

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Barnstead, in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Barnstead on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same, as recommended by the Budget.

3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

4. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount on property taxes paid two weeks after approval of tax rate by the State Tax Commission.

5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to buy liability insurance on town labor and pay same out of the Highway Department.

6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to raise the sum of \$1,000.00 to add to the trust fund for a grader.

7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from surplus the sum of \$3,000.00 to purchase Valley Dam and water rights from George Jones and deed same to State for the repairs and maintenance.

8. To see if the Town will vote to accept the following Trust Fund:

The sum of \$778.99 from Center Barnstead Cemetery Improvement Association.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$150.00 for the Concord Hospital.

10. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

. (B) REPORT FROM YOUR SUPERINTENDENT .

Barnstead School District

This annual report will, for the most part, be concerned with the new buliding project. During the past three years, we have made definite plans for a much needed school.

I wish to commend with great emphasis the efforts of your special building study committee and your school board. We have had many, many meetings together, interviewing architects, lawyers and finance people. Many hours have been spent in addition to these meetings. We have visited new schools in several communities. Some of these people have also undergone considerable personal expense in addition to actual time devoted. This joint committee, consisting of Mr. David Perkins, chairman; Mrs. Mary Gosse, secretary; Mr. John Cotton; Mr. William Jenisch; Mr. Calvin Weeks; Mr. Milton Tasker and Mrs. Virginia Davis is working harmoniously to explore all avenues of school building information. A written summary will be prepared by them and distributed for study before the annual school meeting.

Without the new school, an impossible teaching situation will exist during the coming school year. The size of our four present classrooms makes 25 pupils each a maximum number for teaching, especially in the multiple grade situation. With an elementary enrollment of 142, we would have to place 42 pupils of grades one and two together, 40 pupils of grades three and four, 35 pupils of grades five and six and 25 pupils of grades seven and eight. I firmly believe that, regardless of the quality of teaching, it is impossible to train our boys and garls adequately under such circumstances.

We need five classrooms immediately. Even with all situations in our favor, a new school cannot be ready by September. The district may consider placing grade eight at Pittsfield for a few months, until our school is ready. The situation in our neighboring town will permit this arrangement temporarily. Building costs are increasing so rapidly that further postponement will result in greater costs. Your building committee will recommend a very practical solution for your consideration.

For those not immediately concerned with teacher employment, the increasing difficulty each year in providing a qualified staff may be hard to believe. Beginning teachers are in extremely short supply. Many June graduates of our teachers' colleges aready have contracts for next Suptember. We compete with cities, wealthy towns and other states where salaries and teaching environments are excellent. Our experienced teachers are receiving equal or less than beginners, and less than teachers of similiar experience in many towns in this union. Young teachers have no interest, generally, in smaller communities with heavy enrollments and several grades in a room. Even the weating areas cannot always find competent teachers.

I am personally grateful to Mrs. Cotton and Mrs. Alden who continue to serve our children in crowded classrooms. Mrs. Cotton is handling a most difficult situation with admirable competence. After many years of faithful service in the Barnstead Schools, Mrs. Alden reaches retirement age in June. Mrs. Helen Lindberg our grades seven and eight teacher, replacing Mr. Sloat has been seriously ill for many weeks. While we await her return, Mrs. Alma Pitman is doing a fine job in this position. We were fortunate in securing the services of Mrs. Mary Robinson, an experienced teacher. following Mrs. Pickard's resignation from the grades three and four position at Christmas time. We must provide salarics that will attract and retain good teachers at Barnstead.

The people of Barnstead are in a position to take a real step forward for the coming year. A new school becomes a real asset and demonstrates that the people have faith in a better future. Though taxes are certain to increase, we can see tangible evidence of progress for our payments. I am confident that, following careful exploration of all possibilities and recommendations, you will vote wisely for a progressive community.

SCHOOL HEALTH REPORT

To the townspeople, school board and superintendent of schools of Barnstead:

The following is my sixth annual report of the school health work of Barnstead.

In the spring of 1956 our school was invaded by three types of communicable diseases: chickenpox, German measles and whooping cough; thus, causing a large percentage of absence among the pupils.

. In April 1956, the State Department of Health conducted a polio clinic in our town.

During the autumn months of 1956, the attendance in school has been good. Scattered colds and the fiu have been the cause of those abcent due to illness.

The New Hampshire Tuberculosis Association conducted a TB patch test in September, and we had no positive reactors in the testing program.

The State Department of Health conducted a second polio clinic in November 1956. A total of 52 school children at Barnstead have had their complete polio vaccmation with three shots. As it is uncertain that we will have any more free polio clinics, it is hoped that the children who have had only one or two shots will get the remaining shots from their family physcian 50 that the youngsters can be protected before next polio season.

This year Barnstead got \$100 from the State for a dental clinic. Unfortunately that sum does not take care of all the children who need dental care. However, it is encouraging to see that more and more children get dental attention through their family dentist. It is hoped that the school health program, by means of health education, will teach the future generation the importance of good dental health, which can be obtained through good nutrition, semi-annual visits to the dentist and daily oral hygiene.

The routine vision testing is done every year and defects found have been followed through, either by the family physician or through our Sight Conservation Program. The audiometer is used for the hearing testing. The health program for our deaf and

other handicapped children is a big problem facing the school nurses throughout the state. Support is great-ly needed from everybody to carry out the program intelligently and as effectively as possible so that these unfortunate children can be helped and educated.

Physical examinations are done every spring by Dr. Quinn. The general health of the children is good. Weighing and measuring, individual inspections, home visits, nurses' meetings, conferences with school and health officials are also part of school health service.

In closing, I wish to thank all of you who have helped with the school health program, a program that no person can carry out alone.

PART VII. WARRANT

FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District of the Town of Barnstead, New Hampshire, qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on Friday, the 15th day of March 1957, at eight o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.

2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.

3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.

6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers, heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

7. To choose agents, auditors and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, for the payment of Statutory obligations of the district and to adthorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund, and the state building and together with other income; the school board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To see if the school district will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the new elementary school.

10. To see if the school district will vote to accept any gifts, or state or federal grants, to be placed in the School Capital Reserve Fund for the new school or used for the new school. 11. To see if the district will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$6,000 for the preparation of plans and specifications, such funds to be taken from the capital reserve for the new elementary school.

12. To see if the district will raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$125,000 for the construction and equipping of a new elementary school, and authorize the issue of bonds therefor for all or any part of the sum so appropriated.

13. If article 12 is adopted, to see if the district will vote to use any capital reserve funds previously voted and interest thereon for the construction of the new elementary school, and to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to pay over to the school board these accumulated funds, as agents of the district, to be used in the construction and equipping of this new building.

14. To see if the district will vote to appoint a building committee to advise the school board in the construction and equipping of a new elementary school.

15. To see what sum the district will raise and appropriate for the payment of interest on the bonds for the new elementary school, payable during the school year 1957-58.

16. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to sell Center School and Parade School, so-called ,and to determine what disposal will be made of the proceeds of such sale.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
