## WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

*To the inhabitants of the Town of Webster, in the County of Merrimack, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Grange Hall in said Webster on Tuesday, the Thirteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of highways and bridges.
  - (a) Summer Maintenance
  - (b) Winter Maintenance
  - (c) Tar Roads
  - (d) General Expense of Highway Department
  - (e) Street Lighting
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$444.18 for Class V road construction.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for public welfare.
  - (a) Town Poor
  - (b) Old Age Assistance
6. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of the town library.



7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for patriotic purposes.

- (a) Old Home Day
- (b) Memorial Day

8. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support and maintenance of the Hy-Mar Fire Department, including forest fires.

9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.

10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for use in connection with the State program for the eradication of White Pine Blister Rust.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1640.00 to defray the town's share towards the permanent improvement to two sections of graveled Blackwater Roal leading from Snyder Bridge to Tyler, this amount to be added to the Snyder Road Improvement Fund.

12. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$119.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital, this amount being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.

13. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the town by the issuance of notes a sum not exceeding \$20,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1956, said notes expressly payable from said taxes within one year from the date of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.

14. To see if the town will vote to change the New Snow Removal Equipment Fund to a Highway Equipment Fund.

15. To see if the town will vote to use balance of Highway Equipment Fund (\$4243.94) as a down payment towards the purchase of a Power Road Grader and snow re-

moval equipment for said Grader, the balance of costs to be paid on a 5 year bond issue. The bond issue not to exceed \$15,000.00.

16. To see what action the town wishes to take in regards to the sale or repair of the Tractor Snowplow.

17. To see if the town will vote to use the interest derived from the Town Hall Sale Fund for the reduction of 1956 taxes.

18. To determine if the town will vote to require all persons intending to become a candidate as an official of the Town of Webster to file their intentions with the Town Clerk on or before February 15 prior to the annual town meeting in each year.

19. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

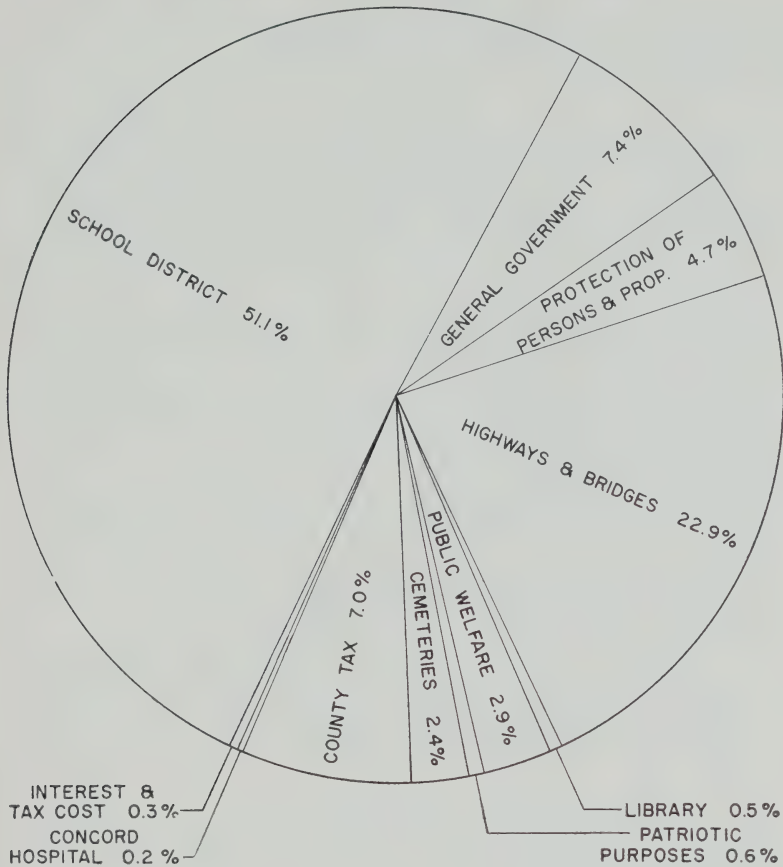

## TO THE TAXPAYERS

---

Appropriations for the year 1955 were one of the highest in the history of the Town, yet there were some unspent appropriations which resulted in an increase of cash surplus of \$2,753.01. This amount is in the hands of the Treasurer and will be used to reduce taxes in the year 1956.

Town Road Aid construction was completed as far as the residence of Ben P. Little. No further building in this direction seems wise at this time, since the existing road in Salisbury has been discontinued due to the road being in the Flood Area.

We believe that construction in the future should be southerly from Clothespin Bridge toward the Concord line.

State Aid construction of the Tyler road project has been started, with the town's share being all spent.

In order to continue building to complete this project it will be necessary to raise at least \$1,640.00 as the Town's share according to the estimate furnished by the State Highway Dept.

Appropriate articles have been included in the Town Warrant for 1956 to provide funds to continue these road-building programs.

Our oiled roads seem to be in good condition and will need no repairs except the usual patching and a summer application of oil.

The gravel roads continue to be in good shape with the maintenance provided by the Town Road Agent.

The only special appropriation for new equipment in 1955 was an amount of \$600.00, as the town's share, and \$200.00 contributed by the Hy-Mar Fire Co., for the purchase of a tank truck and hose.

A used truck and tank were purchased and members of the Fire Company helped to prepare and paint the tank for mounting on the truck chassis.

This unit has already proved its merits by helping to save two sets of farm buildings.

Our cemeteries have been well cared for with the funds provided by the town.

The rotary mower purchased, proved to be a distinct help in keeping the grounds in good shape.

Considerable difference of opinion has existed in town about the boundaries of the Riverdale Cemetery, so a search of the records was made. A recorded deed with surveyor's measurements was found which proves that the cemetery as now fenced is the approximate location of the land deeded to the town.

In making up the budget for 1956, we have tried to be as conservative as possible in our estimates.

## REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

## BE A GOOD CITIZEN — COOPERATE

Smoking and debris burning caused more than 50 percent of the forest fires occurring in the state of New Hampshire in 1955—235 fires out of a total of 463 originated from these two sources. Lighted smoking material and matches thrown from moving vehicles along the highway or dropped by fishermen, hunters, hikers, berry and flower pickers accounted for 26 percent; debris burning in the wrong place or at the wrong time by those who failed to heed all pleas for safety or refused to recognize the logical, sensible rules and regulations set up under legislative authority governing the use of fire in or near woodlands accounted for more than 24 percent. This is inexcusable.

Everything possible is being done officially to remedy the situation. Since 1909 there has been a statute on our law books which requires everyone to secure written permission from the local forest fire warden before starting a fire in or near woodlands or where fire can be communicated to woodlands, unless the ground is covered with snow. A never ending program of educational work is being carried on by your local warden and state officials to inform the general public both of the value and necessity of securing the required permit for such burning. Much progress has been made, but there are still many who fail to refuse to cooperate. The value of our permit system was definitely proven in this district during the 1955 calendar year. Local wardens issued 3,864 permits for debris burning fires. That's a lot of permits. The records show only 2 permit fires got out of control. This proves several things—while wardens were liberal in the issuance of fire permits, accommodating every applicant so far as possible, they were cautious, following closely directives outlining overall policy governing the issuance of burning permits and thoroughly instructing



permit users. The latter, too, fully appreciating their responsibility in using their permits, governed themselves accordingly. Result? Much burning done legally and safe.

But what of the smokers? Despite all the efforts of those officially charged with the responsibility of preventing fires, too many were careless or thoughtless in disposing of smoking material and matches. Why? It is difficult to say. Autos are now equipped with ash trays. Why not use them. The crushing out of a cigar, cigarette and the complete extinguishment of matches before being discarded is an easy chore.

If the costly habits of the careless and indifferent smoker and debris burner could be overcome, more than half of our annual forest fires would be eliminated. Will YOU do YOUR share to bring this about?

#### REMEMBER

1. Get a written permit from your local warden before starting your debris burning or camp fire. The law requires it.
2. Make certain they are dead out before leaving them.
3. Become a safe smoker by extinguishing smoking material and matches before discarding them.

Our school enrollment remains about the same, but the census figures indicate we will have a gradual increase over the next five or six years. Three Webster children will graduate from high school and four from the eighth grade. In the next few years we will have an increasing number of Webster pupils attending high school. With tuition rates going up each year, it means that Webster's budget will continue to increase for the next few years. We have six more years to pay on the school bonds. After next year our bond payment will be \$3000. a year instead of \$4000. so there is some relief in sight.

This year has been a difficult one for the Webster school, particularly for the children. For some reason or another, some people have the idea that the Webster children are a very difficult group to handle and I do not believe that any one person is responsible. Two of the substitute teachers came to Webster with the impression that they would have a very difficult time. Both of these teachers have found the children very cooperative and helpful. The Webster children are typical of the age. We may have very bright chil-

dren, we have average children and we have a few slow learning children. As far as behaviour is concerned, I find them as good if not a little bit better than children I have met in other situations.

As far as their success in school is concerned, the real test is how well they do in high school. I think the figures will show that a high percent of the children do very well in high school. As far as their personal behavior is concerned, the only fair way to judge would be to visit the school and then visit other schools for comparison. I might add that since I have been connected with the schools of Webster we have never had a serious discipline problem with a pupil. I do not mean to say that they don't have their moments; they do, even as you and I, but you can't love them any the less for that. They are a good group of children and it is a personal pleasure for me to work with them and when necessary, fight for them.

I enjoy my work in Webster and appreciate the cooperation I have received.
