or more buildings in four New Hampshire towns.

All October fires were costly. They burned deeply in the ground and required day and night patrol of large crews of men until the rains came late in October. Towns which escaped from serious fires might easily have been in the midst of the most serious conflagrations we had.

Governor Dale closed the woods effective at midnight of October 15th. With the blow-up of October 23rd, a second proclamation closed all back roads and authorized towns to inaugurate patrol. The effect of this was to put down subsequent fires for the rest of the dry period.

Local fire warden forces performed an admirable job to hold the more than 200 fires that occurred during this October period. Many men were taxed to the utmost as the emergency continued. To them and all those who did their work, the people of New Hampshire owe a debt of gratitude. The state forest fire control agency based on local town wardens and town crews wherever adequately equipped rose to the occasion and met the test in whatever town their services were needed.

It is now time to take stock everywhere of our fire fighting facilities for the season ahead and to make them adequate where necessary. To this end town fire plans and training programs for wardens, deputies and other key men in each district are being arranged

or are in progress. If equipment and tools are insufficient properly to equip the available man power in each community with the right tools for the job, they should be provided for at once. The yearly addition of fire tools to the town supply will generally need to be built up. The state sells tools to the towns and shares one-half their cost. Good equipment is important and can help greatly to keep both damage and fire costs at a minimum.

For many years we have requested our wardens not to issue burning permits except on rainy days. This regulation will be in effect again this year as it is one of the best means of assuring such fires from getting out of control. Nine out of every ten fires can be prevented, 98 percent of all fires being due to human carelessness. Be sure to get a permit for any fire in or near woodland when the ground is free from snow. Be sure your fires are always out before you leave them. Help us in getting the travelling public to keep from throwing out lighted matches or cigarettes. Be careful of all fires in or near woodland.

Annual Report of Sandwich Chapter American Red Cross

For the Sandwich Red Cross 1947 was an active year with programs carried out in health, disaster, home service, water safety, production and canteen work. As in other years, contributions were made when needed for local relief and dental work for children. Also at Red Cross expense and due to the prompt action of Dr. Quinby, whooping cough serum was made available to all children in Sandwich who had not had the disease. This followed the occurance of two cases in the town and a possible epidemic was avoided.

The Home Service, headed by Col. Lear, attends to complications arising for men of the town who are still in the armed forces and handles welfare of veterans and their families. This is an important peacetime activity of the Red Cross which will be continued. Help was also given to the water safety program, making it possible for Ingrid Ingles to be at the beach on certain afternoons a week to instruct the smaller children.

The Production department, with able help from the branch in Moultonboro, made 354 articles of clothing for relief overseas. These included infants' nightgowns, shirts and bands, as well as over 100 children's cotton dresses. Material for this work was furnished by the National Red Cross.

The Canteen service for those fighting the Notch fire was a useful experience in another branch of Red Cross activity. Beginning on the first day of the fire, coffee and sandwiches were sent up by car and truck three or four times a day and at night. During the last six days a mobile kitchen was set up in one of the Draper Corporation buildings at the Notch where soups, stews and baked beans could be kept hot and sent out with the coffee and sandwiches.

Help was received and food generously supplied by the Conway and Laconia chapters, also from Center Harbor and Meredith, and from our branch in Moultonboro. Many loaned equipment to us and we are grateful to those who gave the use of their cars to carry food and personnel to the Notch, also to the girls and teachers of Quimby School, who cooked food

and helped in many other ways.

It is on record that at least sixty Sandwich people helped in the work of this food service, everyone giving as generously as was possible of time and energy, to whom the Sandwich Red Cross extends most heartfelt thanks.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the sixth day of March 1948, at two o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1 To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2 To Choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3 To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4 To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5 To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the District.
- 6 To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7 To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
- 8 To see if the District will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the District, as determined by the School Board in its annual report.
- 9 To see if the District will vote to transfer any unencumbered surplus funds which may remain in the treasury of the District at the close of the current fiscal year to a capital reserve fund for the construction of a new central school, said fund to be placed in

the custody of the trustees of trust funds and reserved for the construction of a new central school in accordance with the laws of 1943, chapter 160, as amended by the laws of 1945, chapter 35, and the laws of 1947, chapter 8.

- 10 To see if the District will vote to transfer any State Aid that may become available during the fiscal year 1948-1949 to the capital reserve fund referred to in the preceding article.
- 11 To see if the District will authorize the school board to make application to the Federal Works Agency for funds under Title V of the War Reconversion and Modilization Act for the preparation of plans and specifications for a new central school and to execute and deliver in the name of and on behalf of the school district any and all contracts or agreements necessary for the purpose of obtaining a loan or grant from the Federal Works Agency or any other agency of the United States.
- 12 To see how much money the District will vote to appropriate for the purpose of constructing and equipping a new central school; and in order to furnish such funds, to authorize the school board to issue serial notes or bonds in the name and on the credit of the District for the amount voted in conformance with existing statutes.
- 13 To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

SUBERINTENDENT'S REPORT

In my report a year ago, I pointed out that we have developed a program that is almost equivalent to a centralized school organization but lacking most of the advantages that such a program can provide when housed in suitable buildings with adequate playground space. We are continuing this present year the same arrangement. This consists of one one-room rural school at North Sandwich to which most of the pupils are transported, one two-room school at Center Sandwich for grades 1 to 6 and the junior high school at Lower Corner.

These buildings are not satisfactory according to modern standards although some changes were made during the past summer. Oil heat was provided for the junior high school at Lower Corner and fluorescent lights were installed there, making this a very comfortable room although much too small for satisfactory work. The primary room at the Center was enlarged by moving a partition and an oil burning heater was installed. In order to make room for this change, a large box stove in the hall which used to provide some heat for the toilet rooms had to be taken The net result was more space for our primary children, but the unpleasant part was the loss of heat from the hall and toilet rooms. The toilets in all of our schools are out of date and unsatisfactory and in my opinion cannot be made suitable until we can secure continuous heat and steady water supply necessary for flush toilets.

The District's vote last year to build a new central school gives hope that we may not need to wait too long for improved conditions. The question is when to start this building. The effect of a stubborn forest fire last fall and high cost to the town for this emergency leads us to consider carefully any vote which would increase expenses at this time. I believe that the District should vote to set aside as a capital reserve fund for a new building any fund which may remain in the treasury of the District at the close of the fiscal year in June, 1948, also to devote any State Aid that

becomes available in the future toward this new building fund.

As for voting to borrow money in order to start construction at once, I think we do not have sufficient information at present to recommend any action. I suggest that no vote be taken at the regular annual meeting on Article 12 in the school district warrant, but that the meeting be adjourned to a later time when the school board and building committee may have some definite proposals to make regarding the

actual construction of the new school.

In spite of all the reasons which may be advanced against undertaking new construction at this time—and I realize there are very many good arguments against it—I think the welfare of our children should be our very first consideration. I am convinced that we cannot provide adequately for the health and comfort of those attending our schools in the present buildings without unwarranted and unreasonable expense. I would like to be able to say that we might get along until next year or a year after, but every time I visit these schools I come away with the opinion that the time for action is now. A year in the lifetime of a child is a long time and I believe the people of Sandwich will not continue to see their children less well cared for than those of other communities.
