## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

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To the inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the general expenses of the highway department.
6. To see if the Town will vote raise the sum of \$200.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust, or act anything in relation thereto.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise anything for the observance of Old Home Day.
8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

9. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget act.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of Six Hundred Sixty-three dollars (\$663.00) as the town's share in State Aid Construction on the Shedd Hill road or, to raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of One Hundred Ninety-Five dollars and Twenty-Eight Cents (\$195.28) for T. R. A. so called.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Forty-Five Dollars (\$45.00) to be paid to the Monadnock Region Association for advertising the Town.

12. To see what action the Town will take in regard to real estate taken over by the Town for the non-payment of taxes.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for the purchase of Forest Fire Fighting Tools.

14. To hear the report of the Fire Equipment Committee, and to raise such sums of money as the Town may deem necessary to carry out their recommendations.

15. To hear the reports of the electric light committee, and to raise such sums of money as the Town may deem necessary to get electric lights in Town.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) to paint and repair the seats and other furniture in the Town Hall.

17. To see if the Town will vote to buy a new tractor, or take any action in relation thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for repairing the road to the place now owned by Charles Swain, or take any action in relation thereto.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

---

To the School Board and the Citizens of the Stoddard School District:

Herewith I submit my fourth annual school report for your consideration.

### SCHOOL ORGANIZATION

School Board: Albert E. Prime, chairman; Ross A. Ayer, Kenneth McClure.

Supt. of Schools: Vincent Gatto, Ed. M., Hillsboro, N. H.

Teacher: Mary Phelan.

### GENERAL DISCUSSION

No pupils were reported without absences or tardy marks for the school year which closed last June. We hope that this year the school will achieve a better record. Punctuality is a most desirable trait to cultivate in these days when we have to watch the clock so closely to perform our everyday duties effectively.

The village school opened in the fall with a membership of . This number has fluctuated during the year owing to the fact that Stoddard is a summer resort, and to the fact that some of the families represented in the school do not become permanent residents. This is not only true of Stoddard but of many other rural districts in New Hampshire.

I wish to mention again for reasons stated in my previous report the desirability of a jacketed stove for the school, the services of a music supervisor, the purchase of periodicals and magazines.

The following additional suggestions are worth considering. Many questions arise in the course of our school work which deal with history, science, literature, economics, and so forth, questions which neither the books on hand, nor the teacher, and for that matter neither the school board nor the

superintendent can answer. A good encyclopedia costing about seventy-five dollars would be very handy for this purpose. A large reading table and a half dozen chairs in the front room of the school house would furnish our boys and girls a suitable place for research and reference work. The toilet facilities of the school are inadequate. To improve present conditions we should at least enlarge the present vaults. The most desirable thing to do would be to consider the installation of chemical toilets. The total cost for such an installation would be about two hundred-fifty dollars. Such a plan would result in safe and sanitary facilities.

In order to help the teacher adapt the school work to the ability of the children, early in the fall I administered intelligence tests. I have also given special examinations to the eighth grade to make sure that they get the necessary training to enable them to do high school work next year.

Last June we had the satisfaction of having two elementary school graduates from Stoddard. Graduation exercises were held in the Stoddard Town Hall which had just been remodeled. It made a most suitable place for the occasion. At this writing we look forward to another graduation next June. Judging from what we have learned in putting on such programs during the past three years, we should witness the most beautiful and important event of the year in our graduation exercises next June.

The teacher has worked hard, and taken a personal interest in the education of the boys and girls in her care. The superintendent has kept in close contact with the school by his frequent visits, and attendance at board meetings. The school board have spared themselves no trouble to provide educational opportunity for the boys and girls, within the limits set by the state and the school district.
