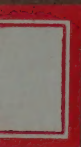

Warrant for Annual Town Meeting—1933

To the inhabitants in the town of Wentworth Location qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the school house in said town on the 14th day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman, one Road Agent, Tax Collector for the ensuing year.
2. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for highways and raise and appropriate the amount required by law to secure the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for Town Maintenance for the year ensuing.
4. To see what the Town will do about charging water rents to each family.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$260.00 to pay for snow plow.
6. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
