Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for public welfare.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Age Assistance.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general care and upkeep of the Town Memorial Forest.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

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Shelburne Library Report

The State Library Development Program—North Country District, has worked out very well for the Shelburne Library. Nearly all books purchased in 1967 were bought through the State Libraries Cooperative Book buying plan at a discount of 37 percent plus free handling, against our 25 percent discount on orders placed directly with publishers or wholesalers. Complete sets of catalogue cards were provided at no extra cost by the State Library staff which speeded up processing of the books considerably.

Again as in 1966, we received a grant of \$100 state aid for the purchase of basic reference books. These cover the fields of history, almanacs, religion, science, recreation, literature, etc.

Serving as a Book Committee for 1967 were: Mrs. Carlton Frank, Mrs. George Thompson, and Mrs. Stanley Judge.

The library received gifts of books from Mr. and Mrs. Warren Patterson and Mr. and Mrs. George Thompson. A gift of money was received from Mrs. Lowell Reed, which was to be used for the children of Shelburne.

One thousand, seventy-six books and magazines from our library were used by 62 adults and children. We borrowed 1501 books from the Bookmobile and 21 from the State Library.

In 1967, we added 91 adult and 58 Juvenile books to our library making a total of 3274 volumes.

The annual summer reading contest was held with 19 participants.

Library hours are Tuesdays, 3:00-5:00 p.m. and Saturdays 3-5 p.m.
