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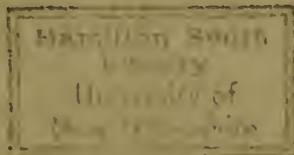

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sharon in the County of Hillsborough in said State:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Brick School House in said Sharon on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

Art. 3. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relative thereto.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries for the ensuing year, or take any action relative thereto.

Art. 5. To see if the Town desires to vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Forest Fire purposes, or take any action thereto.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act, or take any action relative thereto.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow a sum of money not exceeding two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) or take any action relative thereto.

Art. 8. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to establish the amount which shall be paid the Town Officers for their services, or take any action relative thereto.

Art. 10. To see if the Town desires to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the celebration of Old Home Day, or take any action relative thereto.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Town Health Officer and Board of Health due to the war emergency.

Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred forty-seven dollars (\$147.00) for future construction on the Turnpike after the war.

Art. 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seventy-three dollars and fifty cents (\$73.50) for Town Road Aid and the State will contribute three hundred forty-six dollars and sixty cents (\$346.60) or take any action relative thereto.

Art. 14. To see if the Town desires to raise and appropriate a tax of fifty cents on each hundred dollars of assessed valuation of the preceding year, and the Commissioner will allot to the Town a sum sufficient to equal ninety dollars (\$90.00) for each mile of Class V Highway in the Town or take any action thereto.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purpose of plowing and removing the snow, and sanding the highways in winter, or take any other action relative thereto.

Art. 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate nine dollars (\$9.00) to the Monadnock Region Association.

Art. 17. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegates at Large, Alternate Delegates at Large, and Alternate Delegates to the National Convention of the various political parties to be held to nominate party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United States.

Art. 18. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.
