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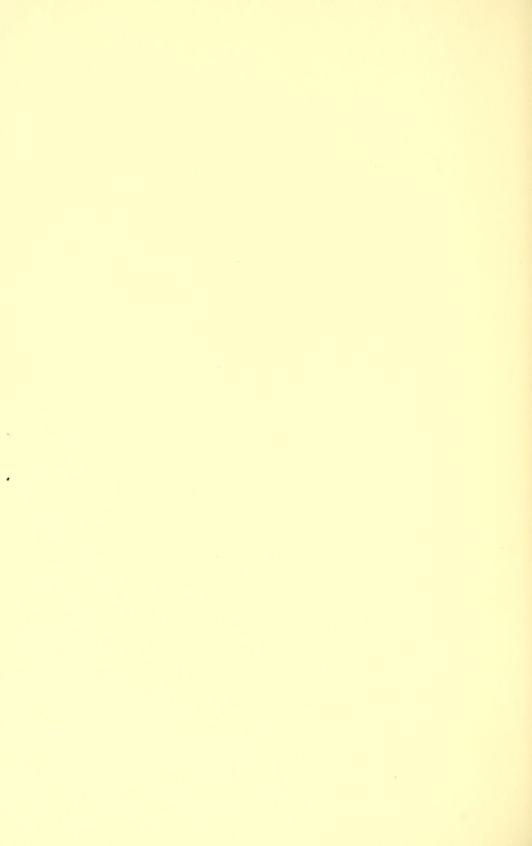

#### ANNUAL TOWN MEETING WARRANT

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#### State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Benton qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Building in said Benton on the first Tuesday of March next (the 7th) at seven-thirty o'clock in the evening to vote and act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk; one Selectmen for a term of three years; one Treasurer; one Tax Collector; one Highway Agent; one Trustee of Trust Funds for a term of three years; one Sexton; one Auditor; and all other necessary Town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$133.45 as the Town's share for construction of highways (Town Road Aid) as provided in Chapter 241 of the Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended.
- Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$84.14 for the White Mountains Region Association.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to help subsidize ambulance service in our area with such funds to be administered by the Trustees of the Cottage Hospital. This sum includes \$100.00 appropriated in 1971 but inadvertently unpaid during 1971.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for support of the White Mountain Community Services, Inc. program of non-profit community mental health.

- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to make any alterations in the amount of money to be raised and appropriated for the ensuing year as recommended in the budget, and vote to raise and appropriate all sums so determined.
- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of officers and agents as printed in the Town Report.
- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for current indebtedness of the Town during the ensuing year in anticipation of taxes to be collected for the year 1972 and to be paid therefrom.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize a discount on property taxes paid before a date set by the Selectmen, and to set the amount of said discount.
- Article 10. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the amendments to the Constitution proposed by the 1971 session of the General Court shall be approved.

#### SCHOOL WARRANT

#### The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Benton qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Community Building in said district on the 7th day of March, 1972, at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- To choose two Members of the School Board, one for the ensuing three years and one for a term of two years.
- 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of other officers or agents of the district.
- To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for, and to receive, in the name of the District, such advances, grants in aid, or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government and/or State of New Hampshire.

#### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

I herewith submit my seventh annual report to the voters of the Benton School District.

It is always very difficult to express in words the feelings one has when he loses a very dedicated and fine person he has worked with for a decade. Mrs. Ruth Page has been a dedicated mother and school board member who always had in mind the best interests of the Benton school children while serving on the school board. Her passing has left a huge void in our school district, but her positive influence will be felt for many years.

This year the Benton School Board is recommending a budget of \$27,578.94 for the support of schools for the academic year 1972-1973. This appropriation reflects an increase of \$1,758.81 over last year's gross budget. The increase is due, in part, to tuition and supervisory union expenses.

Our projected enrollment for tuition students next year, which does not include any allowance for new students, is as follows:

#### SUPERVISORY UNION #23

#### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT'S SALARY

Section 5, Chapter 243, Laws of 1953 of the State of New Hampshire requires that school district annual reports show the total amount paid to the superintendent.

One-half of the supervisory union expenses is prorated among the several school districts of the union on the basis of adjusted valuation. One-half is prorated on the basis of average daily membership in the schools for the previous school year ending June 30. The Superintendent of Supervisory Union #23, during 1971-72, will receive a salary of \$18,000.00, which is made up as follows: \$2,500.00 to be paid by the State Department of Education and \$15,500.00 prorated among the several school districts. Allowance of \$1,500.00 for travel within the Union is also prorated as stated above.

# Summary Program of the White Mountains Region Association

#### 1971 (34th Year)

Pioneered an engineering project at the University of New Hampshire in researching problems of snow erosion at ski areas. This project is well underway now and it appears that some practical solutions have been arrived at.

Maintained an active legislative program through the formation of a joint committee of the four regional promotional groups in the White Mountains.

Helped defeat an increase in the rooms and meals tax and gave strong support regarding the 16-mile extension of the Spaulding Turnpike.

Continued to promote new outdoor sports compatible to the region namely, whitewater canoeing, ski touring and bicycling.

Posted the annual 500 miles of fall foliage tour leaves.

Participated in a citizens' review committee on the controversial 4 million dollar federal Connecticut Basin study and were successful in altering some of the recommendations of this study.

Continued to develop the concept of promoting the off-season for tourists as against the high season.

Gave awards to 4-H groups in Grafton and Coos Counties.

Received 6,593 inquiries for the season which were answered with kits of folders.

Wrote 49 news releases. Wrote 259 personal letters.

Wrote four magazine articles and had twenty-five photographs appear in magazines and newspapers.

Printed and distributed 275,000 folders.

Appeared on four radio programs and attended two travel shows. Total income for 1971, \$33,833.

Presently we are working to make the state regional planning effort coincide with the six existing region associations.

Presently we are working with the Neighborhood Youth Corps to develop a course in hotel management for high school drop-outs, etc.
