To the Citizens of the Town of Whitefield:

It is a pleasure for your Board of Selectmen, Town Officials, and Trustees to present to you this Report on the Town of Whitefield, New Hampshire for the year ended December 31, 1965, and Town Warrant for Town Meeting, Tuesday afternoon, March 8, 1966.

Your Town Report, which is essentially the record of our stewardship of Town affairs and property, includes those of the Town Treasurer, Municipal Court, Cemetery Trust Funds, Town Clerk, Public Library, and Tax Collector. Detailed reports on the Coos County and White Mountains Regional School appropriations, the Whitefield Village Fire District, and the Morrison Hospital Association are issued separately and are usually available prior to their respective annual meetings.

Your Town Warrant, on which action will be taken at Town Meeting, consists of twelve articles this year. It, along with the Town Budget, inventory, and itemized list of receipts and expenditures, on which much of your Warrant is based, makes up the first section of your Town Report. Comment on the Budget and other articles in the warrant will be reserved for Town Meeting and/or such time as you may wish to consult directly with your Selectmen, Town Officials or Trustees. Suffice to say here, the various articles in the warrant, including the budget, represent the best judgment of your Town Officers, relying on the best information and technical assistance available and set forth with the advice and consent of the Town's Budget Committee. Accordingly, please remember that your warrant and budget are at best estimates and, necessarily, subject to change within reasonable limits at any time during our fiscal year and, hence, the difficulty of computing in advance an exact tax rate. There are, however, two factors which everyone should keep in mind; the total

Town appropriations which you will vote, for the most part, at your Town and School meetings and the net valuation figure or adjusted inventory on which the tax rate is computed. If the net valuation figure increases more in proportion than the total Town appropriations, the tax rate will decrease. If the total Town appropriations increases more in proportion than the net valuation figure, the tax rate will increase. The national trend in appropriations, be it federal, state or local government, has been one of constant increase. As every budget-minded housewife knows, everything seems to cost more with every trip to the store, and government has the same problem. Therefore, your Selectmen feel we must have growth if our tax rates are to remain anywhere within reasonable bounds. In this you can help by supporting our local commerce, industry, and agriculture and, further, by encouraging other people and businesses to locate in Whitefield by keeping your Town, your Schools, and most particularly your own property, in the best condition you can afford, to be a credit and an advertisement for the Town.

Many people, both resident and non-resident, seem to "care about Whitefield"—often we are surprised at the number. Though space and memory prevents mentioning here all who have contributed during the past year toward making Whitefield a more desirable place to live or move to, we should like to note a few. The Guest family of Norwalk, Connecticut, and the Directors and Officers of the Whitefield Industrial Corporation, who have made Whitefield's dream of a new resident industry a reality with the purchase of our industrial building. A picture of Nuroco Woodwork's new plant appears on the rear cover of this Report. The Woods family and their Caledonia Sand & Gravel Corporation of St. Johnsbury, Vermont, without whose assistance and cooperation the Whitefield Regional Airport could have been a more difficult and expensive

undertaking. Incidentally, the Caledonia Sand & Gravel Company is presently negotiating with the Town with a view to making Whitefield its New Hampshire headquarters for heavy construction. Mr. Gerald Wheeler and the National Forest Service who will construct a building at the Airport this spring as an air tanker base for forest fire prevention. The Dodge Family of Whitefield for their magnificent Century Hall, commemorating a business that was born and grew in Whitefield for one hundred years. Mrs. Walter Bradley, a resident of Dalton by the way, for her gift of trees to the Town. Also, those other property owners who, at their own expense, had stumps removed and/or through the Woman's Study Club had new trees planted. The Chase family for their very generous gifts both to our Fire and Police Departments, which went toward the purchase of additional equipment. The several families who chose to build new homes in Whitefield, and to all those who restored, re-painted, and landscaped their respective properties—we, your Board of Selectmen, express our appreciation for making and keeping our Town one in which we can all be proud.

Though new problems will forever confront us, we, your Board of Selectmen, feel that with the interest of our citizens, a new regional airport, a new regional school, and a brand new industry in an expanding field, Whitefield should grow and prosper.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE
TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs. You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday the eighth day of March next, at two o'clock in the afternoon to act on the following subjects. The polls shall open for voting at nine o'clock in the forenoon and shall not close before six o'clock in the afternoon.

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, two Trust Fund Trustees, one to serve for two years and one to serve for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for:

a. General Government

1. Town Officers' Salaries
2. Town Officers' Expenses
3. Election and Registration Expenses
4. Municipal Court Expenses
5. Expenses Town Hall and Other Town Buildings

b. Protection of Persons and Property

3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion, Lions Club, Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, Mount Washington

Grange, Rotary Club, Chamber of Commerce and all church organizations for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds, or otherwise, until rescinded.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,600.00 for a Two-Way Sweeper for the Highway Department.

7. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the sidewalk on Middle Street and, thereby, widen street which is very narrow in this area.

8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the tax collector to appoint a deputy tax collector, with the approval of the selectmen, who shall be sworn, have the powers of the collector, and before entering upon the duties of the office give bond as provided in RSA 41:38.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.), and less any contributions received from the other 15 Towns, so-called, as the result of the 1966 Town Meetings, for use in connection with expansion of the airport facilities at the Whitefield Regional Airport, so-called, and, for this purpose to authorize the Selectmen to borrow upon the note of the Town said sum not in excess of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.) at such rate of interest and payable at such time and place, in accordance with Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 33, and Amendment

thereto, entitled "Municipal Finance Act", as the Selectmen shall decide.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to file in behalf of the Town an application (in form and manner required by the United States and in conformity with P. L. 560, 83rd Congress) and do whatever else may be required for an advance, in the amount of \$18,000., to be made by the United States to the Town of Whitefield, New Hampshire to aid in defraying the cost of preliminary report for sewerage and sewage treatment facilities for the Town of Whitefield, and, further, to see if the Town will make the necessary arrangements to provide such additional funds as may be required to defray the cost of preparation of the report and plans.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a planning board to draw up appropriate ordinances for Land Planning Regulations in accordance with RSA 36:2-12, and to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$200. for the expenses of such planning board.

12. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

Given under our hands and seal of the Town this seventeenth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six, and of the independence of the United States of America the one hundred and ninetieth.

**SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Whitefield for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1965, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

Scope of Audit

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Library Treasurer, Municipal Court, Trustees of Trust Funds, Cemetery Association and Regional Airport.

Financial Statements

**Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1964 —
December 31, 1965: (Exhibit A-1)**

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1964 and December 31, 1965, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the financial condition of the Town changed from a Net Debt of \$9,436.06 to a Surplus of \$542.60 in 1965.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures—Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriation and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1965, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a revenue surplus of \$4,089.06, less a net overdraft of appropriations of \$3,230.15, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$858.91.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1965, made up

in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1965, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit J)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1965, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit J.

Audit Procedure

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

General Comments

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$698.78 from \$25,350.62 to \$26,049.40 in 1965, as shown herewith:

Uncollected Taxes—Prior Years' Levies:

It is again recommended that the Tax Collector and Board of Selectmen examine the uncollected lists of property, poll, yield and head taxes on the warrants of 1962 and prior years. Such taxes thereon as appear to be uncollectible should be abated by the Board.

The inclusion of uncollectible taxes on these prior years' warrants year after year as asset accounts in the Balance Sheets tends to distort the true picture of the Town's financial condition.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Whitefield for their assistance during the course of the audit.

MORRISON HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION REPORT

This condensed summary of 1965 activities of the Morrison Hospital Association which appears in the annual Town of Whitefield report shows that your community hospital enjoyed a record volume of business during the past fiscal year. Total whole-figure gross earnings showed an increase of \$38,000 over the previous year, and total patient days, including geriatrics, increased from 8,713 to 10,440. The volume of ancillary services provided by the clinical laboratory, diagnostic x-ray and cardiology departments likewise increased proportionately.

In order to meet the requirements of a higher patient load, Morrison Hospital had to hire additional qualified help, provide wider fringe benefits, make necessary improvements and changes to the physical plant, and purchase new equipment.

The clinical laboratory is now staffed by two full-time technicians, the nursing staff has been augmented, and the dietary and housekeeping departments have more personnel. With help from the Women's Auxiliary, new patient room furniture was purchased for all rooms on the medical and surgical floor; a new American Optical microscope was purchased for the laboratory; a new Bird respirator was installed to help patients with respiratory problems; a new emergency ramp was built on the West entrance to the building; and the front entrance of the hospital

was completely resurfaced and guard rail installed. And, already in 1966, a new medications dispensary and nurses' station has been built on the second floor, and outside storm insulation installed throughout the building.

The future, particularly with the government about to enter the hospitalization insurance field through its Medicare program, holds many questions. These can only be answered in time through continued community support and the help of the hospital staff and its directors.

WELFARE DEPARTMENT

We are pleased to report a budget surplus for the year ending December 31, 1965.

During 1965 we were presented with a number of large bills which, had we been obliged to pay them, would have cost the taxpayers several hundred dollars over our budget. However, by doing considerable research into the eligibility of these claimants, and by working closely with state agencies, it was established that the Town of Whitefield was not liable for these bills.

You will also find listed the quantities of Government Surplus Commodities distributed by your Welfare Department during 1965. These items are distributed at the Police Station on the third Tuesday of each month, to eligible recipients. Eligibility is determined according to a fixed policy established by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, based on maximum incomes as follows:

Sent out a packet of ski area and lodging folders in response to inquiries on skiing.

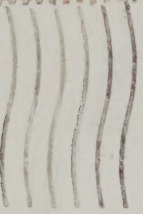
